Adelaide University v SMOSH West Lakes 3.2.20 v 12.14.86

SMOSH have bounced back after their loss last week with a fantastic win over Adelaide University by 66 points. SMOSH had a dominate first quarter to set them up for the rest of the game. They kicked five goals, but could have had more if it weren't for another four shots going wayward. They also held strong in defence, only allowing Adelaide Uni to have a single point in the term. The margin at the first break was already a commanding 33 points. In the second the Lions scoring chances slowed but they still had control over the game. 

Tea Tree Gully (7.6.48) defeated Flinders Park (2.2.14)

Round 5 of the Adelaide Footy League Division 6 Women's competition was a fascinating weekend of

mixed results. Unsurprisingly, Tea Tree Gully were able to hold off Flinders Park in the first game of the round, coming away eventual winners by 34 points. The home side showed promising signs and had more scoring shots than Gully in the first quarter. Unfortunately for Flinders Park though, they were unable to withstand relentless opposing forward pressure and struggled to transition out of their defensive half. Amanda Donetzkow was important for Tea Tree Gully as she led the way with two goals, which were her first for the season. Keita and Piper Aplin were in control of the contest from the outset and were both named among the travelling team's best performers along side Marissa Penno, Kate Haigh, and Tanisha Cox. This victory is yet another stellar performance that extends a fine run of sparkling form which leaves the undefeated Tea Tree Gully hot on the tail of league leaders Athelstone. Flinders Park displayed several good signs early in the game, registering 8 points in the first quarter. Goals to Yasmine Cook and Meagan Fowler were glimpses of promise amid a tough loss, whilst Lucy Martinson rose to the contest and earnt herself a best on ground recognition for Flinders Park. Following round 5, Tea Tree Gully still sit second on percentage, and with a game in hand over Athelstone, the Gully Girls could find themselves on top of the ladder very soon. Flinders Park find themselves dead-middle of the road in 5th place, just outside a final's position.

Golden Grove (13.15.93) defeated Ingle Farm (1.1.7)

In surprising circumstances, Ingle Farm have dropped two grades from Division 4 and have been with the brute force of a resurgent Golden Grove. The home team seemed to have returned to their best during their fantastic display, as Ingle Farm were unable to score a goal until the game's closing stages. Their one major score was in fact their first of the season as a team, following a tough run of humiliating results in their previous competition. Ashleigh Thomas was instrumental for the Grove Girls, booting a monstrous five goals which is career high for the captain. Although Thomas terrorised opposing defenders all day, she was not alone, however. Impressively, Katie Bell and Rachael Thompson combined for five goals between them in an emphatic showing of goal scoring prowess. Vice captain Chelsea Duval and Kelly Ransom were also on song, adding insult to injury and capping off an impressive team performance. However, best player honours were given to Kasia Culhane who was impeccable for Golden Grove, contributing to the scoring herself as she played an enormous role in their dominance. It's hard to be hopeful for Ingle Farm this year following their descendance from division 4. They came into this contest off the back of losing four straight and there is hardly a glimpse of a side that won seven games in 2022 as they continue to struggle across all areas. Tamantha Brown gave the Farm coaching staff half a reason to smile with her admirable efforts against an onslaught of Golden Grove forward pressure. Their entry into division 6 certainly throws a spanner in the works for the rest of the clubs in the competition, as four teams have already had a bye round this year. With league leaders up next for Ingle Farm, I can only see their season getting a lot uglier.

Goodwood Saints (8.9.57) defeated Mitchell Park (0)

Finally! At long last the Goodwood Saints have been able to build on the competent signs they showed early in the season and have registered their first win in emphatic fashion. Mitchell Park were passengers for most of the contest as they failed to score a single point for the second week running. Zali Turner returned to the line up for the away side following her brief stint in their division 2 team, making an instant impact as she hit the scoreboard and was named among the best performers. Goodwood were in complete control of the contest, impressively scoring a goal in every quarter and shut Mitchell Park out of the game comprehensively. Captain Caitlin Moyle was instrumental in their dominance as she registered an impressive two goals, alongside an extensive list of individual goal scorers. Among those was Fleur Marais, who continued her consistent start to the season as she was named best on ground for the second time in three games; she could play a massive role for the Saints throughout the remainder of the season. For Mitchell Park, positives were hard to come by. Emily Armstrong tried hard and executed well despite the heavy defeat and was one of very few Mitchell Park players who can be content with their individual performance on Saturday. The loss on the weekend confirms the concerns from round 4 as they remain second-bottom, saved only by the

Marion (5.6.36) defeated Athelstone (2.3.15)

If you were looking for a match of the round, and maybe the most important of the year, look no further than this tremendous clash of titans at the Marion Sports & Community Club. Unbelievably, Marion were able to do the unthinkable and got over the line against Athelstone. It was a closely matched contest separated by desire and intensity as the Marion women stood up immensely to the team currently top of the ladder. Their victory makes it three on the trot as they outclassed and outscored Athelstone in every quarter. Jasmin Fettke was an unstoppable force and drove home the win for her side as the away team struggled to limit her outlet and impact on the game. Isabelle Dawson scored her first of the season, making her one of five separate goal kickers for Marion on the weekend. To have five individual scoring contributors is an incredible sign of a unit who is back firing as effectively as ever. For Athelstone, nothing quite went their way as they were unable to play to their usual standard. Kayla Lambert was a lone ranger in front of goal for the travelling squad as she registered her side's only two majors. Other than Lambert, vice captain Kristina Barone was Athelstone's best performer for the second time this season despite the disappointing loss. They remain top, however, which is a positive outcome of this weekend. Ingle Farm's introduction to the competition, has worked in Athelstone's favour as Tea Tree Gully sit behind them just on percentage and missed a game due to the bye. Although their momentum is halted, they will certainly be eager to face the Farm girls who are in dire straits at the moment.

This round of Women's Division 6 football for the Adelaide Footy League association proposes plenty of interesting prospects. With no bye rounds for the foreseeable future, there are a few teams who will be looking to take advantage of the extra chances at points they have had. Those who have already sat a week out this season will feel hard done by, none more so than the powerful Tea Tree Gully. The Gully girls are the only team to remain undefeated so far, but still find themselves second despite Athelstone's loss to Marion. The points should continue to come this weekend as they face a distorted Mitchell Park who are winless in their first four games. Pertaringa Oval will host the clash and I can only see the contest going one way and that is in favour of Tea Tree Gully by a comfortable margin.

The next match up is intriguing as Golden Grove will face Flinders Park at home following their commanding display in a bounce back win against Ingle Farm. It won't be an easy contest and is a battle for fourth place as the two sides will be challenging all season for that last spot in finals.
