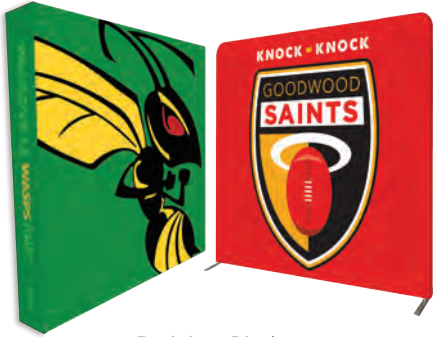

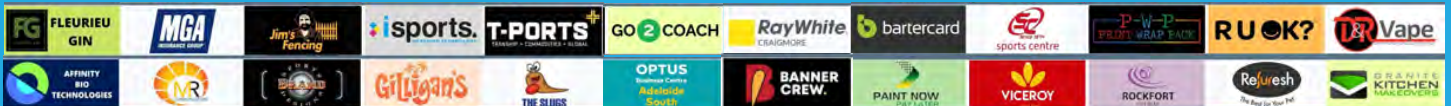

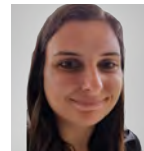

**ROUND REVIEWS**

**Old Ignatians v Henley

Henley seem to have found their feet, making it back to back wins this week after they defeated Old Ignatians by a commanding 55 points. **ROUND REVIEWS**

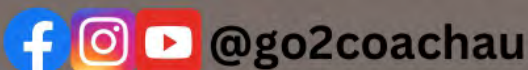

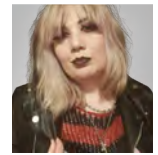

## ROUND 8 REVIEWS

### Golden Grove (3.4.22) defeated Athelstone (3.1.19)

The bye's spelt the end of the opening half of the season and a well earned rest for the division 6 women as all eight teams begin preparing their ambitions for finals. With no footy across the amateur competitions last weekend, there was certainly a void left within all of us that has thankfully now been filled. Round 8 delivered the perfect return to action with four spectacular games on a wet and dull Saturday afternoon. The first clash saw Golden Grove dethrone Athelstone in emphatic fashion, coming away winners by a mere three points. It was an incredible display of grit and determination that showcased the Grove Girls' ability to perform under pressure and deliver against a high-quality team; something that I criticised them for before the break. The lead changed three times across the contest, as Athelstone managed to come from behind to be in front during the last change. The game was closely matched, Golden Grove simply created more opportunities and were relentless going forward throughout the first half. Their early dominance was a compelling force against a backline that has consistently been resolute this season, further proving their impressive talent in attack. For Athelstone, there wasn't much else their main targets could've produced to swing the result in their favour. Natalie Lomman was as determined as always, bagging two goals in her side's defeat. An unlikely contributor, Chloe Wright was able to register her first goal of the year to round off their scoring. In such a huge game for Golden Grove, unsurprisingly, it was their usual star suspects who stood up and delivered on the big stage for them. Rhiannon Utton was fiercely competitive and executed brilliantly throughout the entirety of the contest. This best on ground performance makes it her sixth recognition of the season, a feat that is drastically impressive for someone only eight games into their footballing career. Grove's victory helps them move up to third, following Marion's loss to Tea Tree Gully. Subsequently, Athelstone fall below the Gully girls for just the second time this season, after having spent most the year as the competition's front runners.

### Tea Tree Gully (5.2.32) defeated Marion (2.4.16)

Pertaringa Oval played host to mammoth match up between Tea Tree Gully and Marion, which saw the home team come away as 16-point victors. It was a game that was decided early through sheer first quarter ascendancy as Tea Tree Gully marched into a three goal lead at quarter time. In truth, their first half performance was impeccable. Gully were able to register all their scoring efforts in the game before half time and the 26-point deficit proved to be too steep for Marion to overcome despite their late charge. Two goals from Amanda Donetzkow increased her tally to five for the season and her presence in the forward 50 over the last month has encouraged a noticeable change in her team's scoring efforts. Mackenzie Pascoe was an impressive performer for the winning side, earning a spot among the best players for just the second time in her eighty-four game career. Before this round, Georgia Sharp hadn't graced the football field for the club since their division 2 side's clash against Gaza in May. Despite this, Sharp was a standout performer for the league leaders as she hunts a return to the higher grade. For Marion, their loss sees the end of their hot run of form and a return to fourth place. By their standards, their endeavours against a challenging opposition were disappointing, especially in the opening half. They were ultimately outclassed early and that was enough to keep them out of the contest. Marion worked well throughout the closing quarter to get within a glance of Tea Tree Gully, but it was all in vain as they struggled to penetrate their opposing defence consistently. As always, Emily Pelling battled hard and was determined in the face of defeat, registering her third best player honour for the season in her seven outings thus far.
