



Broadview vs Tea Tree Gully:

Tea Tree Gully kicked off the most exciting round of the footy season so far with an exhilarating 12 point win over an again competitive Broadview. Skipper Blake Penney was instrumental in Tea Tree Gully's explosive start, leading 6 - 31 at the first change.
