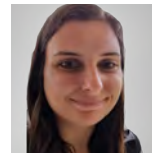

Adelaide University v SMOSH West Lakes

SMOSH have bounced back after their loss last week with a fantastic win over Adelaide University by 66 points. SMOSH had a dominate first quarter to set them up for the rest of the game. They kicked five goals, but could have had more if it weren't for another four shots going wayward. They also held strong in defence, only allowing Adelaide Uni to have a single point in the term. The margin at the first break was already a commanding 33 points. In the second the Lions scoring chances slowed but they still had control over the game. The Falcons took a modest 12 point margin heading into quarter time. They made their move in the second but unfortunately poor accuracy let them down. The next few weeks will set the season up for a couple of teams.



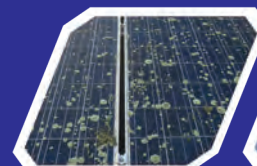

Tea Tree Gully (3.4.22) defeated Golden Grove (1.1.7)

Round 4 was a weekend of demanding displays for the favoured sides as Tea Tree Gully started the weekend off with a convincing victory over Golden Grove. A bye round last week meant the Gully Girls came into the game undefeated with a 2-0 record and were successful in keeping their perfect start to the season intact. Their dominance during the first three quarters of the contest halted their opponent's ability to move the ball forward, as they restricted Golden Grove to a single behind up until the last break. The home side's loss to Tea Tree Gully makes it three already this season despite all of the promise they showed early. However, it were the non-goal scorers who dominated the best player ratings for the game with Amanda Donetzkow leading the way, registering her first player of the match performance of the year. Lara Nemeth, Kate Haigh and Tammy Roberts were the other fine performers, standing up during the contest and perfectly displaying the depth of quality within the squad. Rhiannon Utton continues to be Golden Grove's glimmer of positivity as she collected her fourth consecutive best player recognition this season. Ashleigh Thomas and Jessica Attewell were also impressive despite their sides disappointing loss, whilst Kelly Hillman and Rachael Thompson continued to show promising signs as they battled hard against commanding opposition. Tea Tree Gully now sit comfortably in second place with a game in hand over Athelstone, the only side ahead of them. Golden Grove, however, are stuck in fifth place and with a bye in round 5, there is potential that this season is going to get a lot worse before it gets better for a side that was once labelled as one of the more commanding teams in the division.

Marion (6.8.44) defeated Flinders Park (0.4.4)

Flinders Park hosted Marion in a one sided affair that saw the home team fall victim to Marion's relentless resurgence as they look back to their best. Unfortunately for Flinders Park, the less than flattering scoreline is a representation of their gradual decline this season. Their performances as of late are a distant version of the display that earned them a huge win against Goodwood Saints in round 1 and its hard to say whether or not they will return to playing that level of football any time soon. Charlotte Young continued to impress and was certainly one of the shining lights in their heavy defeat, whilst Madasyn Golding was effective again without being able to hit the scoreboard. Their victory sees Marion cement themselves into third place with back-to-back wins, just beneath the two remaining undefeated sides in the competition. Flinders Park have been gifted a lifeline and currently sit fourth on the table, following Mitchell Park's controversial disqualification in the previous round. scorecard; Athelstone, the best side in the competition, scored twenty behinds. Subsequently, from twenty-six chances in front of goal, Athelstone only converted 23% of those into major scores, preventing the deficit from being even worse for the Mitchell Park women. Despite their inaccuracy, Natalie Lomman finished the night with a brace and maintained her intimidating status within Athelstone's forward 50. The golden boot leader was not alone, however, as the home side had another four individual goal scorers who cashed in on their sides convincing dominance in their attacking half. Despite an abundance of scoring opportunities gifted to Athelstone's forward outlet, it was actually Emma Tiggemann who finished as the game's best player; her second recognition following her performance in round 1 against Golden Grove. 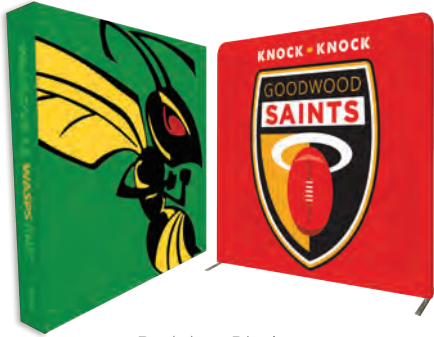
