We must wait till late on Sunday to enjoy what is a genuine blockbuster game. This is the first in a block of games where the Crows will be challenged. With upcoming fixtures against Geelong and St Kilda, if the Crows can win at least two of these 3 games, the F word comes into serious calculations. 2017 was a long time ago, and there is no reason why the Crows can't contend in finals this year. Belief is strong and confidence is high. The Crows will be determined to prove to the competition, they can match it with best. Let's hope they don't need any 'Get out of jail free cards'.

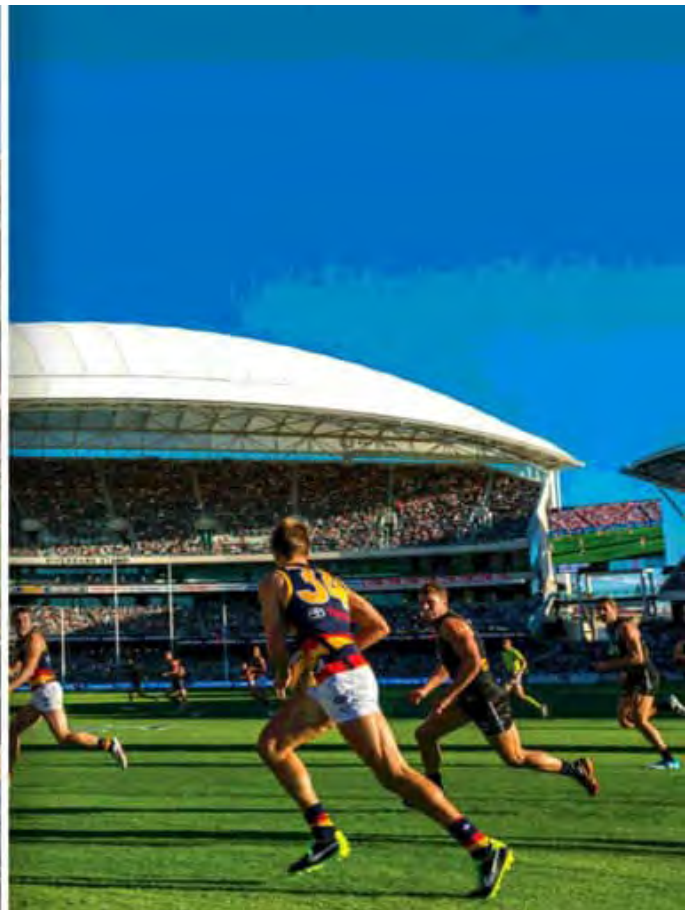
The great!

Sturt Muzzle Dogs

Sturt will play Central Districts this week in a match expected to excite. Both sides enter the round in sublime form despite both having mediocre seasons last year, where Centrals finished ninth and Sturt fifth. In the Anzac Day round last week, both sides impressed, beating the Adelaide Crows and Port Adelaide. As such, this match is poised to be a blockbuster with both teams attempting to eclipse last seasons mediocrity and push for finals success in 2023.

Sturts triumph this season has largely come from their ability to score themselves and prevent opposition sides from scoring. Subsequently, Sturt are ranked second in the competition for points for and first for points against. This ranking in these two areas are the fundamental attributes all premiership sides have. Specifically, it has been Sturts ability to win inside 50's every week which has allowed them to score, as Sturt has had a greater number of inside 50's than any other team in the competition. This has complemented the double blues ability to win other key performance indicators such as disposals, marks, efficiency, tackling and clearances, two out the last three weeks. Through the club's star players in that of Battersby, Wilson, Voss and Deakin, Sturt have been able to win the ball around the contest and generate scores from stoppages. Similarly, through Sturt's tackling pressure lead by Lewis, who is averaging over 16 tackles a game, Sturt's pressure on the oppositions ball carrier has been elite. As a result, opposition sides have been inefficient with the ball and have consistently turned the ball over, allowing the double blues to kick a number of goals from turnovers.

Central Districts are also playing a quality brand of football. Despite winning only four games last season and not playing finals since 2017, the Dogs look damaging this season. Since their loss in round one to a formidable South Adelaide outfit, Central Districts have beaten North Adelaide (last seasons grand finalists) and the Adelaide Crows (last seasons preliminary finalists). Surprisingly however, the Dogs have not dominated in the key performance areas. They have lost disposals and disposal efficiency every week, as well as tackles, clearances and inside 50's two out of the last three weeks. Instead, they have played an impressive brand of team football with few outstanding players but several players doing team-first roles. They have also been incredibly effective when going forward.

While both clubs are managing to win games of football, Sturt have played a more consistent brand, where they have been competitive and won the key areas. Despite Central District's winning games, when teams cannot win inside 50's, disposals or clearances, they will inevitably be unsuccessful. As such, if the Dogs are not able to rectify these areas and Sturt's supreme midfield through Battersby, Lewis and Wilson begin to dominate, Sturt will win.

Adelaide Oval - 12.30pm (Sunday)



Acting as a curtain raiser to the AFL, Adelaide, who after three rounds are sitting 2nd with a win/loss record of 2 and 1, welcome South Adelaide, who are currently sitting equal 2nd behind the Crows with only percentage separating them, to Adelaide Oval for this Sunday afternoon match-up in Round 4.

Both teams will be looking to get back into the win column having been defeated by Central Districts and West Adelaide respectively the previous week.

Adelaide, who travelled to Elizabeth Oval last Saturday to do battle with the Bulldogs, went down in thrilling fashion, losing 13.7 85 to 11.15 81, by 4 points. The Crows, who lead by as much as 5 points at half time, fought back on multiple occasions throughout the match, including having been down by as much as nineteen points, 11 minutes into the opening stanza after a Dale Pearce goal.

The fightback began when Harry Schoenberg and Riley Clamp kicked back-to-back goals to bring the visitors within a kick after 14 and a half minutes of play. Lachlan Gollant (3.4 and 12) had a lot of the football for the Crows and could have very well kicked at least 5 goals from his eventual 7 shots on target. Matt Crouch was as influential as always with his 24 disposals including 5 clearances in the midfield. Harry Schoenberg, added 23 disposals to go with his 2 goals and 6 marks.

For the home side, Harry Grant racked up 27 disposals and 9 clearances and Nick Lange added to his goal tally with 4.0 and 10 touches. Central Districts were also well helped around the ground by the likes of Billy Iles (21 possessions), and Jez McLennan and Jarrod Schiller both collecting 20 touches with Schiller kicking 2 goals of his own.

The victory for Central improves their record to 2 and 1 and sees them, after 3 Rounds, sitting equal 3rd with percentage only separating them from both South Adelaide and the Crows. Central now look ahead to doing battle with Sturt who are currently sitting in 1st place with a 3-0 win/loss record.

A seven-goal to one, second quarter managed to be the key difference in victory for West Adelaide on the weekend, as they took down travelling South Adelaide, 14.12 96 to 11.8 74 by 22 points at Richmond Oval, to register their first win of season 2023.

A four-goal masterclass from Jono Beech along with a 33-possession game from Callum Park is what steered the Bloods to victory. South Adelaide, who after kicking 5 goals in the opening stanza, managed to kick six goals in total for the duration of the match, were led by Bryce Gibbs who had an effortless display of 36 disposals was very influential in try to will his side over the line. The efforts of Mitch O'Neil, who had 33 disposals himself as well as a Zach Sproule 4-goal haul, are ones that also should not be ignored.

This Round 4 matchup between The Panthers and The Crows is looking to be a cracker, as both teams are coming off of a loss and will be looking to bounce back. The Crows have the likes of Matt Crouch and Lachlan Gollant as well as the young up and coming Harry Scheonberg and the Panthers have the likes of Bryce Gibbs, Mitch O'Neil and former Greater Western Sydney Giant, Zachery Sproule as well as former Brisbane Lions listed Ely Smith.

This is a game that could be won either in the midfield or the forward line, don't miss a moment of the action.

Prediction: South Adelaide by 3 points.

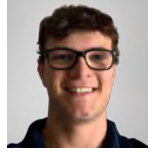

The Double Blues continued their unbeaten start to 2023, winning their third game on the trot at the hands of the struggling Port Adelaide, who are yet to win a game through three rounds. With the game in the balance at quarter time, the home side pulled away in the second term, slotting six goals to one for the frame, ultimately setting up the 38-point win. Both sides split six goals each for the second half, as the visitors were reasonably competitive for large portions of the contest, with the second quarter lapse proving to be the difference. Patrick Wilson continued his hot start to the year, probably securing three votes with his 28 disposal, 10 tackle and 2 goal performance, while former Port Adelaide player Marty Frederick was damaging with 30 disposals of his own. Lachlan Burrows led all goalscorers with 3.2, while Tom Lewis kept up his ridiculous tackling numbers with an additional 18 on the weekend, to bring his total to 49 through three games. For Port Adelaide, it was AFL veteran Trent Dumont who led the way with 26 disposals, although he had 9 clangers for the game. Riley Bonner had 20 disposals but wasn't a standout, although he will probably find himself in the AFL side this week with the injury to Kane Farrell, as will Tom Clurey (15 disposals, 5 rebound 50's) with Tom Jonas' suspension.

The game again got away from Port Adelaide in the disposal count, as they just struggle to get their hands on the footy in crucial periods of games, but the efficiency discrepancy wasn't as large as it has been in prior contests for the Magpies, and while they dominated the hitout battle, in large part due to Scott Lycett (34 hitouts), Sturt still prevailed around the contest, winning the clearance battle while also having nine more inside 50's.

Sturt face a red hot Central District next week, fresh off their upset win over Adelaide, in what will be a cracking contest between two form sides, while Port Adelaide will look to muster their first win as they travel to West Adelaide.

The match couldn't come at a better time for these two sides, with a win required by both teams to remain a threat to the finals race.

In Round 3, West Adelaide made a statement to the league, ending the undefeated streak of South Adelaide to the tune of 22 points. After a slow start to the game, the Bloods levelled the scores midway through the second term and never looked back, leading for the remainder of the game. Their win came off the back of an improved performance from their forward line. Big goal tallies from Jonathon Beech (4) and Luke Redfern (3) accounted for half of the teams' total goals. A best-on-ground performance from defender Callum Park (33 disposals, 8 marks) helped propel his side to a much-needed victory and their first of the 2023 season. In his second league game, Samuel Frost had a team high 6 tackles, putting on full display his effort and ability to have a defensive impact on the game.

Port Adelaide are yet to record their first win of the 2023 season, most recently going down to ladder leaders Sturt by 38 points Saturday afternoon. In a tough game for the Magpies, there was little to cheer about come the final siren. The Magpies had a slow start but managed to rally late in the opening term to trail by 6 points heading into the first break. A quick goal to begin the second quarter by AFL listed player Jackson Mead levelled the scores early. However, it was all downhill from there for the winless Magpies, with the margin only increasing for Sturt from that moment onwards. Nick Moore continued his strong start to his season, finishing with 18 disposals, 14 tackles and a goal on route to a team-best performance, while Trent Dumont had a team-high 26 disposals. Francis Evans was also a standout, finishing with 18 disposals and 2 goals for the game to finish as the Magpies only multiple goalkicker. To add to the pain for the day, star forward Mitch Georgiades was stretchered from the ground early in the second quarter with what appeared to be a serious knee injury after a marking attempt.

The matchup this week looms as a big game for both sides, with both sitting towards the lower end of the ladder and desperate for early wins. Both sides enter this match out of form and struggling to fire to begin the season. This match has the added motivation of being in honour of the great Russell Ebert, giving both teams another reason to come away with the victory. West Adelaide have quite a strong defence that have performed in every game this season, limiting teams once they reach their attacking 50. This will play strongly into the hands of the Bloods, with the Magpies missing some key pieces of their forward line next week in Mitch Georgiades and Jase Burgoyne, who may be needed in the AFL team. The midfield battle looks more of an even contest, with the pressure of the Magpies displaying potential for their players to get first access to the footy. If the Magpies are to win, they need to restrict the marks West Adelaide take in their defence. They lead the league in rebound 50s this season and use these to spark their momentum throughout the game. This match last year was a hot contest and made for great viewing. Much of the same is expected in this season's matchup.

Glenelg to knockout Norwood premiership defence

Glenelg will be out to continue its winning ways when it hosts struggling reigning premier Norwood in round four at Stratarama Stadium on Sunday. The Bays executed a dominant second half display against Woodville-West Torrens to run out 48-point winners on Monday, whilst the Redlegs slumped to 0-3 following a 54-point thumping at the hands of North Adelaide on Anzac Day's Grand Final re-match.

Norwood's winless start to 2023 has it languishing at the bottom of the ladder, and it isn't about to get any easier, with Glenelg playing inspired football under new coach Darren Reeves. Despite a 31-point loss to Sturt in round one, the Bays sit fourth on the SANFL ladder and are carrying momentum following back-to-back wins, with forward Lachlan Hosie leading the league's goalkickers (12).

The Bays were at their damaging best on Monday against the Eagles with their quick ball movement by foot key to their ability to counterattack teams this season. After only leading by nine points at half-time, the Bays outscored the Eagles by 39-points in the second half, with their reliance on kicking pivotal in their ability to turn defence into offence.

Ex-West Coast Eagles midfielder Luke Partington won plenty of the football with 28 disposals, whilst Max Proud (26 disposals, 11 marks) and Darcy Bailey (25 disposals) were brilliant in setting the Bays up out of defence. Glenelg recorded 219 kicks and 99 marks in Monday's game and it resulted in inside 50 dominance, leading forward entries 59-41. Once it arrived in the forward line they were seldom let down, with forward Lachlan Hosie slotting five majors, alongside Luke Reynolds with three, the Bays had nine individual goalscorers. The Redlegs premiership defence is hanging by a thread, and they will need to find some form quickly if they are to salvage a season that is staring down the barrel of a 0-4 start.

Tuesday's Anzac Day clash against the Roosters saw the Redlegs comprehensively beaten in inside 50s 63-42, conceding the first nine of the game. Despite only trailing by seven points at quarter-time, Norwood was never in the contest, as repeat inside 50s ensured that North Adelaide eventually broke down the dam wall. Declan Hamilton toiled hard for the Redlegs with 33 disposals, whilst new recruit Matthew Ling (24 disposals) played his best game in a Norwood guernsey since arriving from the Sydney Swans. Key-forward Connor McLean was a presence in attack with two goals amongst a quiet day for Redlegs forwards. Alongside its loss to North Adelaide, Norwood has faced hefty defeats against Woodville West-Torrens (46-points) and Sturt (53-points) in the opening rounds. Its percentage has taken a battering as a result, with an average losing margin of 51-points this season.

Sunday's clash against Glenelg sees Norwood travel away from Coopers Stadium for the first time this season, and it will be the two sides first meeting since last year's semi-final, which the Redlegs won by 28-points at Adelaide Oval. Both sides split the inside 50s on that occasion with the Redlegs edging the Bays 47-46, however the Redlegs owned the stoppages, winning hit outs 58-25 and clearances 45-33 as they took control of the game in the second half. Redlegs players Nikolaus Rokahr (28 disposals) and Harry Boyd (45 hit outs) were both pivotal in the victory. Norwood are a vastly different outfit so far this season however, and face a huge task in stopping Glenelg's offensive ball movement from its back half.

If they afford the Bays the same opportunities inside 50, it could be another blowout for Jade Rawlings' side on Sunday, and rarely does a team rectify its season following a 0-4 start. Ascendency in the middle of the ground will be pertinent for the Redlegs to avoid repeat forward fifty entries, whilst locking the ball in their own forward half will be critical in stopping the Bays kicking game from their defensive half. Last round the Redlegs scored 5.10 from their forward 50 entries, the Bays were efficient with their entries kicking 15.10. If they are to remain a chance, the Redlegs must make the most of their opportunities on Sunday.

Glenelg are building into the season strongly and could flex its muscles this week, they will be too strong for a Norwood outfit that is struggling to recapture its premiership winning form.
