



Along with another point for good measure they increased the lead to 70 points at the last break. Henley have made it three in a row with another strong performance, this time against Adelaide University. Henley won the game by 33 points and have put their hand up to take the last finals place. Henley led all day and kicked two goals and three points in the first quarter. Adelaide Uni were able to keep in touch though with a goal and a point of their own, making the margin only 8 points at the first break. But in the second Henley pushed ahead, and kept the Uni girls scoreless. They kicked another two goals and another point themselves and suddenly at half time the margin was a much harder 21 points.

Uni wasn't about to give up though, and fought hard in the third to try to bring the game back onto their terms. Unfortunately though they missed a few opportunities, and only kicked one goal along with two points. Henley kicked another goal of their own and with another point it meant the margin was only one point less at three quarter time at 20 points. Happy Valley will come up against Adelaide Uni, and with the win under their belt from this week the girls should be able to get on a role with another win. Payneham and SMOSH will get the first of the byes like their league sisters.
