

Adelaide Crows v Geelong

Adelaide Oval - 12.35pm (Sunday)

Prolific Cats to pile on the goals and agony against the hapless Crows

Adelaide's horrific season is only set to worsen this Sunday - taking on a ruthless Geelong side, who made the Crows' cross-town rival look second rate last Friday night. After going into matches against the out of form Collingwood and Western Bulldog sides with half a chance, only the most one-eyed Crows fan would give their team even the slightest chance of coming away with the four points against Geelong.

Adelaide showed small patches of improvement against the Bulldogs; on two occasions throughout the match the Crows kicked three consecutive goals, but the Dogs kicked nine unanswered goals between this, to put the match beyond doubt. Marcus Bontempelli was BOG with 33 disposals, 12 clearances and two goals. He was supported by Lachie Hunter's 29 disposals and a goal in his first game back from his car wrecking night of madness, as the Bulldogs midfield won the clearance count 44 to 19. This enabled Dogs forward Aaron Naughton to record a career-best haul of six goals – from his first six kicks of the match.

Tom Hawkins is the man the Crows will hope to contain, after a magnificent individual display against the Power, taking seven contested marks to finish the night with six goals (and two assists) to lead the Coleman Medal by three. Spoon-feeding Hawkins was Patrick Dangerfield (24 disposals and three goal assists), while Cam Guthrie (27 touches) and Sam Menegola (21) were also influential in the Cats' win.

With Tom Doedee joining the list of hamstrung Crows, Adelaide's backline will find stopping Hawkins a near-impossible task. Brad Crouch, Tom Lynch and Andrew McPherson are also unlikely to play against the Cats with hamstring injuries. While Adelaide's injury list continues to grow, Geelong are looking to be back at full strength in coming weeks with Jack Steven and Esava Ratugolea a good chance to return this weekend. Gary Ablett will need to complete his two weeks of guarantine in Queensland before he can play again, but may begin doing so very soon.

Ruckman Rhys Stanley (Berri) will be the Geelong's only South Australian to travel to Adelaide to take on the Crows. Interestingly the Cats have six other South Australians are on their list - all yet to make their AFL debut.

Port Adelaide v Hawthorn

Adelaide Oval - 2.10pm (Saturday)

Power to be re-stored against Hawks

It was an all too familiar story for Port fans last Friday night, watching their team get thrashed by ten goals against Geelong.

It looked like the Power had put the inconsistencies of the past few seasons behind them after a trio of impressive wins over the Demons, Bulldogs, and reigning premier Richmond. That didn't prove to be the case with Port's plan of Dixon or bust coming back to haunt them as Geelong's defence swarmed the big key forward, keeping him goalless and highlighting Port's predictability.

At the other end of the field it was a completely different story, with Tom Hawkins running riot on his way to six goals. He spent most of the night opposed to Tom Clurey and plenty of Port fans would have been scratching their heads wondering why Ken Hinkley chose to keep that match-up for majority of the night, rather than giving the task to captain Tom Jonas.

Port's game style is built around two key facets; dominating the contest and locking the ball in its forward half to allow repeat inside 50's and more scoring opportunities. On Friday night Port were comprehensively beaten in the contest (-23 in contested possessions) and had 10 less inside 50's, failing to lock the ball in its forward half.

Geelong have to be given a lot of credit for this, not just were Port outplayed on the field but Hinkley was outcoached by Chris Scott. Geelong's normal kick/mark, slow build up style was thrown out the window as it looked to play on at every occasion, getting on the front foot and taking the game right up to the ladder leader. Port simply just did not adjust and as he has been in previous years, Hinkley drew criticism for not having a plan B.

Port will be eager to bounce back from this disappointing loss when it hosts Hawthorn on Saturday afternoon. This match will kick start a run of three fixtures in which Port play three of the bottom four teams on the ladder. If Port win all three, it will go very close to looking up top spot on the ladder with matches against Essendon on Collingwood the only remaining on the fixture.

It will be a nervous period for Port fans who will know their team has had trouble in the past winning games they are expected to win. Many of these worries looked to be gone before the Geelong match but the doubts will be creeping back after such a poor performance.

Hawthorn are coming into this match having lost their last two matches to the two Western Australia teams. Although their most recent match against West Coast was lost by a bigger margin, it was the better performance of the two. Tom Mitchell (34 disposals), Jaegar O'Meara (27) and James Worpel (27 and a goal) all got plenty of footy, but the Hawks were alarmingly -31 in contested possessions. Liam Shiels (25 disposals, seven clearances, six inside 50's and a goal) was one of the Hawks best while Will Day (16 disposals and eight marks) continues to impress in his first season.

The Hawks defence wasn't strong enough in the air to handle the tall Eagles forward line, and James Sicily suffered a season ending knee injury to make things even worse. The likes of Charlie Dixon, Mitch Georgiades and Peter Ladhams could cause big problems for the Hawks backline this week.

Port were so disappointing against the Cats and you'd expect them to bounce back this week, especially given the Hawks struggles in 2020 and having lost one of their best players in Sicily.




Eagles v Sturt

Eagles to keep on flying with a win against the Double Blues

The Eagles redeemed themselves last Saturday with a win against the Panthers, which was previously the only Eagles loss for the year back in round one. Ever since round one the Eagles have been flying and have not lost a game, sitting happy on top of the ladder. Last Saturdays match was a rollercoaster with only seven points separating them at the final break. The Eagles, however kept the Panthers goalless in the last quarter with Eagle's James Rowe and Jake Von Bertouch scoring the only goals in the final term to secure the 21-point victory. Rowe and Von Bertouch both hit the scoreboard more than once with Rowe kicking four straight and Von Bertouch scoring two.

James Rowe is equal first in the Ken Farmer medal, leading the goalkicking with Glenelg's Liam Mcbean with 26 goals. Rowe has played a major role for the Eagles averaging the highest score per game in the league this season with 82.76. The Eagles Defence is also doing a great job this season, recording the best average for least points scored against them with 52.12. James Tsitas, Jordan Foote, Joseph Sinor, Jack Hayes, Lachlan McNiel and Jarrad Redden have all been positives for the Eagles this season, featuring in the best players in previous weeks.

Sturt, unlike the Eagles, find themselves outside the top four and will be looking to get as many wins as possible to squeeze into the finals. Nathan Grima's Double Blues are coming off some momentum, after a 65-point thrashing of the Bulldogs last Saturday at Unley. They recorded, not only their biggest winning margin for the year but their biggest winning margin since Round 14 last year! That win on Saturday stopped a four-game losing streak and marked their first win at Peter Motley Oval for the season. Although the Double Blues have only recorded three wins this season, they have scared opposition in patches and have played some good football. Sturt were right with the equal first placed Roosters for the first half in round seven, only to be blown over in the third quarter.

Jake Sutcliffe bagged six against the Bulldogs last weekend, being only the third player this season to score six or more goals in a match this season. Sutcliffe is also leading Sturt's goalkicking this season with 14 goals. James Battersby and Abe Davis were also dominant, both gathering 33 disposals each in last weekend's win. Davis has had an outstanding last three weeks, averaging 30 disposals. Skipper James Battersby has averaged 29 touches in the last five matches and is leading the league in clearances with 81, averaging 10.1 per match. Sam Colguhoun has also had a solid season, averaging 27 disposals per game.

The Eagles haven't lost on their home deck since Round 15 last season, which was ironically to the Double Blues by 25 points. However, I think Jade Sheedy's Eagles will be too strong and will record their 5th straight win at home. Eagles by 13-24 pts

Several Glenelg goals seeped out from a defence usually swift at rebounding into attacking 50.

Yet this game was won first and foremost by many home-grown talents, their engine room running at full efficiency on the weekend. Jack Hannath triumphed in the ruck battle with Baulderstone, every Glenelg midfielder seeing plenty of ball as a result. Particularly Matthew snook, who ranks on the podium of seemingly every key statistical metric in the competition and must surely be eyeing off his teammate Partington's incumbent Magarey Medal. The more tangible result for now is that Glenelg leapfrog Norwood from fifth to third, as the panthers succumbed to ladder leaders Woodville West Torrens.

The Redlegs have no time to waste in their recovery as they take on the also-ladder-leading Roosters at Prospect Oval this weekend. The Roosters collided with a much-improved West Adelaide outfit, in an extremely close Friday night match up at Hisense stadium. The Bloods struck the biggest lead of the game moments into the final quarter when Isaac Johnson converted the simplest of set shots, gifted to him by a free kick some way off the ball.

However, the Roosters had time to make amends and successfully swindled the win when first year Will Combe kicked the sealer, his impressive four goal haul entrenching North Adelaide in the top two. For mine though, the win was set up just before half time by Jarred Allmond and his twin long-range goals that gave the Roosters their biggest lead of the contest; although their half-time lead was headed, that buffer proved vital in the seesawing contest.

Down to business. Norwood lost the clearances against Glenelg by 9 or 10 and the inside 50s by 15 as a result and will need to quickly rectify this. Their capacity to rebound from defence remained, though there were simply too many turnovers going forward; the tigers pouncing swiftly on their mistakes.

When they got it forward, at least tall timber Tommy Pinyon was effective, kicking two goals last week from only four touches of the footy. Norwood's entries inside 50 were not deep or incisive enough to generate more scoring opportunities. One of those goals came from a Josh Richards entry, who decidedly lowered his eyes, his brother collecting a handball from the worm burner entry and goaling on the run. Norwood need more cool-headed entries like that next week, albeit with cleaner execution, to afford their damaging forwards much needed space to turn and burn. Alas, Glenelg stifled them so effectively that they managed only one goal for the second half.

North Adelaide have worked tirelessly to stay in touch with the Eagles, behind them only on percentage since those teams met. Even contributions in the last month would please coach and captain; Spina returned without fuss, taking 10 marks in defence, his cool presence adding 25 kicks and a heap of rebound inside 50s. He will be needed again to repel a Redlegs side in desperate need to atone for last week, avenge for Round 2, and stay in touch with the top 4. North by 1-12 points







It's been a difficult year for all clubs this season, but it seems no team more so than the Adelaide Crows have buckled under the pressure of fly-in-fly-out games, hubs and a compressed fixture. After losing many of their star players in the off-season including Eddie Betts, Cam Ellis-Yolmen, Alex Keath, Josh Jenkins and Sam Jacobs, the Crows said they would begin a rebuild, but no one could have expected this. The Crows have gone from top to bottom in just three years. When there are only two

When there are only two South Australian teams in the competition the chances of them being on completely opposite sides of the ladder is extremely rare. So when your cross-town rivals Port Adelaide are the ladder-leaders while the Adelaide Crows are 18th and bottom there really isn't much to smile about.

It's been a challenging season for Crows fans to watch loss after loss after loss. Their performance against the Sydney Swans in Round 1 was probably their best and most convincing chance of taking home the win, but need I remind you that too was a loss. Rory Laird has been one of the few positives to take away from their games. He has been excellent on the field since moving to the midfield providing pressure to a side with very little and was the leading disposal winner against the Pies in Round 11 with 37 possessions for the night.

Laird has really led the way of this youthful side. Unfortunately, that's where the good news ends.

The Adelaide Crows have made several changes to their list, recruiting Ben Keays ex-Brisbane player, Ben Crocker ex-Collingwood player and former Port Adelaide ruckman Billy Frampton. Rookie Ben Keays has been quite serviceable after spending most of his AFL career playing in the reserves at Brisbane.

The Crows have had an AFL-high eight debutants and used 37 players across the course of the season, which is more than any other club. While it has been excellent to give so many young players more experience in the AFL and more opportunity to develop, it does seem odd that some of their more-experienced players are not making the team. Now when a player like Bryce Gibbs and even Billy Frampton to an extent, cannot even make the team when that team is losing every week, something must be wrong. Especially when these two players would give the Crows a boost in two areas they seem to be lacking in, a target inside-50 and a strong, clearance-winning midfielder.

This season the Crows have had many big outs, with Rory Sloane, Taylor Walker, Tom Doedee, Daniel Talia, Tom Lynch, Brad Crouch, Wayne Milera, Riley Knight and Jordan Gallucci all sidelined for extended periods. The Crows have struggled in all areas on the field, their depleted list would not have helped but they just seem to be lacking, not running as hard, no consistency

and are really struggling to string together four-quarters of tough, pressure-intense, contested and confident football. The Crows are rated 18th in the league in all major statistics culminating in points for and points against, which is very disappointing, especially given just a few years ago they had one of the best midfields in the competition. Injury concerns aside, the Crows need to completely change their game plan for the remainder of the season if they have any shot of winning a single game and not being the first club in 56 years to be winless for an entire season. Nevertheless, the Crows will no doubt finish bottom of the ladder and receive the wooden spoon for the first time in their 30-year history.



Stop and Go

In the last few years, Australian Football has taken a frightening path towards becoming a stop-and-go game. One could argue that it has always been a type of game that is centered around winning stoppages and controlling possession through marks. But, when you think of the term 'footy,' and maybe even when you try to describe the sport to an unfamiliar spectator, what comes to mind is the excitement, speed and aggressiveness associated with what some would call 'a dangerous sport.'

When we think of footy, we don't think of stoppages. We think of counter-attacking football, players with elite speed, teams with incredible ball movement; but, most especially, we think of goals.

The worry for fans of footy is whether the AFL is trying to mould Australia's national sport into a replica of American Football. The NFL (National Football League) is one of the most watched sports in the world and millions of people tune in to the Super Bowl on TV every year. On that same day, some of the world's biggest brands sponsor the event and pay millions of dollars for a single commercial during the breaks. The half-time show alone is enough for the event to attract global attention, especially on social media platforms like Twitter and YouTube. From the AFL's perspective, this is something that Australia should be aiming towards. In this case, they are right. But it is a fine line between global exposure and the ruin of a national sport.

As mentioned before, footy is a unique sport in the sense that it asks players to put themselves on the line for their team's success (without protective gear). However, the sport has begun to ask players to do something else; that is, play competitively, but control your aggression. As a player, it's difficult to enforce that type of message into your performance. Aggression is an important part of this sport, and the constant rule changes to 'protect' players seems to be doing more harm to the game than good.

Disregarding this season, the amount of goals scored in each game has been dropping dramatically. In 2018, the AFL's average scores were the lowest ever seen for 52 years (83.1 points per game). Unless it's a total blowout, you won't see a game where both teams kick 20 goals in a competitive match of footy. Gone are those days. Instead, now it's considered lucky if a single game can consist of 20 goals (in total).

With this in mind, it's important that we recognize what a 'stop-and-go' style of play could do to he game. Alas, these continuing reinforcements of 'protective footy' rules do two things: slow down the pace of the game by rewarding more free kicks, resulting in less goals; and, most concerningly, pushes us closer towards a mimic of American-style Football.

Putting the 'national' in Australian Rules Football

If there is one thing this AFL season has taught us, it is that the AFL can survive without Victoria. In fact, the AFL has proved its adaptability in the strangest of circumstances by taking the game out of its usual 'hub'. Naturally, the VFL is the reason football is predominately played in Victoria during normal AFL seasons. However, COVID has created recurring conversations of Victoria's main role, ultimately debating how the AFL should operate in future.

The AFL is the Australian Football League. In other words, no longer does the game fall under the Victorian Football League (VFL), but rather is a national competition. Obviously, there are reasons for why Victoria is the main stage for the game; out of eighteen teams, ten are Victorian based teams. Over the years, more interstate teams have joined the league, with GWS being the most recent in 2012. The number of teams located in Victoria is a strong argument for why the home and away rounds can have up to five games in Victoria per round. However, the argument is not to move or relocate these teams, but rather to recognise other states for big AFL nights like the Brownlow, the NAB draft and, of course, the Grand Final.

Daniel Andrews, the premier of Victoria, only emphasised the unchanging nature of the game and the outdated view of Victoria as AFL's central hub. Last Friday, Mr Andrews told press that he is looking for compensation from the AFL in the future due to the expectation that the Grand Final will be hosted interstate this year. This statement is ridiculous for a number of reasons. In terms of COVID, he should be more focused on taking care of Victorians and eradicating the virus. In terms of the AFL, the idea that the AFL owes Victoria, even though the Grand Final is already contracted to be held at the MCG until 2057, is preposterous.

Understandably, Victoria will lose a lot of economic compensation because of the AFL Grand Final's revenue. Yet, considering Victoria hosts the event every year, he is hardly in a position to argue this year's loss. Unfortunately, the loss of money and jobs is a part of 2020, and we have all been affected by the virus one way or another.

This year's Grand Final will be hosted in any state other than Victoria, which should be viewed as an opportunity rather than a loss. Not only should it be considered an opportunity for another state, but also an opportunity for the future of the game. It is not a new argument: whether or not the AFL Grand Final should be on a rotational interstate basis. However, this year has certainly emphasised why it would be brilliant for the evolution of the game.

Without a reason, other states will not invest in an event as big as the AFL Grand Final. This is the issue. Ultimately, the argument always comes back to how many people will be there to witness one of the events of the year. The MCG houses 100,000 people. An exceptional stage for any event. Of course the biggest event in the AFL calendar should be played in front of as many people as possible. However, the only reason the MCG is the ultimate stage is because every other state has never had reason to invest in a stadium of the same stature. If the AFL presented a contract for the Grand Final to be hosted around Australia, it would certainly provide state governments a solid reason to invest in the event.

It is the event that brings people from around the country together. It is the roar of the crowd and the excitement of the day. Every state should have the opportunity to experience this. Australian Rules Football is a national sport, loved by so many around the country. It seems only fitting for fans from all states to enjoy the big day.




Coast have to support their fast-paced style. These players are creating run using their football IQ to create more effective forward 50 entries.






