#### Crows to bounce back with solid win over struggling Kangaroos

The Crows were brave in their first MCG visit for the season. They took on the inform Magpies and ran them right till the final siren. It was a brave response after an indifferent first half. Captain Jordan Dawson was magnificent across all four quarters. He played a magnificent game through Adelaide's midfield in what was his 100 hundredth AFL match.

Whilst there are key moments in matches that can impact the outcome, the reality is the Crows were poor in front of goals as they headed to the main break. In a similar score scoreline to their match earlier this season, the Crows were two goals eight behinds. An accuracy percentage of 20, can have a significant impact come the end of the game. Despite the scoreline at half time. The third quarter was sublime. It was summed up perfectly with Jordan Dawson being awarded a free kick at the opening bounce, playing on and delivering a bullet like pass to hit Luke Pedlar on the chest. It was the start of a seven-goal quarter which demonstrates who well the Crows can play. For the Crows to outplay Collingwood and keep them goalless for the entire quarter, was a huge vote of confidence in Matthew Nicks, and the game plan the players are trying to executive. With a bit of luck in that last quarter, the Crows would have taken the four points, and a whole lot of confidence into the second half of the season.

Despite the loss, the Crows can take a lot out of the game and the players have demonstrated by playing attacking football, you can beat most sides. Despite the lows of losing, the positive is that the Crows are still in the eight and have a great opportunity to consolidate their position in the eight, when North Melbourne comes to town this weekend. North Melbourne's ladder position would suggest the Crows should win and win well.

North Melbourne has been playing some entertaining football and Crows shouldn't be complacent. I have no doubt the Crows leadership group will be making sure preparations are the same as last week, so the best result possible can be achieved. It is early in the week, but Nick Murray may miss the game through injury which could open up an opportunity for James Borlase to debut.

The Crows will be hoping to win their eighth game of the season, which equals their total number of wins for 2022. The Crows are on the right track, and I have no doubt the Crows will need to postpone their September holidays this year.

#### Highlight of the week:

When Walker kicked his fifth goal in the last quarter, he became the outright Coleman Medal leader with 43 goals. This is an amazing achievement for the former Captain as his form is getting better each season. The 33-year-old veteran who is out of contact at the end of this season, is challenging his team mates to continually improve. Walker's ability to still kick a goal from outside 50 meters is breathtakingly spectacular. For any young footballer who wants to have a strong goalkicking technique, simply emulate what Walker does, and you won't go wrong. The Crows have only ever had one Coleman Medalist, the great Tony Modra, who back in 1997 kicked 81 goals. 

#### **Double Blues to continue Norwoods season blues**

Norwood play Sturt on Sunday, in a match which may be surprisingly close. Despite the Double Blues dominance this season, having lost only one game, they must not underestimate their opposition as Norwood are in season best form. Although the Redlegs have won only two games this season, these wins have come in their past two rounds. In fact, since round five Norwood have not lost a

match by more than four goals. As such, Sturt will have to meticulously prepare for this match to counter the reigning premiers' chances of an upset victory.

Sturt have been near faultless this season. They sit second on the ladder (on the same number of points as Glenelg, who are first) and have developed the innate ability to win games. In their last six wins, Sturt's winning margin has been less than 22 points. This self-belief, carried out by few teams in the competition, has become a staple of successful teams in the modern era. The 2016 Bulldogs, 2023 Collingwood and now, 2023 Sturt, all have one thing in common, they know how to win important games of football. This is illustrated by the fact the Double Blues are ranked only fifth in defence and third in offence, which means while their structures are strong, it is the self-belief in players and the on-field leadership which is allowing them to win games. This is reflected through Sturt's surprisingly poor statistics, which typically gauge whether a side is successful or not. Interestingly, Sturt has won disposals and marks only once in the past five games and have won tackles, inside 50's and disposal efficiency twice in the same period. This statistical inferiority makes their winning record more impressive, as despite losing in many key areas, they are still winning games. However, one area which is arguably the greatest contributor to Sturt's win-loss record is their midfield. In the past five matches, Sturt have lost clearances only once. Through Battersby (averaging 25disposals and eight clearances), Voss (averaging 22 disposals), Wilson (averaging 21 disposals and one goal), they have looked dominant in the midfield and have generated scoring opportunities.

In contrast, Norwood are the favourite for this season's wooden spoon. Despite winning the premiership last season in fashionable style, the wheels have fallen off. In Norwood's era of success, they were the best defensive team in the competition. Until round eight this season, Norwood were ranked last in defence and offence. Fortunately, for the Norwood faithful, they have rectified this in the past two weeks as they have conceded only 16 goals and scored 20 goals themselves. This improvement has been generated by the Redleg's last month of football as they have won disposals and clearances five out of the past six weeks. Likewise, they have had a higher disposal efficiency than their opposition every game, in the past six weeks. This has meant Norwood has played an uncontested brand of football, reliant on marking and controlled play, allowing their players to effectively transition the ball. This was a characteristic of their season best form last year.

The last time these sides met, Sturt were 53-point victors. However, due to Norwood's recent resurgence and the Double Blues apparent inability to win the key statistics, this match will likely be close. **Sturt by 12-24**.

#### Eagles close the gap between fourth and fifth place

Round 11 of the SANFL season commences when Woodville West-Torrens, who are coming off of the bye, return home to play host to the Panthers, who will be looking to avoid another defeat this week. Both teams are coming off of unfortunate losses, with the Eagles, two weeks ago, losing 6.7 43 to 4.2 26 to the resurgent Central Districts, by 17 points. And South Adelaide are coming off of



another disappointing defeat, this time at the hands of the in-form Adelaide Crows, going down by 37 points, 11.12 78 to 6.5 41 at home.

The Eagles and Bulldogs game was a tough, gutsy, low-scoring affair, as the wet and windy weather became a huge factor all throughout the match. The first guarter saw only two goals kicked as both Centrals and The Eagles kicked one goal each, but the home side had the early 2 point advantage at the first break.

Then in the second quarter a further two goals were kicked for either side with the hosts once again leading at the main break, but this time by four points (3.5 to 3.1). The second half of the match was a more tougher contest with the hosts kicking 3 goals in total between the third and fourth quarters and the visitors kicking 1 goal in the second half. Central's Harry Grant looks to finish top-5 in this season's Magarey Medal voting with yet another 3vote performance, racking up 32 possessions including 11 clearances along with six tackles and kicking a goal. James Rowe (20 possessions and 15 tackles), Joseph Sinor (22 disposals, eight clearances and 14 tackles), and Adam D'Aloia (19 possessions and 13 tackles), all combined for 42 tackles in the wet.

The victory for the Bulldogs sees them currently sit in 4th position with a 5 and 5 win-loss record and will now look to pick up win number 6 when they travel to Stratarama Stadium to face top-of-the-table Glenelg Football Club, who enter this match at 9 wins and 1 loss. The defeat for the Eagles sees their record fall to 4 wins and 6 losses and are sitting 5th but only on percentage as both Port and North Adelaide are on their tails, as both have a win-loss record of 4 and 6.

South Adelaide for the 2nd time in three weeks, were unable to score early which once again cost them the game, as they were held to only 1 behind in the opening quarter against Adelaide, who in turn, managed to kick 7 goals themselves to well and truly put the game to bed as they ran away 37-point victors, winning, 11.12 78 to 6.5 41. A 68-disposal effort from both Matt Crouch (36) and Jackson Hately (32, 12 tackles and 2.2) set the tone from the first bounce as the Crows dominated, winning the Inside 50 count 57-22 and collecting 42 clearances in comparison to South's 27. Both Matthew Broadbent and Mitch O'Neil combined for 52 possessions, collecting 26 each for the hosts, and Eamon Wilkinson was the only South player to kick 2 or more goals in the game.

The defeat for South Adelaide is their seventh on the season as they now fall to 3 wins and 7 losses and are sitting equal 7th with West Adelaide, with only percentage separating them. The Crows picked up win number 7 to see them improve to 7 and 3 which has them currently sitting in 3rd, two games behind both Sturt and Glenelg, who both have 9 wins and a loss on the season. With both South Adelaide and Woodville coming off of losses, it will be anyone's game to win, but, going on form, the Eagles should win to remain inside the top five and pick up their 5th victory of the season. #### **Sturt 9.13 (67) def North Adelaide 7.9 (51)**



The Double Blues got back on track after their dismal effort against Glenelg, taking care of last year's runners up North Adelaide at home by sixteen points in the first week of the two-week round. After a slow start by both teams, alarm bells were ringing in Sturt's camp at half time after they had a scoreless second term to trail by five

A six-goal third term was the response they needed and they held on in the last to bring home the win. Sturt were able to play the uncontested game for large portions of the contest, taking 117 marks to North's 52, with only nine of them being contested. They gathered more disposals and controlled the tempo when they needed to, while the Roosters were forced to play the contested, scrappy game, laying 46 more tackles than Sturt.

In the centre and at stoppages, the contest was fairly even, with Sturt narrowly winning 35-34 in clearances, but North Adelaide winning 49-46 in inside 50's; general play was where the home side was dominant. Without Tom Lewis, the tackling expert, the Double Blues were always going to be a less physical team, but their usual major ball winners stepped up in his place, with Casey Voss (34 disposals, 8 marks, 1 goal and 5 inside 50's) and Patrick Wilson (28 disposals, 2 goals, 6 clearances and 7 inside 50's) dominating from start to finish. Sam Breuer, in his first SANFL game for the year, was lively with 19 disposals and 4 rebound 50's, and although wayward in front of goal, kicked 2.3 to pace their attack.

For the Roosters, their gun midfielders were down from their best as they were run over by Sturt's engine room. Campbell Coombe had just the 20 disposals, but did add 7 clearances, while Aaron Young could only manage just the 19 touches, but he worked hard with 10 tackles to involve himself in the contest. North Adelaide had just the one multi goalkicker, with Nigel Lockyer snagging two majors, while Sam McInerney was arguably their best, tallying 24 disposals, laying 11 tackles and kicking 1.1. Both sides got the week off the following week for their mid-year bye, giving their players time to freshen up for the back end of the season.



#### Glenelg to prevail, making it 10 in a row

With the split round behind us, the second half of the season is set to get underway this weekend, with the headline game being played down in Glenelg on Sunday afternoon. Glenelg, who are in some red-hot form entering the home stretch, host Central Districts, who have been



hit and miss over their last month, having a 2-2 record. The game shapes as one which is vital to the top five race, with some teams on the fringe starting to gain momentum, Centrals are desperate to record a win after having a week off in the split rounds. Glenelg have jumped to the lead of the premiership race after recording a dominant win over Sturt in round 8 and are looking to continue their winning streak as they eye off a remarkable 10 straight wins. This matchup has everything you are looking for in a season defining game and it is a must watch come Sunday.

Glenelg have had a magical run this season. After dropping a game in round 1, they have piled on nine straight wins to sit atop of the SANFL ladder, with their most recent win coming on the weekend against West Adelaide. It took a while for either team to record a goal, with Glenelg scoring the first goal halfway through the first term, before both sides followed with quick successive goals to keep it close entering the first break, with Glenelg leading by 9 points.

The second quarter was not at all similar to what was witnessed in the first quarter. Glenelg come out with an attitude we were used to seeing, and with that they piled on 6 goals to 1 in the second quarter, including two from Luke Reynolds who entered the main break with three goals to his name. After the avalanche was over, Glenelg entered the halftime break full of confidence with at 40-point lead and an opponent who were stranded on a score of 15 at the half.

Fans were left wondering if this could turn into another blowout for Glenelg and if so, how ugly could this get All speculation was put to rest come the third quarter, where West Adelaide kicked the opening 2 goals of the quarter, including a first league goal from Ned Stevens, before Glenelg once again wrestled momentum, kicking 2 goals of their own to take a 42-point lead into the final break. With the game more than likely out of reach, West Adelaide tried their hardest to show some fight and give their fans hope, with an opening goal from Liam Delahunty, but it was short lived. Lachlan Hosie and Liam McBean kicked goals for Glenelg to join Luke Reynolds as the multiple goalkickers for their side, while Ned Stevens doubled his career goal tally to win the quarter for West Adelaide, however Glenelg ran away eventual 37-point winners. Matthew Allen was a standout for Glenelg, finishing with 25 disposals, 8 inside 50s and a team-high 11 marks. #### Magpies beat Bloods in tense tussle

Port Adelaide and West Adelaide will look to bounce back from disappointing losses when they clash at Alberton Oval on Saturday.



With the race for the final top five spots heading up, the Magpies sit outside the five by percentage alone, whilst the Bloods need a win to thrust themselves back into finals calculations. The Magpies resume their season on Saturday following a week off due to the bye, with their last match a seven-point loss against a resurgent Norwood side in the Gallagher Williams Cup at the Parade in round 10.
