DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

Old Ignatians vs Port Districts

The gorgeous Karen Rolton oval played host to an emphatic Port Districts win as they bounced back and got their first points on the board in the 2023 season. It was unfortunately another forgettable day for the Old Ignatians, as they managed only 8 scoring shots to an incredible 35 scoring shots from the visitors, resulting in a significant 23 - 105 end score. Despite being the biggest margin of the round, this result almost does the hosts a service, as Port Districts 14 goals 21 yields some room for improvement for them, as well as significant warning signs for the Old Ignatians. This is the second consecutive high score conceded by the Ignatians. This week epitomized by an exciting 6 goal haul from crafty forward Tom Gray, who also earned BOG accolades this week.

Brighton Bombers vs St. Peters OC

The straight shooting Brighton Bombers have given their big home crowd a terrific win to jump start their season and send St. Peters to a rough 0 - 2 start. Following last week's demolition at the hands of Glenunga, and sitting in last place after round 1, the bombers seemed the underdogs as the competitive St. Peters had a point to prove after their poor round 1 showing. However, a relentlessly competitive first 3 quarters, and terrific forward line kicking proved enough to chalk up their first win of the season. St Peters ended the first quarters trailing by merely 2 points, even leading the scoring shots by 3. However, Brighton would follow this up with 2 incredibly competitive quarters of football. At 23 scoring shots a piece, St Peters were reminded of the age old adage, good kicking is good football. This proved accurate as the 16.7, 103 Bombers took an important victory against the 11.12, 78 St. Peters OC.

Tea Tree Gully vs Glenunga

Another game this round that shows how difficult this competition will be to tip, came courtesy of a deconstruction of Tea Tree Gully, as Glenunga followed up their terrific round 1 performance with more of the same. The exciting top of the ladder clash saw both teams eager to make their good start to the season a great one. For the Glenunga Rams, they did just that, bombarding the previously untested Tea Tree Gully defense, as a second quarter onslaught quickly silenced the home crowd of Tea Tree Gully. For Glununga, Abaina Davis, Nicholas Egarr, Samuel Parsons, all provided very strong performances without getting on the scoreboard. They come up against the so far unimpressive Old Ignatians in round 3, an exciting prospect for the Rams as they could start their season with a strong 3 - 0 record.

Sacred Heart OC vs Broadview

After coming off the most competitive games of round 1, this game would be a fascinating gauge of where a lot of teams stand early in this season. This should breed a great deal of excitement for Sacred Heart OC, as the encouraging 74 point mauling of Broadview will give them the necessary reassurance they need to get their season back on track. As for Broadview, their incredible round 1 shock could not be replicated despite the efforts of Ben Manning, who put together a gutsy performance in an otherwise disappointing showing. They will be determined to compete against a strong Prince Alfred OC lineup in round 3 to show the rest of the competition that round 1 was not a flash in the pan.

Prince Alfred OC vs Goodwood Saints

Prince Alfred OC has made a statement to the rest of division 1 football. That traveling to their home ground and being competitive will prove a monumental task for any team who attempts it. Indeed, this was the case for the Goodwood Saints. Whom were coming off a fantastic round 1 victory to continue

their winning ways of 2022. This competitiveness wasn't to be seen for a long, grueling 3 quarters for the saints, with an abysmal 0 goals 7 streak not being broken until midway through the fourth term. Only managing 2 goals for the match, it was a defensive masterclass from the Prince Alfred OC back six. Credit to Lochlan Charlton, who was defensively reliable for the full 4 quarters. Unfortunately for the saints, the game was realistically over very early in the second quarter, the 47 point halftime difference margin ballooning to an 80 point victory for the men in red.

Round 3 Previews

Goodwood Saints vs Brighton Bombers

My early tip for game of the week takes these two teams that I think are on relatively level pegging. Each team having a competitive win and a disappointing loss to their name, the win this week will be equally important to each of these respective teams. As all clubs will agree, a 2 - 1 start to the season looks a lot better than a 1 - 2 start. Despite the home ground advantage, a very disappointing 2 goal game for the Saints encouraged me to back to **Brighton Bombers by 12 this week**.

Glenunga vs Old Ignatians

The two completely different ends of the spectrums for these two teams, with the ladder leading Glenunga taking on the bottom of the table Old Ignatians at their home deck. I fear it might be a long day in the office for the Old Ignatians, whose defense have performed lacklusterly in the first two rounds, and will be tested harder than any of the previous games. I'm going for a bold call for this one, I'm confident that Glenunga can put together the first **100+ point win of the season**.

Port Districts vs Sacred Heart OC

I think ominous might be the best word to describe this clash. Each team sits 1 - 1 at this point in the season, each with a heartbreaking loss, followed by an emphatic victory. It could be argued that this is a lock for the game of the round. But I get the sense this could be an uncharacteristically one sided affair. For that reason, I'm going to go with a Comfortable **Port Districts victory by 33 points.**

Broadview vs Prince Alfred OC

Although I've previously stated that Prince Alfred will be primarily strong at home, I believe that round two's performance deserves to be rewarded with a convincing tip this week. Despite Broadviews impressive round 1 performance, a big loss to Sacred Heart OC in round two could spell a worrying round 3 encounter against the in for Prince Alfred OC. I'm going with **Prince Alfred by 7 goals.**

St Peters OC vs Tea Tree Gully

Yet another game that proves difficult to tip in this division - a trend I'm starting to notice - will ensure my tipping record never gets too impressive. Each of these teams coming off considerable losses in round two, the 1 - 1 Tea Tree Gullys will venture to St Peters OC. Where, in a close affair until the last 10 minutes, St Peters will chalk up their first win of the year. Defeating **Tea Tree Gully by 17 points.**

Golden Grove v PHOS Camden


