



The Crows were brave against the Cats last Saturday, and with 3 minutes left in the match could have been as close as six points behind the premiers. The result was a 26-point win to the Cats, who were the better team all afternoon.

Despite the loss, the Crows played some excellent footy and should be encouraged by their effort and attack on the ball for the four quarters. Jordan Dawson was excellent once again in the midfield, Luke Pedler continues to provide another forward option and the Crows backline was exceptional. Geelong averaged 120 total points scored, in their last four matches. The Crows defensive half only conceded 98 points, with Tom Hawkins and Jeremy Cameron only scoring 4 goals between them. This was a great defensive effort, and one which will please Matthew Nicks and his coaching staff.

The one key area Adelaide was clearly beaten was stoppage clearance. Geelong had 9 more stoppage clearances than the Crows. Geelong had 34 for the match, well above their season average of 25. This really was the difference between the two teams. Whilst the Crows didn't come home with the four points, their ability to match the pressure, intensity and fitness, against the hardest team to beat at home, was a tick for the way they want to play.

There is no disgrace in losing, if you produce a quality effort, and are beaten by a better side on the day. We all know Geelong are a good team, the Crows are not far behind them.

Taylor Walker and Izak Rankine were multiple goal scorers, and both having excellent seasons in front of goals. Luke Pedler also kicked two goals and his career continues to build consistency and is demonstrating he can be dangerous with his left foot when within goal scoring range.

The Saints travel to Adelaide this week after a scrappy 30-point win over North Melbourne. This is a great opportunity for the Crows take down a top 8 side and there is no better opportunity than this weekend against St Kilda. The Saints sit equal second on the ladder and will be keen to continue their winning form. Ross Lyon has taught the saints how to defend this season. This has been a hallmark of their first 8 games this season. St Kilda kept North Melbourne goal less in the first half of the game, and they only scored four goals at the end of full time.

Despite ladder positions, the Crows will start strong favourites, and need the four points to maintain a possibility of playing finals. The Crows have won three of the last five matches between the two teams and with the Crows firepower up forward, they will be difficult to stop. Sunday will be sunny and 20 degrees, perfect football conditions. The Crows are better than last year, and will beat the Saints.

Highlight of the week:

I would have liked it to be a Crows highlight, but it has to be Jeremy Cameron's mark over Ben Keys in the last quarter. Keys did the right thing and worked Cameron under the ball which would have taken Cameron out of the contest, Keys could have run onto it and kicked the ball inside forward fifty.

However, Cameron took a great mark, fully stretched which killed the game for the Crows.



Tiger Time

In a match expected to enthuse, North Adelaide will make the commute down to Stratarama Stadium to take on Glenelg. Both sides have been impressive this season with Glenelg sitting third on the ladder, having won four out of five games and North Adelaide sitting respectively third, after winning three games thus far. These sides have a history of close games as exhibited by lasts years round 6 clash, where the Roosters were victorious by only two points.

Glenelg have started the season in premier form eclipsing last seasons bitter end, where they were narrowly defeated by Norwood in the first final. Since then, Glenelg have recruited several players including James Bell (who averages a goal a game), and have lost only one game to top of the ladder Sturt. This success is exhibited in Glenelg's ladder percentage as they are ranked third in offence and first in defence. This high ranking in defence is a staple of every SANFL grand final team in the past 15-years. The Tigers utilise their large home oval by playing an uncontested brand of football. Glenelg have had more uncontested marks than their opposition in every match this year. Concerningly for coach, Darren Reeves, their disposal efficiency has not surpassed 80 per cent once this year. This means that despite the Tigers controlled and uncontested style of football, skill errors has allowed sides to score from Glenelg's turnovers. Nonetheless, Glenelg have won the football at its source (have had a greater number of disposals than their opposition in four of the last five games) and therefore look as if they will challenge most sides. Further, several players from Glenelg including Hosie (averaging 3.8 goals per game), Luke Partington (averaging over 21 disposals), Billy Stretch (averaging 17 disposals) and Corey Lyons (averaging over 21 disposals), are all aged between 24 and 26. As such, these players are in the absolute peak of their careers, which ultimately makes Glenelg a powerhouse in season 2023.

North Adelaide have also had a promising season. Despite losing Will Combe in the off-season, North Adelaide remain a midfield dominant side having won clearances every week. This has been led by 'the bull', Campbell Combe, who averages 7.2 clearances and a lazy 27 disposals a week. Unlike the Tigers, North Adelaide rely on a high pressure, high tackling, style of football, to generate repeat inside 50's. Despite a relatively low scoring accuracy, the Roosters effective system behind the football allows them to repel opposition sides from going forward. Unfortunately for North Adelaide, they have made costly errors throughout games which has impeded their ability to win matches. As such, the Roosters are ranked fifth for scores for and against. Last season, where North Adelaide finished first, they were second for scores for and third for scores against. This is an area of their game they will need to rectify against an in-form Glenelg outfit, if they stand a chance of producing an upset.

While both sides have made quality starts to season 2023, the Roosters lack of list depth coupled with Glenelg's effective style of football, indicates the latter will be successful. Although North Adelaide are a formidable side and will likely challenge for the premiership again this season, I cannot overlook the number one defensive side in the competition. Glenelg by 1-12.

After a poor 0-5 start to the season, reigning premier, Norwood, head to Port Lincoln for the second consecutive year, to host West Adelaide at Centenary Oval in Round 6. For the fifth consecutive week, the Redlegs have gone without a win, after being defeated by seven points against Port Adelaide at Alberton Oval over the weekend. The 8.10 58 to 7.9 51 defeat was the 5th loss in a row for Jade Rawlings men, who, are yet to register a victory following a very infamous 1-point win over North Adelaide on the final weekend of September a mere 8 months prior. Debutant, Guy Lok booted 3 goals from nine disposals for the visitors while Nik Rokahr was as influential

as always, racking up 26 possessions including eight tackles and 7 clearances to reach 103 ranking points. The low-scoring affair was manly due to the wild, wet, and windy weather that became an occurrence throughout the day, as both sides kicked 2 goals in the opening term, but at the first change, it was the home side with a slight 2-point lead, having finished 2.5-2.3 to Port Adelaide, who after 04:31 of playing time had an early eight point lead thanks to a goal from Sam Hayes. After back to back behinds from Guy Lok and Ben Jarvis, the Redlegs, through the small Tasmanian forward, Baynen Lowe, kicked their first major of the match, 20 minutes into the first term, seven minutes later, Lowe again kicked truly for his and his team's second of the match. In the second quarter, with goals from Aiden Turner and Oliver Cheesman, the hosts were out to a 16-point buffer midway through the second term and were able to hang on and hold Norwood goalless, with the visitors having only being able to score 0.2 and head into the main break facing a 15-point deficit, with the score being 4.8 30 to 2.5 17 in favour of the Magpies. The Redlegs came out firing to begin the second half, kicking three goals to one to, at one stage, take a four-point advantage thanks to back-to-back goals from Guy Lok. The lead however, almost immediately evaporated and the hosts were once again in front, taking a three point lead into the final quarter, thanks to a goal on the siren from Nathan Barkla. The Magpies' victory was well earned as players such as Hugh Jackson (23 touches and 10 tackles) and Nick Moore (15 disposals, 11 tackles and 5 clearances) shone bright all around the ground. All eight of the Magpies goals were individually kicked, whereas for Norwood, as mentioned earlier, Guy Lok (3) and Baynen Lowe (2), combined for five of the seven goals. For Port Adelaide, this is their second victory in as many weeks and now sees their record improve to 2-3, sitting only 1 win outside of the top 5, with their next game coming against South Adelaide on Mother's day at Alberton Oval. West Adelaide, over the weekend, went down 8.12 60 to 7.7 49, losing by 11 points to Central Districts at X Convenience Oval at Elizabeth. The Bulldogs, who kicked the opening four goals of the match, never looked like slipping up against the Bloods, who looked to be blown out of the park from the very first bounce of the ball, having only managed to kick 1 goal to trail by 21 points at quarter-time. Two goals from Central's Billy McCormack as well as seven marks to go with his 20 disposals, was more than enough for his side to collect the 2 points, as he, along with Jez McLennan (24 and 1.0) and Anzac Lochowiak (15 and 1.2) were all influential in a successful day for the club. Despite the result, West Adelaide, who were helped by Thomas Morrish (24 and 2.0) and Jonathan Beech (9 and 2.1), should be confident with the depth of talented football players they have in their squad for this season. Hamish Ellem (24 possessions) and Callum Park (20 possessions) also continued to impress each and every game, with the pair combining for 44 disposals and 15 marks in the loss. For West Adelaide, the loss sees them fall to 1-4 and have them sit equal 7th with Woodville West-Torrens after 5 rounds. Central, on the other hand, collect their third win of the season which sees their record improve to 3-2 after 5 games. For both Norwood and West Adelaide, the Round 6 matchup in Port Lincoln becomes a must win for either team. A victory for Norwood will not only give them their first win of the season but could save and salvage the job of Jade Rawlings, who is quite possibly under some very immense pressure, especially when he is the reigning premiership coach who is currently winless in 2023. West Adelaide will be looking to return to the winners list after suffering defeats in back-toback games, to Port Adelaide and Central Districts. The key to victory for either team on the weekend is to make sure the game is won in the midfield as well as up forward, as on paper, both sides have a strong, well-balanced midfield, with the likes of Callum Park, Thomas Morrish and Hamish Ellem for Westies and for Norwood, the likes of Co-Captains, Jacob Kennerely, Matthew Nunn, and Nik Rokahr. Norwood need to get their season rolling and what better way to do that then to go up north to the country and defeat West Adelaide, who, much like their opponents, are struggling, mightily. Going to be a tough contest between two lowly teams battling it out for not only the Peter Teakle Cup, but for their season as well.

Woodville West-Torrens recorded more disposals than Sturt and went at a better efficiency, something Sturt have not been beaten at yet this year, which opened avenues of attack for the Eagles, but they were not as damaging out the contests as they still gave up seven more clearances to Sturt's engine room. The Double Blues also enjoyed three more inside 50's than the Eagles, giving themselves extra chances inside their attacking 50 to generate scoring opportunities and pile pressure on the Eagles' backline.

Former Brisbane Lion Connor Ballenden did all he could to will his side to victory, booting a bag of five goals for the home side, but it was not enough as he didn't receive enough help from his attacking counterparts. James Battersby led all disposals with 28, to go with 7 tackles and a game-high 12 clearances, while Joshua Hone and Oliver Grivell both snagged three goals apiece to pace the winning side. Tom Lewis was not at his usual tackling prowess, laying just the 5 which was well below his season average of 16, but he was still influential with 20 touches and 4 clearances of his own.

While the Eagles have been competitive for the most part of every game so far this year, they have yet to really capitalise on their opportunities and sit at 1-4 after five games.

ROUND 6

It is a tale of two stories heading into Sunday's clash between the two 2-3 sides. For the Magpies, after starting the season slowly at 0-3, they have found some form and have won two on the trot, knocking off West Adelaide on the road and the reigning premiers Norwood in the process. On the contrary, South Adelaide started the season in form at 2-0 but have dropped off with three consecutive losses to leave them a win outside the top five. With Port Adelaide hosting the Panthers this week, it is a perfect chance for both sides to make a push at the top five.

The Magpies were beaten in almost every key area against Norwood, but still managed to hold on and scrap out the win. Their 8 goals came from 8 different goalkickers, a testament to their variety of options in front of goals, and they only had one player tally more than 20 disposals – Hugh Jackson had 23 touches, 10 tackles and 5 clearances. Their task this week will be made a lot easier with the injury to star former Blue and Crow Bryce Gibbs, who broke his thumb early in South Adelaide's loss to Glenelg on the weekend. The Panthers will have to rely on their less experienced players to step up in Gibbs' absence, which is a tough ask for a struggling side on the road against a side that has found form.

Crunching the numbers, we can see that the Panthers allowed 98 marks to the Tigers last round – 83 uncontested. The Panthers had more clearances but were ineffective with them, giving Glenelg easy possession and overall control of the tempo of the game. While Port Adelaide haven't been damaging in that facet either, without Gibbs the Magpies may find it easier to win it out the middle, especially with the service of AFL veteran Scott Lycett doing the ruck work. This season the Magpies haven't been an overly conservative, possession-keeping side, but South Adelaide still must sharpen up on their pressure around the ground, as they allow too many players to attack the gaps and find easy footy.

On paper, the Panthers line-up pretty well with the Magpies, but the loss of Gibbs may be too great to overcome, and Port Adelaide could very well win their third consecutive game to push for the top five.

The second quarter started much the same way, with Sturt once again piling on the goals while restricting its opposition to limited goal scoring opportunities. A 3 goal to 1 quarter saw Sturt take a commanding 30-point lead into the main break. The third quarter saw Woodville claw their way back to a gettable margin by three-quarter time, kicking five goals straight including three from star forward Connor Ballenden, leaving the margin at 22 points heading into the final quarter. The last quarter was a heated contest as Woodville looked to claw their way back into the game with intense pressure around the footy. Both sides kicked 2 goals for the quarter, leaving Sturt to run out 22-point winners. James Battersby (28disp, 7 tackles, 12 clearances) was the leading disposal winner for Sturt, also applying pressure around the ground by tackling hard all day. Patrick Wilson continued his stellar start to the season, finishing with 15 disposals and a game-high 13 tackles, continuing his remarkable streak of 10+ tackles in each game this season. Ruckman Daniel Fahey-Sparks provided first option out of the ruck all day, accumulating 38 hit outs along with 14 disposals, 5 marks and 3 clearances to cap off his all-round performance. Oliver Grivell and Joshua Hone finished with 3 goals each, while Lachlan Burrows and James Richards round out the multiple goalkickers for Sturt, providing 2 goals each.

Adelaide had an equally impressive win against a hungry North Adelaide outfit. North Adelaide started strong, having the first three scoring shots of the game. After a reply from Adelaide, North took a 9-point lead into the first break. The second quarter was a different game, with the Crows piling on the goals to take a comprehensive lead into the main break. Five goals from the Crows, including back-to-back goals from Matthew Wright, saw Adelaide enter the main break with a commanding 26-point lead. North Adelaide controlled most of the third quarter, however, could not reflect this on the scoreboard, kicking 2.5 for the quarter to Adelaide's 2.0, both off the boot of Riley Clamp, maintaining a 21-point lead heading into the final change. The last quarter was once again a shootout of goals, with all but one being scored by the Crows. A five goal to one quarter capped off a dominant game from Adelaide and guaranteed them a top two spot heading into round 6. Adelaide had plenty of power up forward, with Riley Clamp (4 goals), Lachlan Gollant (3 goals) and Matthew Wright (2 goals) all kicking multiple goals in Adelaide's big win. 2022 draftee Andrew Macpherson had a day out for Adelaide, finishing with 29 disposals, 12 marks and 4 rebound 50s, while fellow AFL listed player Sam Berry finished with 17 disposals, a goal and a game-high 10 tackles. AFL listed player Patrick Parnell continued his strong run of form after returning from concussion, accumulating 26 disposals and taking 10 marks in his sides win.

Looking ahead to the weekend, this game guarantees to be a nailbiter from start to finish. Adelaide have had a fantastic attacking style of game all year and have blown teams out of the park within the span of one quarter. They also have players in all sections of the field who are excellent high-pressure players and thrive on causing turnovers in dangerous areas of the ground. Sturt are undefeated on top of the ladder and possess the perfect balance of an attacking and defensive style of game. Thye have the potential to kick big scores and have periods of games where they pile on the goals while restricting opponents to limited inside 50s and no scoring opportunities. They have a fantastic midfield who thrive on running both ways and providing leadership for their team in offense and defence. This game will certainly go down to the wire, with nothing left to do except sit on the edge of our seats and hold our collective breaths.

Bulldogs show their bite against falling Eagles

Woodville-West Torrens is desperate to snap a four game losing streak when it hosts Central District at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval on Saturday. The Eagles enter round six of the SANFL season with a 1-4 record, following a 22-point loss to an unbeaten Sturt side last Saturday.

Despite winning the possession battle, the Eagles never headed the Double Blues who won the clearances 37-

30 and led by as much as 40-points in the third quarter. A three goal surge before the final change saw the Eagles spark a revival, however Sturt steadied with the opening two goals of the final quarter to run away with it. On an otherwise disappointing day for the Eagles, Ex-Brisbane Lions forward Connor Ballenden offered a strong presence, collecting 17 disposals and nine marks on his way to a five goal haul. Midfielders Joseph Sinor (26 disposals) and Jimmy Toumpas (21 disposals) were also prominent ball movers for the Eagles. It has been a torrid month for Jade Sheedy's men since their big round one victory over reigning premier Norwood. A challenging fixture has seen them play four of their five opening games away from home, alongside losses to premiership fancies Glenelg and Sturt. Central District survived an almighty scare against a fast-finishing West Adelaide side last week. Looking to bounce back from their devasting loss against Sturt the week prior, the Bulldogs controlled the first quarter, winning the inside 50s 21-2 in a dominant display that gave them a 21-point lead at the first break. With repeat forward entries the Bulldogs were able to carry momentum and a 40-point lead into three quarter time.

It was far from a four quarter performance however, with a spirited fightback from the Bloods threatening to steal the unlikeliest of victories. The Bloods slotted five unanswered goals in the last quarter to outscore the Bulldogs 31 – 2 but it wasn't enough as Central District held on for an 11-point win, its third of the season. The Bulldogs would have been a tragedy beaten, finishing the game with 25 more inside 50s than the Bloods (52-27), whilst also edging the Bloods in clearances 31-28.

A standout performance from ruckman Billy McCormack was imperative to Central District's efforts at the stoppages, winning 26 hit outs and collecting 20 disposals, seven marks and two goals. He was aptly supported by Hugo Munn (21 hit outs) to hand the Bulldogs a 49-24 advantage in that area. Defender Jez McLennan continued his strong form since arriving from the Gold Coast Suns with 24 disposals and a goal, whilst Justin Hoskin (23 disposals) and Mani Liddy (22 disposals) were also pivotal in the victory. It was a relieved Bulldogs camp that escaped with the two points on Saturday, having led their previous clash against Sturt at three quarter time before being overrun.

The win saw them remain entrenched inside the top five of the SANFL ladder as they strive to stay within touching distance of league pacesetters Sturt, Adelaide and Glenelg. It's the first encounter between these two sides since their round 11 clash last season, which saw the Bulldogs upset a more fancied Eagles side with a 35-point win at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval; their first win at the venue since 2019. The Eagles won the clearances 37-29 on that day but executed at 28% from their scoring shots inside 50, kicking 5.13 to the Bulldogs 11.12. It was relentless pressure that saw the Bulldogs take the ascendency, laying a staggering 30 more tackles than their opponents (83-53) despite both sides maintaining an equal share of possession.

Travis Schiller was influential in that game for the visitors with 34 disposals and a goal, whilst ex-Essendon midfielder Dylan Clarke fought hard, amassing 32 disposals and a goal. Saturday's contest against the Bulldogs is shaping up to be pivotal to the Eagles' fortunes in 2023, rarely does a team lose five games in-a-row and rebound to make finals. Central District has an opportunity to consolidate its position in the top five of the competition before a huge task looms against Glenelg next week at home. It has been a tough four weeks for Woodville-West Torrens and it looks set to continue against a Central District side that probably should have won by more last week with its inside 50 supremacy. A similar effort against the Eagles, but maintained for four quarters should see them too strong.
