



Crows to clip Eagles wings.

It was a disappointing result in Darwin last Saturday night. The Crows needed to maintain their impressive form and for the first quarter and a half, it looked like the Crows were banking the four points and sitting at 7 wins for the season.

Then the Suns avalanche happened. Nine unanswered goals left the crows more than three goals behind, which was a testament to the pressure the Suns applied at the contest and clearances. It was an indictment on Adelaide's ability to transition the ball from defence into attack.

What was disappointing was the players were challenged by Matthew Nicks during the week to take their home form and performance on the road and demonstrate they can play fast attacking football away from Adelaide Oval. We saw the result of their away footy with losses against the Cats, Bulldogs and Suns. The only away victory this season was a 3-point nail biting win against the Hawks in Launceston.

Winning away from Adelaide Oval is the next frontier in the development of the Crows. Whilst they are capable of playing fast intensive and very entertaining football, the players need to be able to produce it every week. The biggest disappointment from the Suns match was the season ending injury to Tom Doedee. He has ruptured his ACL in his knee and is also out of contract at the end of the season.





Return of the Redlegs

Port Adelaide play Norwood this week in what will be an intriguing contest. Both sides sit outside the top five in the competition and have put forward mediocre campaigns this season. After winning the premiership last season, Norwood have been nothing short of disappointing and have won only one game this season. While Port Adelaide have been more impressive than Norwood, they too have only won four games this season,

despite the Power's AFL dominance. As such, it will be fascinating to observe whether the power can propel themselves into the top five or whether Norwood can win consecutive games.

Norwood's strength last season was their defence (ranked number 1). This season, they are the second worst defensive team in the competition. Unfortunately for coach Jade Rawlings, his team's issues do not end there. Norwood are the worst offensive team in the SANFL and have kicked only 32 goals in the past four weeks. Generally, as a coach, let alone a premiership coach, you want to establish a sustainable and recognisable brand of football. Last season for Norwood it was their defence. This season, it seems they do not have a distinguishable characteristic of their game. Their issues are across the whole oval and are not isolated to one area. With a relatively similar team that won the grand final last year, the Redlegs have been ordinary. Promisingly, in the past four weeks, Norwood have looked threatening. They have won disposals and clearances four out the last five weeks and have not lost efficiency over this period. Subsequently, they have not lost a game by more than four goals during the past three weeks and registered their first win last week. This miniature resurgence has arguably been a product of the quality seasons Boyd, Rokahr and Lok are having. However, these players have not been supported by the rest of the team as Boyd was the only player to be selected in the state squad, which indicates the lack of depth and poor form in the current playing group.

Port Adelaide sit sixth on the ladder. After missing finals last season (finishing eighth), the Power have been inconsistent and have won only four games. They have not been able to replicate the senior sides form. Despite this, since round four, the Power have looked a stronger side. In this six game period, they have won all their matches for the season. They have also been competitive in their losses, with an average losing margin of 5.5 points. The Power play a high-risk to reward style, which makes for exciting football. As such, Port Adelaide are the worst defensive team in the competition, but are the second-best offensive team.

The last time these sides met, Port Adelaide were seven-point victors, in a Saturday afternoon toil at Alberton. If the Redlegs do not want history to repeat, they will have to improve several areas of their game. Likewise, if Port Adelaide are going to break their four-year finals drought, they need to win games like these. While Port Adelaide are playing superior football and have been impressive in the past two months, Norwood's innate competitiveness makes them threatening. Subsequently, I think Norwood will win an upset.

Woodville look everything like a genuine finals contender.

Round 10 begins as a split round with Central Districts welcoming Woodville West Torrens Eagles to the "Ponderosa" when the two sides clash at Elizabeth Oval on the weekend. Both sides will be looking to avoid consecutive losses after falling short against Adelaide and Port Adelaide, respectively. The Eagles, who were playing at the Adelaide Oval against the Crows, as a curtain raiser to the AFL, led at both guarter time and half time only to be blown away in the second half as the Crows managed 7.10 to 3.4 after half



time to comfortably run out 23-point victors, in the 13.17 95 to 11.6 72 triumph. Best afield, Harry Schoenberg (33 disposals, 10 marks and 10 clearances), was a brute through the middle of the ground, where fellow AFL-listed players, Matt Crouch (32 disposals, one goal) and Sam Berry, (23 possessions) were also collecting plenty of the ball.

One major factor throughout the contest that ended up telling the entire story, was that Adelaide dominated the clearances winning it 43-19, as well as registering ten more inside 50s, going forward 57 times in comparison to the Eagles 47 visits from their attacking forward 50. Crows in-form livewire small forward, Tariek Newchurch booted the first three goals of the match before the visitors responded with the next six in succession to lead by 16 points early in the second quarter. James Rowe, who finished with 28 disposals, including 8 tackles, was best on ground for the Eagles, as star recruit, Connor Ballenden (17 and two goals), Daniel Menzel (14 and 2.2) and Will Pearce (17 and 2.0) were all influential up forward. Eagles' Luke Thompson had a big day himself, racking up 22 disposals and collecting a game-high 14 marks in the defeat. Tariek Newchurch finished the day with four goals and Matthew Wright kicked three of his own as the Crows now head into the bye sitting in 3rd with a win-loss record of 6 and 3 over the first nine games of the season.

For the Eagles, after that disappointing result, they now sit in fourth position on the ladder at 4 wins and 5 losses, with percentage only separating themselves from their opponents next week, in Central Districts. With a list full of exceptional AFL experience, Port Adelaide's talent rose as they proved too strong for the young Bulldogs, running away 23-point winners on Saturday afternoon at Alberton Oval. A stunning four-goal haul from Orazio Fantasia, who was playing in just his second game back following a guad strain, set the tone of the contest as Port Adelaide closed within percentage of the top 5 after downing fifth-placed Central, 13.14 92 to 10.9 69. Mid-season recruit and former Geelong AFL-listed, Quinton Narkle, backed up his debut, best-on ground performance last weekend against Woodville, with another outstanding performance this weekend, having collected 33 possessions, including eight inside-50s and a kicking one goal as well as taking 10 marks in just his second SANFL appearance.

Bulldogs midfielder, Harry Grant continued his career-best form surge with another superior performance, having touched the football a total of 36 times, including laying eight tackles and gathering six clearances. Skipper Jarrod Schiller was prolific once again for the Bulldogs as he managed to kick one goal from his 19 possessions and grabbed 11 marks. Aidan Grace (9 and 2.3) and Billy McCormack (9 and 2.1) combined for 18 disposals and 4 goals 4, whilst Luca Whitelum continues to impress and improve each and every week, as he racked up 22 possessions and kicked 1.1 as well as amassing a game-high 13 marks in the defeat. Fantasia (18 and 4.3), Francis Evans (16 and 2.1) and Cody Szust (15 and 2), combined for 49 disposals and 8.4 between the three of them. The victory for the Magpies is their 4th of the season and has them sitting at 4 wins and 5 losses, which is the same record as Central after suffering their fifth loss of the season. The Magpies now travel to The Parade to take on reigning premier, Norwood at Norwood Oval on Sunday afternoon. Central will return home to Elizabeth Oval to take on Woodville West-Torrens Eagles as they look to bounce back in front of their home fans. With both sides coming off of 23-point losses, it will be a very interesting and hopefully entertaining contest between two teams battling for a top five berth and an eventual finals run. Central to pick up the win here, not just because its being played on their home deck, but more so, the fact they have the depth in the midfield and up forward.



winning fashion. While they led at every change, the Magpies never held that comfortable lead until the last term, as they got up by as much as five goals before two late goals to the visitors flattered the margin.

New recruit Quinton Narkle was superb, amassing 33 disposals to go with 10 marks, 6 clearances, 8 inside 50's and a crucial last quarter goal. His start at Port Adelaide could not have been more exciting for fans, and a call up to the senior side could be on the horizon. Jase Burgoyne was also back to his best after some down weeks following his omission from the senior side, as he tallied 27 touches, 5 inside 50's and 4 rebound 50's off a half back, while forgotten forward Orazio Fantasia had his best game for the year, kicking 4.3 to go with his 18 disposals. Ryan Burton, who seems the logical replacement for Lachie Jones (broken jaw) in the senior side, had 21 touches and 5 rebound 50's, doing his recall chances no harm at all.

The Magpies totalled 343 disposals, a season high for the rising side, as they ousted Centrals narrowly in that department (343-337). Perhaps a big reason for their success in finding the footy was the ruck service they were given, as Dante Visentini and Sam Hayes combined for 53 hitouts to give the home side a boost, resulting in a 55-45 count in the inside 50's, the telling point between the two sides. While Centrals narrowly won the clearance count, Port Adelaide were far more clinical at providing a scoring opportunity, and had they been more accurate in front of goal, the final margin could have been even bigger.

For Centrals, they were led by Harry Grant's 36 disposals, 6 clearances and 6 inside 50's, while ex-Gold Coast player Jez McLennan added 23 disposals and 10 marks and Justin Hoskin provided 23 touches and a major to pace the Bulldogs. However, it was not enough as the home side prevailed, sending the Bulldogs further into a seemingly unpreventable form slump that could end up costing them finals footy. Next week's home clash against the Eagles will be massive for standings, and could be the turning point Centrals need before their bye the week after.



Conversely, Norwood found some life to pick up their first win of 2023, taking care of South Adelaide on the road to show signs of their 2022 premiership form. Therefore, the gap between the two sides this week, although large on the ladder, may not be as wide as first thought.

The Redlegs' best is good enough to rattle Sturt for a second straight week - last year tells us that. They went at 80% disposal efficiency in last week's win, and although they had less disposals, they had more inside 50's and more scoring shots. If they can replicate that efficiency, another upset could be looming.

For Sturt, they must bounce back and take care of Norwood at home if they are to prove their start to the year was not a fluke. Last week's hiccup must be just that, and nothing more, if the Double Blues want to finish this year with the ultimate prize. They were beaten in every facet of the contest against Glenelg, especially in disposals which has normally been the Double Blues' bread and butter. Of course, no Lewis was a factor, but they need James Battersby and Patrick Wilson to step up and win the footy against Norwood's inexperienced midfield.

With top spot and confidence both lost, this seems as the perfect chance for Norwood to pull off an upset. However, I back the home side to bounce back strong and win their ninth game of the season, heading into next week's bye with some confidence back.

Glenelg to continue strong run of form.

Both teams are coming off victories in their most recent matchups two weeks ago, one much more convincing than the other. These two teams are at opposite ends of the SANFL ladder, but regardless of ladder position, this one promises to be a belter for all viewers.

West Adelaide bounced back with an impressive win against a North Adelaide team that is vying for a top 5 spot, running out eventual 29-point winners. The game started rather evenly, with both teams scoring three goals each in the first quarter after a seesawing contest to begin. It only took 26 seconds for North Adelaide to open the scoring with a goa, and it looked as if it may be an ugly afternoon for West Adelaide once Frank Szekely added a second goal just two minutes later. However, the Bloods responded with three in a row before a late goal to North saw them take a slim one-point margin into quarter time.

The second quarter was equally as even, with both sides going goal for goal to open the quarter, before two quickfire goals from West Adelaide star Dylan McCormick gave the Bloods a 10-point lead just moments before the halftime siren sounded. The third quarter began and West Adelaide came out with authority, taking the game by the scruff and kicking out to a match-winning lead by the halfway mark of the quarter. A three goal to none quarter, including two goals from star forward Samuel Frost, saw West Adelaide take a 5 goal lead into the final break, a lead that would almost be untouched for the remainder of the game. The final quarter was an arm wrestle for both teams, with West and North Adelaide both not kicking a goal for the entirety of the quarter. A stalemate quarter saw North win the quarter three behinds to two, but West Adelaide ultimately ran away 29-point winners and kept their finals hopes alive with a convincing win against a team who they will be fighting against for one of the spots in the finals race.

Thomas Morrish was a star for West Adelaide, amassing 26 disposals, 11 marks and 9 rebound 50s on his way to a best afield performance down back. Callum Park continued his impressive run of form in 2023, collecting another 28 disposals to go with a team-high 10 rebound 50s. Michael Mattingly put his defensive pressure on full display, laying a game-high 11 tackles while getting plenty of the football himself, finishing with 20 disposals and a goal. Joel Stevens also had an all-round game, starring with 26 disposals, 8 marks, 7 clearances and 7 inside 50s to help assist his side to a much-needed victory.

Glenelg recorded the first 100-point victory of the SANFL season, downing the undefeated Sturt outfit which left supporters from all corners of the state stunned. Glenelg turned it on right from the opening bounce, kicking the opening seven goals of the game before Sturt registered their first major just seconds before the quarter time siren, giving them some positive news to end the quarter. Sturt come out from the huddle at quarter time hoping that they can turn the game around and slowly get it back on their terms, working their way back into it goal by goal.

Another seven-goal quarter saw Glenelg take an emphatic 65-point lead into the main break, seemingly already putting the game to bed by the half. Although the game was done by halftime, this didn't stop Glenelg from taking the foot off the pedal after the main break. Once again, Glenelg kicked seven goals in the quarter, but could have been more as they also kicked five behinds for the quarter. Of the seven, Matthew Allen and Lachlan Hosie kicked two each to take their daily tallies to five and four respectively, while on the other end of the oval, Sturt only managed to record one scoring opportunity for the entire quarter, resulting in a goal for star forward Joshua Hone.

The final quarter was much of what we expected from the start, a low scoring, close affair between two sides who are destined to meet some point in the finals. The quarter saw both sides kick two goals, including a 6th goal from Glenelg forward Matthew Allen. Glenelg eventually running away as 105-point winners and sending the biggest of warnings to the league, asserting themselves as premiership fancies, now sitting on top of the SANFL ladder. Matthew Allen was best afield in the match, finishing with 6 goals from his 26 disposals, as well as 12 marks – also a game-high. Matthew Snook continued his stellar form this season with an all-round performance, finishing with 28 disposals, 6 marks, 6 tackles, 7 clearances and 6 inside 50s as he led from the front in the midfield for Glenelg. Luke Partington had a game-high 31 disposals to continue his strong month of football, having 30 disposals in each of his last four outings. Reid Kuller also had a strong game in the backline, finishing with 20 disposals and 8 marks, having one of his best games for the season.

Both teams will have a week to rest and recover as the 10th round of SANFL is split into two weekends, giving each team time to plan for their opposition in a season defining matchup. Glenelg look the hot favourite coming off such a strong performance against the premiership favourites, using their run and carry from their half back line to propel them into strong scoring positions. They are beginning to find form in their lesser-known players across the ground. Names like Reid Kuller are coming into some form in recent weeks, giving Glenelg another damaging player they can utilise. The forward line of Glenelg has proven its strength in recent weeks, with Liam McBean, Lachie Hosie and Matthew Allen all kicking big bags in recent weeks, striking fear into the opponents' defenders. West Adelaide have an incredibly strong backline who have proven they can hold opponents to scores below their average this season.

Names like Callum Park, Tom Morrish and Josh Ryan have all had strong seasons down back and continue to find ways to win battles against teams that they should struggle against. The debut of young gun Darcy Minchella has also given the young kid plenty of confidence, with his form building each week he plays. The goalkicking form of Samuel Frost has also been a positive for West Adelaide this season, with his form building with each week.

Overall, this game will be one that can alter the season for either team, but a lot is on the line for West Adelaide, with a loss ultimately making their finals hopes all the more difficult despite being two games out of the top five. At Hisense Stadium, West Adelaide can really challenge the ladder leaders.

Crows cause Eagles to crash back down to earth

Adelaide will be out to regain its winning ways when it clashes with an in-form Woodville West-Torrens side at Adelaide Oval on Saturday. The Crows lost a nail-biting contest against premiership fancy Glenelg last Saturday by just two points, whilst the Eagles withstood a fast-finishing Port Adelaide to steal a three point victory and their fourth win of the season. After conceding a goal inside the first minute of the game, the

Crows steadied to take a 14-point lead into quarter time in their clash against the Bays, and held scoreboard ascendency for most of the afternoon. A spirited fightback from the Bays in the third term saw them take an eight point lead to the final change, before three consecutive goals to begin the fourth quarter granted the Crows a nine point buffer. The Crows were unable to put away a dogged Bays outfit however, with Matthew Allen kicking a special match-winner from beyond the 50m arc. Despite Adelaide's scoreboard pressure throughout, Glenelg finished the game with more possession and inside 50 dominance (53-40), whilst they were also able to match it with the Crows big guns in the midfield, only losing the clearance battle by two (33-35).

The Bays not only got their hands on the football, but they also brought the tackling pressure, laying 13 more tackles than the Crows despite having more possession. Both midfields went head-to-head, as Matt Crouch led the way for the Crows with 30 disposals and eight clearances. Making his case for AFL selection was Harry Schoenberg (26 disposals, 11 tackles and two goals), starring in an almost match-winning performance, whilst Former Collingwood midfielder Tyler Brown won his share of the football with 24 disposals and a goal. Kieran Strachan dominated in the ruck with 47 hit outs and the Crows won that area by 39 hit outs overall, but were unable to convert that to clearance dominance. The Crows simply had no answer for Glenelg star Liam McBean however, who kicked five goals in a performance that would prove to be the difference in the end. Woodville West-Torrens were able to escape with what turned into an unlikely victory, despite a Port Adelaide onslaught in the last quarter at Alberton Oval.

Stretching out to a 21-point lead in the final term against an inaccurate Magpies side, the Eagles seemed to have the game in their keeping before four consecutive goals to the Magpies saw the game turned on its head. A brilliant set shot from star forward Daniel Menzel on 50m was enough to steal victory late in the fourth quarter, as the Eagles held on to their spot in the top five of the ladder. The Eagles edged the Magpies in the possession battle (316-325), almost split the clearances (34-32) and won the tackle count (66-69), but were dominated in the inside 50s (63-31), with the Magpies unable to capitalise on their repeat entries. The Eagles were never headed until late in the fourth quarter, and at three quarter-time the Magpies goalkicking woes sat at 2.10, before they found their radar in the final term. Star defender Luke Beecken worked tirelessly for the Eagles on his way to 30 disposals (23 kicks, nine rebound 50s) alongside ex-AFL midfielders Riley Knight (29 disposals, nine tackles) and Jimmy Toumpas (24 disposals). Daniel Menzel's performance up forward was just as critical, kicking three goals for the game, with his two in the last quarter enough to secure the Eagles a hard fought win.

The last time these two sides met was in round 17 last season, where the Crows walked away 40-point winners at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval. The game was an arm wrestle for the majority of the first half, before the Crows kicked away in the third quarter. Matt Crouch starred on that occasion, accumulating 42 disposals, alongside Lachlan Sholl (35 disposals) and captain Matthew Wright (31 disposals and a goal). Riley Knight was Woodville West-Torrens' best player on that day with 35 disposals.

Winning form is good form, and following three consecutive victories the Eagles will be looking to claim scalp and test themselves against a real contender, the Crows fit that mould. The Crows didn't lose any friends last week in a tough loss against a good side in a game that could have gone either way, and that form line holds them in good stead.

Expect the Eagles to be honest, but the Crows to be too strong and bounce back at Adelaide Oval.






