DIVISION 1 NEW EWS AND PREVIEWS

MENS DIVISION 1 - ROUND 10 REVIEWS

Port Districts vs. Broadview

Largs reserve was treated to an absolute skill fest between the in-form Port Districts, and perpetually competitive Broadview. Both teams made the most of the glorious Saturday conditions, each team having moments of relative domination of the play. Broadview shot out of the blocks to leave the hosts a little shell shocked, taking an impressive 14 point lead into the first change, from there it was a dead heat most of the way. Port trimmed the margin to just 1 point at half time, which stayed the case at 3 quarter time. From there, the class and poise from Port Districts enabled them to pile on a 5 goal 5 quarter and run away 21 point winners. Each team kicked accurately and played exceptional football. Although a win would have been nice for Broadview, to enter hostile territory and produce a performance in the manner that they did is an enormous tick. I'd love to see them in September, and if they can string a few wins together, I am positive they will do just that.

Sacred Heart OC vs Goodwood Saints

Sacred Heart OC have chalked up a satisfying victory on the weekend to get them back on the winners list for the season. Their first half was a stark reminder of how dangerous a team they can be, keeping their opponents to a mere 1 goal at half time, compared to their 7, holding a 40 point lead a the half. From their however, one of the best quarters in Goodwood's season so far had them keeping Sacred Heart scoreless, and slamming home 4 exhilarating goals of their own to make the margin just 14 points. Unfortunately, this inspiring comeback proved to be mildly in vain, a they followed it up with a goalless quarter of their own, leading to a 32 point victory for Sacred Heart. Goodwood have again shown encouraging glimpses of football, but aren't quite yet able to string together a full game.

Brighton Bombers vs Glenunga

It was always going to be an uphill battle for the Brighton Bombers who played host to Glenunga on Saturday afternoon. The first quarter was a display of spirited, defensive minded football, with Glenunga holding a slim, 7-point lead at the first break. The Rams would continue this charge into the second quarter, but inaccurate kicking prevented them from breaking away in the contest, kicking 1 goals 5 to 1 goal 1 in the quarter. Credit to the Bombers for staying in the fight, and with the margin at 11 points at the main change, it was all to play for in the third quarter. Brighton were held scoreless in the third, Glenunga's structure behind the ball once again proving impenetrable, a large part in what's made them so successful this season. The Rams, however, once again weren't able to put the game away, leading by 21 at three quarter time. The last quarter ebbed and flowed, with Brighton kicking 3 goals to 2, but ultimately not doing enough to erase the deficit. Glenunga proved once again that they are a hard-nosed, determined team who will be difficult to beat at the back-end of the season, and the result could've been even better for them, had they kicked straighter. Ultimately, despite a resilient showing from Brighton, Glenunga came out winners by 20 points.



REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS DIVISION 1

Prince Alfred OC vs St Peter's OC

There was a sense of foreboding as St Peter's OC arrived at PAC, knowing it would take their best footy to create a contest against the top-of-the table Prince Alfred. We saw glimpses of this in the first quarter, with St Peter's creating plenty of chances, but Prince Alfred were able to grab the important moments and lead at the break 4 goals 2 to 2 goals 4. They were then able to continue building on this lead, blitzing St Peter's in a 6 goal second quarter, taking a 37 point lead into half time. In what was threatening to turn into a rout, St. Peter's came out of the huddle determined, and with a new intensity, but not capitalizing on their chances, kicking 2 goals 6 to their opponent's 4 goals 1, and trailing by 44 with a guarter left. There was a sense of finality in the result heading into the final term, which came into fruition. As Prince Alfred ran away 80 point victors. The visitors can take solace from some good patches of footy, but ultimately seemed well off the pace, now slumping to 1-8. As for PAC, their train just keeps rolling, sitting pretty at 9-1 with a healthy percentage, and looking the goods for a premiership push.

Old Ignatians vs Tea Tree Gully

After 4 consecutive losses and a lot of pain for Tea Tree Gully, it disappears for the moment as they remember what it's like to win. Their fast flowing, high octane and high scoring football style was back as they managed a fantastic 141 points including 21 goals in their return to form. 6 goals apiece for dynamite forward Peter Persinos and Luke Brown had Tea Tree gully sitting pretty early in the piece, having an already game winning margin of 38 at half time. From there, the Gullians only accelerated which saw the final score balloon out to a monumental 90 points. Again for the Old Ignatians, they have sadly seen this movie before, a positive comes in form of Will Ferrari, who moved like his namesake on Saturday and put together a very solid performance. Otherwise, they still eagerly hunt for their first on - field win.



Broadview vs Sacred Heart OC



St. Peter's OC vs Brighton Bombers



Morphettville Park v Mitcham

Morphettville Park continued their steady push for a top 5 spot with an (eventually) comfortable win against relegation candidate Mitcham ata Kellett Reserve that was in excellent condition despite the midweek rain. Kilburn vs Trinity OS







MENS DIVISION 7 - ROUND 10 REVIEWS

Mitchell Park v Ingle Farm

Ingle Farm have overcome a spirited Mitchell Park, eventually running out winners by 19 points.
