### **SAWFL - Division 1 with Samantha Field**

#### Payneham NU v Adelaide University 11.13.79 v 0.0.0

Payneham have continued their great start to the season with another dominating display. The Adelaide Uni girls were nowhere to be seen in this weekends game and were unable to even register a score as they went down by 79 points. It was a consistent four quarter effort from Payneham, and their win could have been much larger if it weren't from some errant goal kicking in the first quarter. The girls only converted two major scores from their seven shots to start the game with a 17 point lead. In the second they were able to tidy this up and added on three more goals in the term. #### Tea Tree Gully (2.3.15) defeated Goodwood Saints (1.8.14)

Round 2 of the Adelaide Footy League Division 6 Women saw the return of wet weather footy, as all

three games gave us plenty of talking points. Tea Tree Gulley vs Goodwood Saints was definitely the game of weekend, with both teams battling out a closely matched contest, ultimately decided by composure in front of goal. Tea Tree Gully continued their impressive start to the year, registering their second win of the season. In typical Gully fashion they were explosive starters, scoring both of their goals for the game in the first half. Early scoreboard pressure seems to be a key strength of the travelling side who effectively get on top of the opposition throughout the opening stages of the game. A goal in each of the first two quarters for Tea Tree Gully made it difficult for the Saints to get themselves into the contest until its dying stages, which caused the home side to eventually fall a point short in their comeback attempt. Erin Anderson was the difference on the day. A fantastic performance and a timely goal earnt Erin a career first best on ground award in her 44th game. For all of Tea Tree Gully's brilliance however, there is plenty of frustration to be felt by the coaching staff of Goodwood Saints. A disappointing start to the game left them with too much to do in the last guarter as Zali Turner scored their only goal yet again. The Saints finished with 1 goal and an astonishing 8 behinds, with 6 of them coming before their first major score, certainly costing them the game. There was plenty of hope for the Saints heading into round 2 following their performance against Flinders Park, but their continued dependence on Turner in front of goal is not fair on the competitions top goal scorer. If anything, this contest has given the rest of the division an insight on what to expect from both teams. The Saints are a dangerous side with plenty of potential, but their inaccuracy in front of goal has to be seen as the main reason that they are 0-2 and not 2-0. Unlike Goodwood, Tea Tree Gully are in fact now 2-0 and cruising into a week off with their by eround. However, its not all positives for the Gully. Their narrow 1 point victory has shown that although they are strong starters, they leave themselves vulnerable to throwing away leads. In their first two games they have only registered 3 points during the second half and if the Saints could kick straight, Gully would be 1-1.

A 73 point loss was certainly not the performance the away side were hoping to put out in their inaugural game of Women's Footy. Those who were at Harper Fields witnessed what could be a landmark game for Golden Grove as they truly announce themselves as a threat to the rest of the league. The home team's last quarter showing in round 1, gave them a mass of momentum that they carried into the opening quarter, registering 6 match defining goals. With 3 goals, Sarah Hewitson was outstanding! She was a persistent headache for the Mitchell Park defence alongside Katie Bell and Kelly Ransom who piled on the misery with two goals a piece. Despite the Grove's imposing presence in their forward 50, it was actually Leyneaka Maigler who was rewarded for her efforts all game with her very first best on ground award. An impressive and encouraging aspect of this season so far is actually those who are giving out the votes as it is clear that everyone is paying attention to more than just who is kicking the goals! There weren't too many positives to take away for Mitchell Park this weekend. As expected, key signings Shannon Gaskell and Achol Agany were among their best players, which I'm sure will be said many times again before the end of the season. Overall, this game was much more a case of Golden Grove being that good, rather than Mitchell Park playing poorly. Goodwood bolster an impressive side who are capable of massive achievements this season, however, my only fear is that another lack lustre display of goal kicking could see them plummet to 0-3. Moreover, I have no doubt that the Saints will continue to put out impressive high-effort performances; all that is missing is the final product, particularly late on in games. Flinders Park and Mitchell Park will both be looking to put round 2 behind them as the two lowest scoring sides of the round go head-to-head in the first competitive Women's Division game to be held at the Mitchell Park Oval. Despite their heavy defeat to Athelstone, there's still a strong sense that Flinders Park will be a commanding force this year and they would have to be favourites heading into this one.

The last game sees Marion return to the scene following their weekend off and there are definitely reasons to be concerned. The Grove girls are coming off the back of an awesome display of goal kicking and defensive solidity after their resounding 73 point victory against Mitchel Park in round 2. Marion, who also failed to score a single goal in their first game, will have to improve drastically against one of the best teams in the competition to get their first win. This is a challenge that I see too tall for Marion and Golden Grove should be able to get home comfortably.
