



Who Will Be The Sixth 400-Gamer?

In what has been a difficult time for the game in the previous two weeks, with COVID-19 once again causing havoc on the AFL Season, it was a weekend of celebration for the great Shaun Burgoyne. On Saturday night, 'Silk' became the fifth player in the game's 163-year history to reach the 400-game milestone, and the first Indigenous player to notch the quadruple century.

For just five players to reach this incredible achievement in almost two centuries goes to show what is required; a strong work ethic, dedication, resilience and a hint of good luck with health and injury along the way.

There are many players currently in the league who are somewhat within striking distance of the 400 game mark. However, with form issues, injury concerns and the possibilities of game-time and/or positions on lists being compromised in the future due to rebuilding and money-saving, some are more likely than others.

I have identified three players who are the most likely to reach that elusive 400 game milestone;

1. David Mundy

Current Games Played: 347

Games Required: 53

For so long many out of Perth would barely give David Mundy a mention, but now the Victorian-born midfielder is certainly up there as one of the finest footballers to ever come out of a Western Australian club. From his first season in 2005, Mundy has held an unquestionable position in Fremantle's best 22 and has rarely disappointed. A best and fairest in 2010 and All Australian in 2015, and a selection in Fremantle's 2013 Grand Final are among his greatest achievements on field. At the age of 35, the former captain is playing as well as ever, averaging 25 possessions, five clearances and four tackles, all of which are considered above average for AFL standard. For David Mundy to reach 400 games, he would need to play majority of this season's remaining games at least two more full seasons, a final or two would help boost those games up. It seems far-fetched, but if he continues at the rate he is now... why couldn't he?

Only seven games away from over taking Matthew Pavlich's club record for most games played.

2. Joel Selwood

Current Games Played: 325 Games Remaining: 75

The captain of the Geelong Football Club has been the epitome of hard work, dedication, and an unbelievable success rate. Since debuting in 2007, where he won the NAB Rising Star award, he has played in five Grand

Finals, won four Premierships, three best and fairest awards, six All Australians and four times the most courageous player, he has also only ever missed the finals on one occasion in 2015. Only once in his fifteen seasons has he played less than 20 games a year, he has been able to escape serious injury for so much of his career and has never been dropped.

However, Selwood's courage to go back with the flight of the ball and unflinchingly dive into packs has resulted in concussions and head injuries. His biggest strength is also his biggest weakness, and this is the only concern in not reaching 400. With Geelong's premiership window wide-open for the next few seasons and with Selwood form still certainly apt to remain in the side, he would certainly be expected to at least get very close.

For Joel Selwood to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least another three seasons, playing at least 20 games every campaign. By that stage he would be 36 years old, if he stays injury free and avoids anymore concussion issues, there is absolutely no reason it cannot happen.

3. Dustin Martin

Games Played: 258 Games Remaining: 142

This one may, but should not, come as a surprise. While Dustin Martin still has at least six seasons plus a few finals required to reach 400, he has proven to be one of the most consistent and durable players we have seen... possibly ever.

Since debuting for the Tigers in 2010, Martin has never played less than 20 games in a season. From round one 2010, he has always been one of Richmond's most important players and a main stay in the midfield. He has avoided injury through most of his career and become one of the greatest players in the game's history. Three premierships, three Norm Smith Medals and a Brownlow Medal put him in the elite category in every sense. Football is his life, he loves the game of there does not seem to be any obvious reason why he would give the game up until he exhausts everything he has, and he still has many years to come with a lengthy contract not expiring until 2024, which would be expected to be extended.

For Dustin Martin to reach 400 games, he would need to play until at least 2027. At this stage he would be 36 years of age and I cannot see any reason why this is an unrealistic prospect. He is arguable in career best form, tearing up the midfield with his strength, ability to shake players of and that powerful, penetrating kick.

TEAM TALK with JORDAN

The Cattery

2007 was the year that Geelong became the powerhouse that they are known as today. After years of underachieving failing to become that powerful team that they always threatened to be they finally turned it around by not only having developed an ominous high attacking game style that wielded three premierships in five years, but they made their home ground Kardinia Park (it has had many different names over the years) the unbreakable fortress that many a team have

now come to fear when they play there. In modern day football, every little bit counts, and the Cats have known that better than most teams. We all talk about fortresses when dominant teams seem even more powerful and even invincible on their home decks, but no team has ever had as pronounced a home ground advantage as Geelong has had at Kardinia Park. Footy pundits and critics have long since given up quoting the numbers, they've just accepted the fact that it's near on impossible to win there.

Before Geelong turned there fortunes around some 14 years ago, they famously lost a match to North Melbourne at Kardinia Park in what became the "line in the sand" moment for them. Not only was the playing group called into question but the club as a whole, culture administration, coaches all of it. They then destroyed an abysmal Richmond by 157 points at the Telstra Dome (now called Marvel Stadium) and from then have never ever looked back. As mentioned above, since then Geelong entered a golden era yielding three flags, playing in 5 grand finals and further 10 preliminary finals which is incredibly impressive. None of those games have been played at their home ground which is affectionately called "The Cattery" but it sure has played a major part in the club's consistent dominance over the competition. Since that loss to the Kangaroos in 2007 and as of the 2021 season, Geelong has played a total of 108 games at Kardinia Park. They've won an astonishing 97 of those, 97! Only 11 losses which is incredible, and their winning strike rate is 89.9%. The sheer key factors in the dominance that Geelong has there are teams that have relative unfamiliarity in which no visiting team ever playing there more than once per season and some of the bigger drawing Victorian clubs such as Hawthorn, Carlton and Richmond only playing there very occasionally, like once or twice in 12 years. The unique dimensions of the ground in my opinion play the biggest part.


Kardinia Park is only just the longest ground of any of the current AFL stadiums at 167 metres only a metre longer than Adelaide Oval, two metres more than Optus Stadium in Perth and five metres more than the MCG. It is significantly narrower than any of the other grounds however which is the most unique aspect of the grounds landscape. At just a measly 112 metres wing-to-wing, it is 27 metres skinnier than the MCG and that near 30 metres difference to the MCG is as good as one less kick for sides trying to switch the play side to side and make the ground bigger. It's no wonder teams have struggled and often have found themselves kicking the ball out on the full more than usual when they play at the cat's home ground. It's also Geelong's incredible defensive qualities that really shine through effectively smothering the opposition into turning it over and having all defensive lines covered effectively roadblocking half the ground. Considering how many teams have struggled there over the years, there are a few sides that boast somewhat of a half decent record there in recent times. Sydney has taken the cat scalp there 4 times in the last few years and had a 3-game winning streak there and Fremantle famously beat the cats in the first and only to date final played at the ground, the 2013 qualifying final, the dockers also beat them there again in 2015. For every other team it is the dreaded travel across there to face impending death. Of the 97 wins, 31 of those has been by a minimum of 10 goals and a further 8 has been by 100 points or more. Now that is some sort of dominance and it doesn't look like diminishing any time soon.

Grand Final: Morphettville Park vs Payneham Norwood Union

Morphettville Park have been crowned the 2021 Women's Division 1 Premiers. The minor premiers added a major title to their team's impressive record after downing Payneham NU by 34 points.

The celebrations begun early Saturday night as the final siren echoed around Simonds Park. It was a

nerve-wracking lead up for both teams, with each team proving they are capable to beat the best. Payneham NU got the job done two weeks ago in the semi-final, but Morphettville Park used last week's momentum to give them a boost.

Payneham NU got the jump on the minor premiers in the first quarter with plenty of forward-50 entries. However, Payneham's conversion in front of goal cost them a comfortable lead at the first break. Morphettville Park were forced into a defensive structure in the first quarter as Payneham bullied their way into their forward-50. Morphettville Park held on in the first quarter and kept the margin down to ten at the first break.

Payneham NU delivered a consistent second quarter, but Morphettville Park seemed to shake of their nerves at the first break to produce a dominant second term. Four goals in the second quarter lifted Morphettville Park over the top of Payneham. A nine point lead at half time settled Morphettville Park, while Payneham needed a strong third quarter to challenge the minor premiers.

Payneham NU applied some good defensive pressure in the third quarter and only conceded one goal for the quarter. However, Payneham's defensive work took away from their offensive ball movement. Despite only the one goal in the third, Morphettville Park set themselves up in good stead to take home the premiership in the fourth quarter. Morphettville Park pushed the margin out to 17 points at the third break.

Payneham NU needed a massive fourth quarter effort to challenge for the premiership, but it all went Morphettville Park's way. Morphettville Park slotted three goals in the final term to claim their premiership title. Payneham NU ended up second best on the day, but the club should be proud of their efforts. Morphettville Park and Payneham NU were the clear competitors all season, but Morphettville Park came out on top.

The Grand Final

LeBron James once said, "Don't be afraid of failure. This is the way to succeed." Twice this year, Happy Valley have confidently defeated Old Ignatians, but on Saturday the 21st of August Old Ignatians proved the impossible, possible. The Wolves played as a powerful pack to systemically take apart the undefeated Happy Valley Vikings and convincingly won the Division 2 Premiership Cup. It seems the phrase "no win or lose – only win or learn" has rung true for Old Ignatians. They put the many lessons learnt throughout the home and away season to work on Saturday and got to take home the most important chocolates of the year.

With plenty of footy fans sticking around from the Division Five grand final where Black Friars triumphed over Tea Tree Gully, the stage was set at Kenilworth Football Club. Cars were parked around the perimeter and hundreds of people packed into St Mary's oval, donning either yellow and black or red, yellow and blue stripes. Andie Zbierski for Iggys and Chloe Jacobs for Happy Valley lined up in the ruck for the first bounce. Happy Valley were the first to get an inside fifty, but their accuracy let them down. This season, their accuracy has been under 50% and up until this point it hasn't been a costly issue as they've had more of the ball and many more scoring opportunities than they were allowed this weekend. With the highly charged Old Ignatians applying the pressure all day, the Vikings inability to capitalise on their chances in front of the goals came back to bite them. After two points were pinged off by Happy Valley, it was the Wolves who pounced first with the first goal of the Division 2 grand final. Unsurprisingly, queen of the goal-kicking game Gabrielle Salt was the one who converted the opening major of the match. It proved to set Iggys up with all the belief, inspiration, and courage they needed to step on the throat of the mighty minor premiers and keep their foot there all day.

The last play of the first half saw tough-nut Ellen Keightley of Happy Valley give away a dangerous tackle free kick (not one I would have paid if the whistle was in my hand). She was hard at the ball all day and one of the weapons I saw working hard for Happy Valley until the final siren blasted. Another Viking, Lauren Bungey, had the best leg on the field on the day in my opinion. Great technique gives her a beautiful back-spin punt with great penetration. While their set shot skills appeared less than elite, Happy Valley's kicking on-the-run was remarkable. Their transition work from defence to the midfield was impressive. Despite failing to convert many goal-scoring opportunities, they accomplished many repeat entries thanks to their midfield positioning around the arc and having plenty of girls with safe hands. Old Ignatians couldn't capitalise on some of their quick entries, but their supreme defensive pressure and repeat efforts to transition effectively saw them continually pummel the ball forward which got them well over the line in the end. When looking to enter their attacking fifty, Old Ignatians played it smart. They trusted each other and chipped the ball around effectively to take optimum field position and make each shot as sure as possible.

By half time, Old Ignatians' pressure had reached new heights and despite Happy Valley having more shots on goals the favourites were trailing by four points. The score board read Happy Valley 1.5 (11) to Old Ignatians 2.3 (15) at the main break. Chelsea Kennedy was the Happy Valley Viking who managed to convert a major, which she did early in the second quarter. While sipping a half time cider, I scrawled a thought in my notebook: *kicking technique and set shot accuracy proving to be an issue for Happy Valley, will this lead to their eventual demise?* As it turned out, yes...

In the premiership quarter, Old Ignatians were kicking towards the goal behind which their men's teams had set up camp. The support for the up-and-coming underdogs were vocal and vehement. Sophie Bociulis of Happy Valley was a key defender and pulled off some extraordinary intercept marks. She denied her opponents many an opportunity. Lili Gambranis of Old Ignatians looked to me the quickest cat on the field, and with her magnificent kick she worked tirelessly all day to drive her team forward. Iggy's pressure was phenomenal, and they were rewarded for their hard work at critical moments. Both teams put on a show and the crowd loved it. The game was hard fought and played at a high intensity. Both teams effected countless powerful tackles and were rewarded with many holding the ball free kicks. Niahm Leahy nabbed her second goal of the day for the Wolves with an absolute clutch goal scored in the third term to push them three straight kicks in front. There was a contentious call from the Umpire late in the third quarter to disallow a goal that was well set-up by the Ignatians forwards. The Ump called the assisting handball a throw, and Iggys were further punished with a 25m penalty awarded thereafter for abuse. However, the Vikings were unable to capitalise on the lucky call and failed to get the ball past the centre circle as the pressure from the Wolves proved too intense to penetrate. The Happy Valley forwards failed to work cohesively, there were a few unfortunate same-team spoils; combined with Iggy's ability to plug the holes effectively to minimise ball movement and the Vikings' set-shot inaccuracy, the damage was done. The fat lady was starting to sing. Old Ignatians' ball movement was brave. They switched lanes efficiently and moved the ball up the field



field with valour. Their rucking was inspirational, their defensive work was clutch, their midfield outworked their opponents and their forwards had nerves of steel and provided good offensive pressure to lock the ball in. Old Ignatians tackled, they smothered, they ran. They communicated and played smart. They dug deep to provide second and third efforts. The most impressive facet of their game on the day was their teamwork.

At three-quarter-time I listened in to what Old Ignatians' coach Tom Sexton had to say. He kept it short and to the point: "Do not take your foot of the pedal girls! It's there if you want it," he emphasised. After an emphatic "GO WOLVES!" one player was heard roaring "LET'S BURY THEM!" And bury them they did. The first ball up of the fourth quarter saw Happy Valley caught holding the ball. The Wolves had their tails up, and it took them less than a minute into the term to strike the final blow with an inspiring team-goal that sailed right through the middle of the big sticks.

Happy Valley had four more opportunities to score but managed only three minors. In the end, unfortunately Happy Valley's lowest score of the year 1.9 (15) was saved for the most important game of the year. Old Ignatians' Laura Magliaro was a tackling machine in the backline, she caught a key-forward holding the ball at a pivotal moment deep in the fourth quarter. Magliaro was awarded the coveted Best on Ground award and boy did she pick a ripper day to make her debut appearance on the Best Players list. As mentioned, Chelsea Kennedy scored Happy Valley's only major and Old Ignatians' goal-scorers were Gabrielle Salt and Niahm Leahy (2) as said, as well as Amelia Rosella, and Millie McCarthy who put in an unbelievable effort all day as a critical ruck/forward.

When the final siren sounded, I looked up to read to the scoreboard: 1.9 (15) to 5.6 (36). The buzzer was conclusive: the minor premiers, Happy Valley had been defeated by heart-fuelled darkhorse, Old Ignatians. A memorable and convincing upset was met with raucous cheers from the crowd and screams from the Wolves. The whopping group hug, the lifting of the cup, the handing out of the medals, the many teary-eyed coaches and fans – Saturday's match had everything you could ask of a grand final. The ecstatic run onto the field from the Old Ignatians interchange players and staff was beautiful to witness, and the hands-on-head dejection from the Valley Vikings who knew they had fallen at the last hurdle was equally heartbreaking.
