





Crows to clip Eagles wings.

It was a disappointing result in Darwin last Saturday night. The Crows needed to maintain their impressive form and for the first quarter and a half, it looked like the Crows were banking the four points and sitting at 7 wins for the season.

Then the Suns avalanche happened. Nine unanswered goals left the crows more than three goals behind, which was a testament to the pressure the Suns applied at the contest and clearances. It was an indictment on Adelaide's ability to transition the ball from defence into attack.

What was disappointing was the players were challenged by Matthew Nicks during the week to take their home form and performance on the road and demonstrate they can play fast attacking football away from Adelaide Oval. We saw the result of their away footy with losses against the Cats, Bulldogs and Suns. The only away victory this season was a 3-point nail biting win against the Hawks in Launceston.

Winning away from Adelaide Oval is the next frontier in the development of the Crows. Whilst they are capable of playing fast intensive and very entertaining football, the players need to be able to produce it every week. The biggest disappointment from the Suns match was the season ending injury to Tom Doedee. He has ruptured his ACL in his knee and is also out of contract at the end of the season.

Tigers to upset high-flying Blues

Sturt will play Glenelg this week, in what is set to be an epic clash between the two best sides in the competition. After relatively average seasons last year, both Glenelg and Sturt have been impressive in 2023. Glenelg sit second, having lost only one match this year, while Sturt are top of the ladder and have won every game this season. As such, this match is expected to be game of the round and an excitable battle between two of the league's best teams.

Last time these sides met, Sturt were 31-point victors. Glenelg were beaten around the ball, losing disposals, and were ineffective when going into their offensive half. Since then, Glenelg have been superb. In the following seven games, the Tigers have won disposals and marks every week, and have had less inside 50's than the opposition only once. This epitomises much of Glenelg's brand; controlled football. They are meticulous with their disposal, as they average over 75 per cent in disposal efficiency, which is aided by the large amount of uncontested football they receive. This means when they do go inside 50, they are generally more effective. Subsequently, their star forwards in that of Hosie, who averages 2.9 goals per game, McBean, who averages 2.3 goals per game and Reynolds, who averages 1.9 goals a game, are receiving elite forward entries due to the Tigers gameplay. As a result, Glenelg are the second-best offensive team in the competition and have won seven games in a row.

Fortunately for Sturt fans, the double blues are the second-best defensive team in the competition. This will make for an interesting dynamic between both sides' offence and defence. The last time these sides met, Sturt nullified Glenelg's three powerful targets forward of the ball (Hosie, McBean and Reynolds), keeping the three to only four goals. This allowed Sturts midfield to dominate as Battersbry and Wilson, two of Sturts premier midfielders, were prolific.

Coach Martin Mattner's secret to success has been his team's ability to apply pressure, as Sturt has had more tackles than their opposition in all but two games this year. Conversely, Sturt has had the innate skill to win both inside 50's and clearances, having lost these areas only once this season. Concerningly, in the last three weeks the double blues have arguably had a minor form slump. Despite not losing a game, Sturt have had less disposals and marks than their opposition, as well as losing tackles two out of the last three weeks. Consequently, Sturt have had to win close games as four of their last five games have been decided by under two goals.

While Sturt are arguably playing worse football than the start of the season, they are still the best side in the competition. Therefore, if they can replicate their game the last time these sides met by mitigating Glenelg's forward power, they will gather another win. However, due to Glenelg's current form, I feel they will upset the undefeated Sturt. Glenelg by 1-12.

Reigning premiers to win their first match in more than 270 days.

Norwood's premiership defence has once again, remained winless after yet another close loss over the weekend but this time to a resurgent Central Districts side who have been on the improve all season long. After a seesawing, back and forth affair, it was the hosts who prevailed in front of a packed Elizabeth Oval to hang on to defeat reigning premiers Norwood by five points, triumphing, 8.8 56 to 7.9 51 at the weekend. The reigning premiers got off to a strong start having kicked three goals to one in the opening term to lead by 10



points in what would prove to be a very tightly contested, close encounter. For the first 10 or so minutes of the second quarter, there was not much to like as neither team could score, as the wet weather began to play a huge role in the match and was, in turn, a very deliberating factor. It was not until Luca Whitelum kicked truly to put the hosts within 7 points of Norwood, that a goal had been scored. It had taken 20 minutes into the second quarter before someone kicked a goal, it was Centrals' second of the game and first since the 05:24 minute mark of the 1st quarter. The Redlegs, despite only themselves managing 3 behinds, and having conceded two very late goals, were still clinging onto a slight 1-point lead heading into the main break. However, Norwood coach, Jade Rawlings would have been aware that for the SIXTH time already in season 2023, his side have been unable to kick any goals in a quarter, meaning his side has had 6 goal-less quarters throughout the first 8 rounds. The second half of the contest was much like the first, as neither side was able to break away from their opponent, with the average margin for both teams being no more than 13 points. Despite losing the match, the 'Legs led in every quarter but the 3rd, with the final quarter being the most promising having kicked 2.4 from six shots on goal to 1.2 from three shots on goal. Central Districts gun, Harry Grant, finished with 30 possessions including 9 clearances whilst the always-reliable, Jarrod Schiller had 23 disposals to go with his game-high 13 tackles. Marcus Barreau (2.3 and 10), Anzac Lochowiak (16 and 2.0) and Luca Whitelum (11 possessions 2.0 and 6 marks) all played a huge part up forward in helping fend off the mighty Redlegs. For the visitors, premiership midfielder, Nik Rokhar collected 28 disposals while, new recruit, Matthew Ling picked up 19, including 7 tackles and co-captain, Matthew Nunn, had 17 of his own. Defender, Pierce Seymour, had himself a day out, down back, racking up 23 possessions and a game-high seven marks in the loss. Norwood had seven different players kick a goal on the afternoon, not only player managed more than 1 goal, whereas the hosts, had three players kick multiple goals during the game. Former Bulldog, Conor McLean, who finished with 1.4, had a chance, after the siren, in the fourth quarter, to break the hearts of the Elizabeth Oval faithful by having the match end in a draw, but, from 45 metros out on a 45° angle, directly in front, his kick sailed over the left goal post, for a behind, which gave the Bulldogs the victory. This game also marked the return of Corey Stockdale, who was playing his first League game since the middle of last season, after injuring his knee during a game.

The loss now sees Norwood sit smack bang at the very bottom of the table with a miserable record of 0 wins and 8 losses, having not win a game since the Grand Final on September 18, 2022, which was about 263 days ago. West Adelaide in 2016, began the season by losing the first 11 matches in succession having won the premiership the season prior, beating the Eagles in the 2015 SANFL Grand Final. The Bloods, 0-11 start as reigning premiers was, at the time, a record-worst in the SANFL, if the Redlegs were to lose the next four games and have a record of 0-12, that would not only be a club-record-low, but also an SANFL recordlow. The victory for Central Districts, sees them sitting equal-5th with a 4-4, with only percentage separating them from both North Adelaide and Woodville West-Torrens. The win sets them up for a clash with Port Adelaide next weekend when they travel to Alberton Oval. A five-goal second quarter was more than enough as South Adelaide, losers of five in a row, were able to save their season as they travelled to Prospect Oval to upset the hosts, North Adelaide by 27 points. The 11.12 78 to 7.9 51 victory was only the third for the Panthers this season, as they snap a five-game losing streak in empathic fashion. South's Zachery Sproule booted three goals, all of which came in the first half, as the visitors looked to be on a mission from the first bounce, as they not only led the inside 50m count 51-31 throughout the entirety of the contest, but they also led at every change en route to picking up their third win of the season, and first since Round 2 when they defeated Woodville by 11 points. South veteran, Matthew Broadbent was excellent in his side's victory, picking up 21 disposals including eight marks, while Joseph Haines had 19 possessions and a game-high 15 marks and Ben Shillabeer (2.1 and 14) and Liam Fitt (2.0 goals), combined for 4.1 from 20 touches. For the hosts, despite the loss, Frank Szekely collected 28 disposals, whilst Sam McInerney had a big day out with his 26 disposal, 12 marks and 1 goal. Dyson Hilder kicked 2 goals of his own as he was the only multiple goal kicker for the Roosters. The defeat, for North Adelaide, now means they are sitting equal 5th, behind both Woodville and Central Districts on 4 wins and 4 losses, but also only one game ahead of South Adelaide, who next week, head back home to Noarlunga when they face the reigning premiers in Norwood on King's birthday Monday.

For Norwood, victory is a must, or they will be staring down the barrel of a 0-9 start and on the verge of becoming just the second team since 2000 to win the Grand Final and then lose the first nine games in a row, the following year. Over the past month, bar the Adelaide game, the Redlegs have been in every contest from the opening bounce to the final siren, with the game against Port Adelaide, three weeks ago and the game last weekend, as the two best games Norwood have played so far this season. For the Panthers, a victory will see them improve to 4-5 and, depending on results from the other games, could see them move into the top 5 heading into the halfway point of the season. Don't let Norwood's current record deceive its form over the last couple of weeks, as well as how good they play down south, having lost twice at Flinders University Stadium since 2018. The Norwood's form over the last two weeks is anything to go by, it should be a close, but entertaining contest.

My Prediction: Norwood by 6 points.

Sturt 8.15 (63) def West Adelaide 9.5 (59)

It took a last quarter fightback for the undefeated Sturt to extend their winning streak on the weekend, as they were challenged well and truly by the struggling Bloods. A one-goal final term shot West Adelaide in the foot as the Double Blues edged closer and closer before eventually taking a lead they wouldn't give back up.



The Double Blues kicked fifteen behinds, a total that nearly cost them an upset loss, but once again, Sturt got it done when it mattered to move to 8-0.

West Adelaide's game plan worked wonders for most of the game, as they beat the Double Blues in the disposal game, something Sturt have rarely lost all year. Sturt won the clearance battle and the inside 50 count, but were unable to punish West Adelaide for the first three quarters, often ending their attacks in behinds while West Adelaide were far more clinical in front of goal.

James Battersby was instrumental for the home side, tallying 32 disposals and 12 clearances in a best on ground performance, while Tom Lewis (25 disposals, 9 tackles) and Manguru Frederick (20 disposals, 6 tackles) also impressed. Joshua Hone was the target man up forward for Sturt, kicking 4.2 including the sealing goal halfway through the final term. The Double Blues were also aided by ruckman duo Daniel Fahey-Sparks, who dominated in the ruck with 25 hitouts and kicked the goal to put them ahead early in the last guarter, and Amos Doyle, who added 22 hitouts of his own in a pivotal showing.

For West Adelaide, Callum Park led them in disposals with 29 off half back, including 7 rebound 50's and 9 marks. Michael Mattingly (24 disposals, 10 tackles, 5 clearances) and Samuel Frost (23 disposals, 15 tackles, 8 clearances) were both huge for the visitors throughout stoppages and across the ground, while Joshua Gore (3.1), Dylan McCormick (2.0) and Michael Laudato (2.0) were the Bloods' multi-goalkickers. The win sees Sturt stay clear on top of the ladder, while West Adelaide fall to 2-6 and firmly in ninth position, two games outside the top five.

Round Nine brings us a vital matchup in terms of placing on the ladder, as either result will shake up the proceedings. The Magpies host the Bulldogs in what looms as the potential game of the round, with both sides in good form of late. Centrals held off a winless Norwood by five points last week to move into a finals position, while Port Adelaide narrowly went down at home to the Eagles by three points, now sitting a game outside the top five.

The Bulldogs delivered a much more efficient approach, as they lost almost all counts of the statistics but dominated the inside 50 tally 44-29, setting up fifteen more chances where the ball was inside their attacking 50, a recipe for success. Harry Grant has been consistently among the Bulldogs' top disposal winners in recent weeks and will need to be at his best again for the Bulldogs to overcome the Magpies midfield, revitalised with mid-season draft pick Quinton Narkle who opened his Port Adelaide account in style last week with 29 disposals, 7 marks and 7 tackles.

The Magpies are always at a significant advantage in the midfield due to their ruck tandem of Dante Visentini and Sam Hayes, who combined to crush the Eagles 54-19 in hitouts, but the Port Adelaide midfielders could not quite take advantage of their first-class ruck service until late in the game. With Billy McCormack shouldering the ruck load for the Bulldogs, he will have his work cut out for him this week and will need to hold his own against arguably the best ruck partnership in the SANFL if Centrals are to have a chance at stoppages.

The Magpies had just two goals to their name at three guarter time in their narrow loss, but stormed home with six goals in the last term as they almost ran over the top of the Eagles, only stopped by a late Daniel Menzel goal for Woodville-West Torrens. That finish alone will give them confidence coming out of a loss, and they will be looking to carry that momentum through to their season-defining clash this week. Between the game being at Alberton, Quinton Narkle's arrival providing headaches for opponents, and the overwhelming ruck tandem, the Magpies will head in slight favourites to overcome Grant and the Bulldogs, but Centrals will be confident they can get the job done and improve to 5-4.

The SANFL moves on to round 9 this weekend, after what was the benchmark for round of the season took place last weekend. In round 8, four of the five games were decided by under a goal, making for an amazing weekend of state footy. Round 9 sees Hisense Stadium play host to another exciting matchup between West Adelaide and North Adelaide. West Adelaide have been fighting down the bottom of the ladder this season on two wins from eight outings, while North Adelaide are vying for a finals berth after making the grand final last season, sitting on an even 4-4 record. Both teams are coming off close losses last weekend and are eager to get back on the winners list in

round 9, making for a game that promises to be one to watch. West Adelaide suffered a heartbreaking 4-point loss to the undefeated Sturt outfit who have asserted themselves as premiership favourites. West Adelaide started the match strong, kicking the opening two goals through star forward Joshua Gore, taking an 11-point lead at the 7-minute mark. West took a 16-point lead into the first break, following two late goals to Michael Laudato, giving the Bloods the momentum entering guarter time. The second guarter was much of a stalemate, with only one goal being kicked for the quarter. Both sides opened the quarter with a flurry of behinds, Sturt with three and West Adelaide with two, before Joshua Hone broke through for Sturt to kick the only goal of the guarter, making it a 10-point lead for West Adelaide at half-time. Again, West Adelaide had the momentum to begin the third stanza, kicking the opening goal inside the opening 5-minutes. With the crowd getting quiet, Sturt knew they had to respond, and that they did. Both teams finished the quarter with four goals, with Sturt able to keep with in touching distance of the Bloods entering the final break. A last second goal to Joshua Hone, his third for the match, cut the deficit to 6 points in favour of West Adelaide. The final quarter had the crowd on the edge of their seats. The first eight minutes saw no score, before a rushed behind in favour of Sturt cut the margin to 5 points. One minute later, Daniel Fahey-Sparks stood up for Sturt and kicked the most important goal of the day, snatching the lead early in the fourth quarter. West Adelaide was starting to feel the game slipping from their grasp and threw everything at Sturt to regain the lead, but a fourth goal to Joshua Hone brutally ripped the hearts out of the Bloods, making the margin 9 points more than halfway through the final guarter. Momentum was never recaptured by West Adelaide, with Sturt escaping another close match, their third in a row decided by 10 points or less. Defender Callum Park amassed a team-high 29 disposals in the 4-point loss, pairing it with 9 marks and 7 rebound 50s. Michael Mattingly had a team-best performance with 24 disposals, 9 marks, 10 tackles and 5 clearances, while Samuel Frost also bought the pressure with 15 tackles, along with 22 disposals and 8 clearances. Joshua Gore finished as the leading goalkicker for West, finishing with 3 goals to take his season tally to North Adelaide were also on the raw end of a hard-fought loss, going down by 27 points to South Adelaide. The Roosters were on the backfoot from the get-go, with South kicking the opening goal of the game t wrestle momentum early, kicking three goals to two for the quarter and taking a 4-point margin into the first break. The second quarter is where South took control of the game, piling on the goals in what proved to be the quarter that won them the game. Ben Shillabeer kicked the opening goal within the first minute of the quarter, before Ely Smith added another just two minutes later. South would kick three more goals for the quarter to take their quarter total to five, opposed to three from North Adelaide, leaving the margin at 20 points entering the main break. The third quarter was a hard-fought one with North Adelaide attempting to wrestle back momentum and get back in the game. However, South Adelaide held them at arm's length for the quarter with both sides kicking one goal for the term, leaving the margin at 18 points heading into the last quarter. South Adelaide only extended the lead after the final break, kicking the first two goals of the quarter before a late goal to Aaron Young left the margin at 27 points to end the game. Sam McInerney had a team-best performance with 26 disposals, 12 marks and 1 goal, trying his hardest all game. Frank Szekely led the team in disposals, collecting 28 as well as taking 8 marks and having 5 rebound 50s in defence. Dyson Hilder finished as the only multiple goalkicker for North Adelaide adding two goals, while he also had 8 disposals and a team-high 8 tackles. Looking ahead to the weekend, this game is one that can be won and lost by both sides. They both have strong defensive players who have kept oppositions to low scores all season. West Adelaide can prove to be a handful with their tall forwards who like to bring the ball to ground, whereas North Adelaide's defenders pride their game on taking intercept marks and rebounding. The midfield battle is one that can change the game, with West Adelaide opting for a style of play where they share the ball around, while North Adelaide prefer to attack the opposition with hot tackle pressure. Both sides have plenty to lose, especially North Adelaide who is sitting percentage outside the finals race and in need of points, while West Adelaide need a win to keep their hopes alive of an unlikely finals appearance. Crows cause Eagles to crash back down to earth

Adelaide will be out to regain its winning ways when it clashes with an in-form Woodville West-Torrens side at Adelaide Oval on Saturday. The Crows lost a nail-biting contest against premiership fancy Glenelg last Saturday by just two points, whilst the Eagles withstood a fast-finishing Port Adelaide to steal a three point victory and their fourth win of the season. After conceding a goal inside the first minute of the game, the Crows steadied to take a 14-point lead into quarter time in their clash against the Bays, and held scoreboard ascendency for most

of the afternoon. A spirited fightback from the Bays in the third term saw them take an eight point lead to the final change, before three consecutive goals to begin the fourth quarter granted the Crows a nine point buffer. The Crows were unable to put away a dogged Bays outfit however, with Matthew Allen kicking a special match-winner from beyond the 50m arc. Despite Adelaide's scoreboard pressure throughout, Glenelg finished the game with more possession and inside 50 dominance (53-40), whilst they were also able to match it with the Crows big guns in the midfield, only losing the clearance battle by two (33-35).

The Bays not only got their hands on the football, but they also brought the tackling pressure, laying 13 more tackles than the Crows despite having more possession. Both midfields went head-to-head, as Matt Crouch led the way for the Crows with 30 disposals and eight clearances. Making his case for AFL selection was Harry Schoenberg (26 disposals, 11 tackles and two goals), starring in an almost match-winning performance, whilst Former Collingwood midfielder Tyler Brown won his share of the football with 24 disposals and a goal. Kieran Strachan dominated in the ruck with 47 hit outs and the Crows won that area by 39 hit outs overall, but were unable to convert that to clearance dominance. The Crows simply had no answer for Glenelg star Liam McBean however, who kicked five goals in a performance that would prove to be the difference in the end. Woodville West-Torrens were able to escape with what turned into an unlikely victory, despite a Port Adelaide onslaught in the last quarter at Alberton Oval.

Stretching out to a 21-point lead in the final term against an inaccurate Magpies side, the Eagles seemed to have the game in their keeping before four consecutive goals to the Magpies saw the game turned on its head. A brilliant set shot from star forward Daniel Menzel on 50m was enough to steal victory late in the fourth quarter, as the Eagles held on to their spot in the top five of the ladder. The Eagles edged the Magpies in the possession battle (316-325), almost split the clearances (34-32) and won the tackle count (66-69), but were dominated in the inside 50s (63-31), with the Magpies unable to capitalise on their repeat entries. The Eagles were never headed until late in the fourth quarter, and at three quarter-time the Magpies goalkicking woes sat at 2.10, before they found their radar in the final term. Star defender Luke Beecken worked tirelessly for the Eagles on his way to 30 disposals (23 kicks, nine rebound 50s) alongside ex-AFL midfielders Riley Knight (29 disposals, nine tackles) and Jimmy Toumpas (24 disposals). Daniel Menzel's performance up forward was just as critical, kicking three goals for the game, with his two in the last quarter enough to secure the Eagles a hard fought win.

The last time these two sides met was in round 17 last season, where the Crows walked away 40-point winners at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval. The game was an arm wrestle for the majority of the first half, before the Crows kicked away in the third quarter. Matt Crouch starred on that occasion, accumulating 42 disposals, alongside Lachlan Sholl (35 disposals) and captain Matthew Wright (31 disposals and a goal). Riley Knight was Woodville West-Torrens' best player on that day with 35 disposals.

Winning form is good form, and following three consecutive victories the Eagles will be looking to claim scalp and test themselves against a real contender, the Crows fit that mould. The Crows didn't lose any friends last week in a tough loss against a good side in a game that could have gone either way, and that form line holds them in good stead.

Expect the Eagles to be honest, but the Crows to be too strong and bounce back at Adelaide Oval.
