MENS DIVISION 1 - ROUND 12 REVIEWS

Old Ignatians vs Glenunga:

An intriguing round 12 pitted the convincingly bottom placed Old Ignatians against the equal most win having team in the competition. Last week's previews predicted this match would make Old Ignatians' fortnight feel even longer, unfortunately last week's previews were bang on the money. An initially valliant Old Ignatians put a decent opening term against what is a very strong Glenunga lineup. From there however, the inevitable began to take effect. Athelstone v Salisbury North

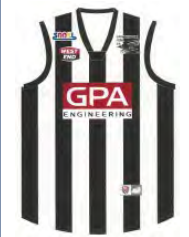
