

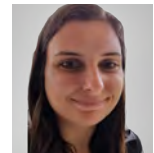

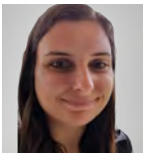

Morphettville Park v Happy Valley 11.7.73 v 3.6.24

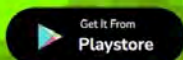
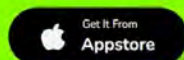

Tea Tree Gully (10.0.60) defeated Mitchell Park (0.0.0)

This weekend of footy was one of many highs and many lows for the Division 6 women. Unfortunately, the first game of the weekend was never played as Mitchell Park forfeited against Tea Tree Gully. The outcome is a sad one for the Mitchell Park women; this result sees them dangling just above Ingle Farm as their season takes a sour turn. Tea Tree Gully will be disappointed that they weren't able to build on their excellent form, however, there won't be any complaints from the squad as they now sit on top of the ladder and remain undefeated without having to get their hands dirty.

Golden Grove (6.18.54) defeated Flinders Park (0.1.1)

Golden Grove have recorded a mammoth victory for the second consecutive week as they put Flinders Park to the sword in an emphatic display. Despite their position on the ladder and their mixed start to the season, the Grove girls have now recorded more points than any other team in the competition. Following their triumph, their tally has risen to 246 points for the season which is an incredible feat for a team that has already lost three times this year and are only fourth on the table. Golden Grove's compelling victorious scorelines are a sign of their ability to grab games by the scruff of the neck and punish weaker defences. Despite their impressive display in their forward half, the home team struggled to fully capitalise and make the most of their dominance as they registered 18 behinds, including 9 in the first quarter. Lebessis is an exciting prospect coming out of Golden Grove's youth program, having played all her footy for the club, transitioning into their SANFL Juniors setup this season. Madison Koop was the contest's best performer, her first honours for 2023. Since dropping down from the Grove's division 2 team, Koop has been impressive and looked back to her best against Flinders Park. This clash has caused grave separation between the top and bottom half of the ladder. I know its very early in the year, however, I feel this win has all but sealed the fate of both Flinders Park and Golden Grove. This loss is a massive blow for the away side who will struggle to contest for a spot in finals from their current position as Golden Grove were the only touchable team inside the top four. There are plenty of positives to take away from this weekend for the home side as they set their sights on Goodwood Saints in round 7. Despite all this positivity, its hard not to be slightly pessimistic towards Golden Grove. For Athelstone, it was Taylor Granger who impressed spectators in her first game of the season as she wreaked havoc against Ingle Farm and was a driving force behind her side's success on Saturday. This is a huge achievement for Granger who hasn't played at this level since the 7th May 2022, when they faced Adelaide University over a year ago. In the last three years, she has only failed to feature in the best players on seven instances displaying how integral she'll be to Athelstone's charge for a premiership this season. Athelstone turn their attention to the biggest game of the year so far against Tea Tree Gully, in what will be a season defining clash for the competition front runners. Alternatively, Ingle Farm will be looking to salvage something from their season as they face a struggling Flinders Park.
