



Cats to be too strong for revitalized Crows.

Adelaide failed their biggest challenge last Sunday afternoon. Facing the hottest team in the competition and leading all night, the Crows lost by the barest of margins. As I wrote after the Crows lost their first two matches of the season, bad kicking is bad football.

Anyone who watched the game would agree that the Crows should have had this match wrapped up if not by quarter time, certainly at the main break. Thirteen scoring shots in a half of football is impressive. The only problem was that only three of them were goals.

History suggests Collingwood are never out of the contest and again, despite leaving it very late, Steele Sidebottom scores the winning behind and Collingwood sit atop the ladder after 7 rounds of season 2023.

Many of the shots on goal Adelaide missed were regulation for AFL footballers. There were other opportunities that Adelaide also missed entering the forward 50-meter zone, let alone having a shot on goal. The Crows' pressure was immense, and their ability to create a turnover and create a forward thrust was exciting, and great to watch.

I have come to the conclusion that a ruck man is of little value at stoppages. I have seen time and again one ruck man dominate a game to a point where it is pointless the opposition nominating a ruck man to compete, yet the team without a ruck, dominates clearances. Sunday was a great case in point. The Crows were plus 25 in hit outs, and Collingwood won clearances by a massive 21. The real value of a ruck man is taking contested marks around the ground. Collingwood have proven you don't need a ruck man to continue to win games of football.

Port Adelaide has produced arguably its best performance of the season in a high-pressure clash that has yielded a seven-point victory against in-form St Kilda at Marvel Stadium.



Port Adelaide has won their last eight games at Marvel Stadium and certainly have the wood over the Saints picking up victories in 12 of their last 13 encounters.

Jason Horne-Francis was the star of the show finishing with 25 disposals, eleven clearances and seven score involvements.

Travis Boak who started the season slowly played his best game of the year with 30 disposals and at 34 years of age the veteran might still have a couple of years left in him at the top level.

There were plenty of solid contributors for Port. A couple in particular, Miles Bergman who continues to solidify his position at AFL level. Out of contract at the end of the year, his signature on a new contract needs to be a priority.

Zak Butters has now gathered 25 disposals or more in his last four games and consolidated his importance to the Power midfield.

Whether there have been any significant tactical changes to the coaching setup we do not officially know, but the move of Ken Hinkley to the bench has coincided with four straight wins.

One thing that most people acknowledge is Ken Hinkley has a very good relationship with his players. The ability to engage and motivate at ground level certainly seems to be having a positive effect.

A sour note from the match was the injury to Xavier Duursma. Scans have confirmed a ruptured PCL which will see the 22-yearold spend significant time on the sidelines.

Next up for the Power, Essendon at Adelaide Oval who have lost their last two games. A great opportunity for Port Adelaide to push inside the top four.

Dogs make Bloods Bleed

West Adelaide will make the commute down to X Convience stadium this Saturday to play an in-form Central Districts. Centrals enter the match with two wins and two losses, eclipsing last years poor season, while West Adelaide come into the match with one win and three losses. Last week the Dogs (Central Districts) lost to top of the table Sturt, while the Bloods (West Adelaide) lost to Port Adelaide, putting both sides in reach of the top

five. As such, this match is expected to be a brutal and physical contest, as they both look to better last year's season, where they battled for the wooden spoon.

Last season Central Districts were a pedestrian side winning a measly four games and finishing ninth. In stark contrast, the Dogs have been a competitive powerhouse in the first four matches this season, with their only losses coming against Sturt and South Adelaide. Their strength has been their ability to score from rebounding the football from their defensive half. Despite, conceding 171 inside 50's in four games (losing the inside 50 count three out of four weeks), the Dogs have conceded only 35 goals. This means teams score a goal approximately one in five times when they go forward. In comparison, Centrals have entered their forward 50 158 times this season and scored 38 goals (score a goal one in four times they go forward). This ability to score accurately and from rebound 50's has allowed Centrals to be competitive, despite losing in other key areas such as disposals, clearances and tackles, which they have lost most weeks.

West Adelaide coach, Adam Hartlett, would also be relatively satisfied with his teams performance this season. The Bloods have consistently been unable to compete with opposition sides for an extended period, having not played finals since 2015. In fact, since 2015 West Adelaide have won only 24 matches out of a total of 122 games. Fortunately for Hartlett, the Bloods have been more competitive this season, narrowly losing to both the Crows and North Adelaide, with last weeks loss to Port Adelaide (by 17 points) being an aberration. Unfortunately, for West Adelaide their inability to enter forward 50 (less inside 50's than opposition three out of four weeks), coupled with their lack of clearances (lost every week) and pressure, has allowed opposition sides into the game. Instead, the Bloods have relied on their effective transition, as they have the highest disposal efficiency in the competition. This has been generated by their star players of Park, Ryan and Gore, who have had influential in the first four games of the season. As such, if West Adelaide can win more clearances and more of the ball, their quality use of the ball will make them a dangerous side.

Overall, while both sides are in significantly better form than last season, I feel Central Districts have shown greater promise having defeated North Adelaide and Norwood, and losing to in-form teams, South Adelaide and Sturt. Subsequently, if West Adelaide continue to lose the ball around the contest, the Dogs will be able to nullify West Adelaide's forward line and score themselves by transitioning the ball forward. Round 5 of the SANFL season sees the reigning premier, Norwood travel to Alberton Oval to do battle with their fiercest rival, Port Adelaide when the two powerhouses meet on Saturday afternoon. After falling to Glenelg at Stratarama Stadium (formerly known as ACH Group Stadium), 12.10 82 to 7.10 52, by 30 points over the weekend, Norwood are struggling and remain without a win sitting at 0-4 after the first month of the season. The visitors had a slim 4-point lead at the quarter time break, having kicked 2.6 to the Bay's 2.2 in the wet. Jackson Callow played his first game for Norwood in almost 2 years, having last worn the red and blue back in 2021 before being picked

up by Hawthorn in the mid-season Draft, he finished with 4 disposals, coming in for the suspended Tristen Binder, who copped a 2-game ban after his hit on North's Aaron Young on ANZAC Day. Connor McLean, who had 6 touches, was the only multiple goal kicker for the Redlegs, booting 2.0. Glenelg kicked 4 goals to 2 in the second term to go into half time 10 points to the good of their opponents, not before midway through that quarter play was stopped for approximately 4 or 5 minutes after Bradley Searle of Glenelg was placed on report for forceful front on contact to the head of Norwood's Jack Saunders. As of this writing, Searle has been sent directly to the tribunal as he awaits his fate for the heavy hit on the weekend.

Some of the positives on an otherwise disappointing day for Norwood, Nik Rokhar was busy as usual in the middle collecting 28 possessions and 7 clearances. And newly appointed co-captain, Jacob Kennerley was also very busy around the ground racking up 17 disposals of his own to go with his 7 clearances. The Tigers, were well lead in the middle by Corey Lyons, who had a day out, collecting 26 disposals, including 12 clearances, and kicked 2 goals. James Bell, Lachlan Hosie, Luke Reynolds, and Matthew Allen also kicked 2 goals each in the victory. The result for Glenelg sees their record improve to 3 wins and 1 loss at the end of the round, which has them currently sitting equal 2nd behind the Adelaide Crows only by percentage. Glenelg will now look ahead to doing battle with South Adelaide next weekend down south at Noarlunga Oval.

Port Adelaide snapped their three-game losing streak over the weekend thanks to a 4-goal performance from Russell Ebert Cup winner, Thomas Scully against West Adelaide at Loxton Oval in the 2nd ever Russell Ebert Tribute Match. The Magpies prevailed by 17 points, winning, 12.13 85 to 10.8 68 to improve their record to 1-3. After Port kicked 5 goals to 1 in the opening term, it looked like it was going to be nothing less than a blowout victory, but after being held to only 1.4 at half time, The Bloods turned things around in the third, kicking 5 goals to 1 to reduce the deficit to 21 points at three quarter time. Port Adelaide got out to a game-high 52 point lead within 5 minutes of the third term, but West Adelaide just kept coming kicking the next five goals to give their fans some life. Callum Park continued his strong start to the season for West Adelaide racking up 33 disposals, including 11 marks, in a fine performance that is eerily similar to that of the week before against South Adelaide. Park was helped by Thomas Morrish (28 disposals and 7 marks), and Kobe Ryan (24 disposals). Liam Delahunty (10 and 4.0) and Joshua Gore (12 and 4.1) combined for 22 disposals and 8 goals in a losing effort.

Thomas Scully's 4.4 from 9 touches was enough for him to be named the winner of the 2023 Russell Ebert Cup. Hugh Jackson, who had 22 possessions and a goal and Francis Evans who had 2.2 from his 15 touches were second and third respectively in the voting. Norwood need to win this coming weekend to prove that last year's Grand Final victory was anything but a fluke. Premiership hero, Matthew Panos kicked 3 goals in the 2s last weekend, so expect him to slot right back into the League side to face Port Adelaide. The potential inclusion of Panos, will be a very pleasing sight for Redlegs fans nationwide as the self-proclaimed "King Panos" will help to provide a much-needed boost to a very struggling team who are in desperate need of a victory as well as going out to prove that the result of last year's Grand Final is anything but a fluke. Since its inception, Norwood and Port Adelaide have been rivals, and almost every matchup between the two sides, bar the last few years, have been instant classics and each meeting between these two teams have been highlighted by some unforgettable moments. A victory for the Redlegs would kickstart their season and give themselves and their supporters some much-needed confidence about the next few weeks ahead. For the home side, they will be looking to collect back to back wins and all but end the reigning premiers season at 0-5. As has always been the case when this teams do battle, expect another instant classic. Norwood will be out to feast and look to put an end to their disappointing start to the season.

Woodville West-Torrens held a slim lead midway through the second quarter, before the home side flipped a switch and never looked back.

The Eagles outscored North Adelaide in the first and last quarters, but their poor middle quarters cost them a pivotal road win.

Woodville West-Torrens created more opportunities to score, going inside 50 47 times as opposed to the Roosters' 39, but lost the clearance battle 31-38 to North Adelaide, who thrive off driving the ball forward out of stoppages. North Adelaide had more disposals, marks, and tackles, ousting the Eagles in nearly every counting stat, but the game was still in the balance for most of the contest.

Campbell Coombe was prominent in the midfield as always for the premiership hopefuls, tallying 29 disposals and laying 14 tackles, combined with a game high 12 clearances in an all-around performance. In an inaccurate game at both ends, Keenan Ramsey was the outlier, booting 4.1 in a match-turning effort in front of goals to go with 17 disposals and 9 marks. Ex-AFL players Sam Mayes (26 disposals, 8 marks) and Harrison Wigg (22 disposals, 1 goal) found plenty of the footy, while Jake Patmore accrued 29 touches as the Roosters' collectively stepped up in Young's absence.

For the Eagles, former Crow Riley Knight amasses 31 disposals to go with 8 marks, while Mitch Hardie (21 disposals, 2 goals) was also among the best in a losing effort. James Rowe added 25 disposals but was wasteful in front of goal, kicking 0.3, and Joseph Sinor played one of his best games for the year so far with 28 disposals, 8 tackles and 6 clearances.

The Roosters moved inside the top four with the win, and host Adelaide in what will be a blockbuster, while the Eagles, sitting seventh at 1-3, host ladder leaders Sturt who are yet to drop a game.

Saturday's twilight game sees the Eagles host the Double Blues, in what should be a competitive contest. Round 5 of the SANFL features a game of the week matchup on Saturday afternoon between North Adelaide Roosters and the Adelaide Crows at Prospect Oval. Both teams have a 3-1 record through the opening month of the season and are eager to continue their strong form to cement their name amongst the best in the competition in 2023. With one that promises to be a belter, both teams are looking to continue their winning form after both losing to Central Districts in consecutive weeks.



In round 4, the Roosters held off a strong Woodville outfit to run home 16-point winners. After a tight first quarter, the Roosters trailed by 9 points at the first break. From the moment the second quarter begun, the Roosters looked the stronger side. They took a 9-point lead into the main break, before coming out and looking to put the game to bed in the third quarter. They lead by as much as 27 points late in the 3rd, before a late surge from the Eagles bought the margin to 10 points minutes into the final quarter. A late response from North Adelaide saw the margin finish at 16 points come the final siren. Roosters forward Keenan Ramsey finished with a game high 4 goals, with Noah Casalini the only other multiple goal scorer for the Roosters, finishing with 2 of his own. Campbell Combe continued his prolific start to he SANFL season, racking up 29 disposals, 12 clearances and laying a game-high 14 tackles on route to his best afield performance. Captain Alex Spina was strong in defence, finishing with 20 disposals, 7 marks and 4 tackles.

Adelaide ended the weekend second on the SANFL ladder with a league-high percentage after an 84-point thumping of South Adelaide. The first quarter was an even contest, with teams going goal for goal throughout the quarter, with the Crows taking a slim 8-point lead into the first break. It was a much different contest from that point onwards, with the Crows only increasing their margin at each break. The Crows outscored the Panthers 5 goals to 0 in the second quarter, featuring two goals from AFL listed player Ned McHenry. The third term was dominated by the Crows, however it wasn't reflected on the scoreboard. Both teams kicked 2 goals for the quarter, with the Crows winning the quarter 2.9 to 2.1. The final quarter was once again a one-sided affair, leading to an 84-point win by the Crows. Crafty forward Tariek Newchurch finished with a game-high 4 goals from his seasonhigh 16 disposals. AFL listed player Jackson Hately strung together a best on ground performance, finishing with 31 disposals, 9 marks, 5 clearances, 8 inside 50s and 3 goals. Star ruckman Kieran Strachan also had a day out, amassing 18 disposals and 33 hit outs, as well as a goal. Ned McHenry was influential throughout the game, adding 3 goals from his 22 disposals, along with 9 marks.

For what is poised to be game of the week in the SANFL, both teams are more than capable of walking away from this game with a season defining win. The Crows have had some strong wins this season, blowing teams out early and continuing their dominance right through the game, whereas North Adelaide have had close wins, keeping teams at arm's length, and coming away with a hard-fought win. The Roosters can win the game in the midfield with Campbell Combe leading the way. Combe is averaging 27 disposals, 11 tackles and 8 clearances a game in the middle, and North Adelaide's offensive possessions often start with Combe. Their captain, Alex Spina has been strong in defence this season, averaging 25 disposals, 7 marks and 7 rebound 50s per game. While he will have a tough task on the weekend, he can help propel the Roosters to a season defining victory. For Adelaide, they struggled in their only loss against Central Districts. They did not have first access to the ball and found it difficult to get momentum at times. If they are going to win on Saturday, they need to have first hands to the footy at the stoppages. Adelaide had 38 clearances on the weekend, compared to 26 in their loss this season. The Crows can also win the game up forward, with North Adelaide having a slight struggle with their defence this season following repeat entries.

The Bays brush of plucky Panthers

Reeling from an 84-point defeat, South Adelaide is looking to bounce back against an in-form Glenelg outfit in Saturday's round six contest at Flinders University Stadium. The Panthers were completely outgunned in their clash with Adelaide last week, beaten in all key areas as their season wobbled to 2-2 following consecutive losses. Despite only trailing by eight points at quarter time, the Panthers were helpless in a second quarter

that saw the Crows kick five unanswered goals, extending their margin to 38-points at the main break. The Crows' momentum continued in the second half, with an 8-goal blitz in the final quarter handing South Adelaide its worst result of the season.

It was a torrid day for Jarrad Wright's side that saw them comprehensively beaten in the possession battle 394-286, whilst the Crows also controlled the game in the air, collecting 123 marks to the Panthers 60. It resulted in inside 50 dominance for the Crows 63-38 as they poured the pressure on the South Adelaide defence, with the dam wall bursting in the final quarter. Star defender Joseph Haines was resilient with 29 disposals (25 kicks) along with Mitch O'Neill and Ely Smith (25 disposals and 7 clearances each). GWS Giants recruit Zachary Sproule kicked two goals up forward in a game that was otherwise bereft of highlights for the Panthers.

The feeling at Glenelg is optimistic following a third consecutive win in round four over reigning premier Norwood. A winless Redlegs side ensured the game remained a tussle for the entirety of the first half, before the Bays stole the ascendency in the last quarter, with ex-Sydney Swans forward James Bell sealing the game with a classy finish. The Bays commanded possession 317-245 and were able to maintain 77% disposal efficiency despite wet and slippery conditions coupled with their usual reliance on kicking. The Bays work rate was highlighted by their ability to apply pressure, equalling the Redlegs tackling despite spending more time in possession of the football.

Leading by only 10-points at three quarter time, it was the fourth quarter that saw Glenelg clinch a 30-point margin, and the second week in-a-row that they have finished stronger than their opponents. Former Brisbane Lion Corey Lyons was outstanding for the Bays amassing 27 disposals including 12 clearances and two goals, one of Glenelg's five multiple goal scorers on the day. Fellow midfielder Matthew Snook (24 disposals) provided support whilst Darcy Bailley (23 disposals, 19 kicks) and captain Max Proud (21 disposals, 16 kicks) continued their strong form this season. The last time the Panthers met the Bays was in round fourteen of last season, where the Panthers ran out 45-point winners, their ascendency in forward 50 entries was key on that occasion.

Joseph Haines was pivotal to that performance with 28 disposals, but South Adelaide will need an even spread of contributors on Saturday if it is to combat a Glenelg side that has players performing well at all areas on the ground. The Bays are also a different proposition this time around, with a new coach and new gameplan seeing them revitalised in 2023. The challenge for the Panthers this week is the multitude of areas they need to improve on to present themselves as a winning chance against the Bays. The possession battle looms large following their disappointing performance in that area against the Crows, whilst they also cannot afford to concede marks in a similar fashion against a Glenelg side that is intent on being aggressive by foot.

Pivotal to the outcome of the game will be whether or not the Panthers can lock the ball inside their forward 50 and generate repeat entries. Glenelg's only loss this season came in round one against Sturt, a game where the Bays won the clearances, but lost the inside 50s. The Bays have proven they have the ability to outlast their opponents in fourth quarters in recent weeks, and would have taken notice of what the Crows did in the penultimate quarter against the Panthers last week.

South Adelaide will respond this week, but it has a lot to turnaround in a short amount of time, and Glenelg is playing an exciting, attacking brand of football that has stood firm in recent challenges. The Bays will be too strong for a competitive Panthers side.
