### Marion (12.4.76) defeated Mitchell Park (0.1.1)

The weather Gods turned it on for South Australian footballers this weekend as the division 6 women enjoyed a fantastic Saturday of footy in near-perfect conditions. Mitchell Park battled hopelessly against a dominant Marion unit, succumbing to a devastating 75-point loss in the first game of the round. It was a familiar story for the home side who, yet again, failed to register a single major score. With their only behind coming during the second quarter, Mitchell Park's woes going forward continue to worsen as Marion's defence remained unbothered and untouched all game. In a momentous individual performance, Paige Ridgway fully capitalised on Marion's compelling display with an exhilarating seven goals.
