

Crows to bomb Essendon and record first win in Melbourne this season

Only percentage separates the two sides on the ladder. The Crows need to demonstrate that they can win big games away from Adelaide Oval. North Melbourne were competitive for a half. The Crows then destroyed the Kangaroos across all major areas. Izak Rankine was excellent with a handful of goals, Darcy Fogarty and Taylor Walker were also major contributors. The game went to script as expected. The only disappointment was the concussion suffered by Jordan Butts. He will miss the trip to Marvel Stadium. This may open the door for James Borlaseto make his debut. Matthew Nicks knows his team are good enough to match it with the best side in the competition. If his team can bring a high level of intensity and play with quick ball movement, there is no reason the Crows can't win their second game of the season, away from Adelaide Oval. Crows ruck man Riley O Brien will have a huge task with Scott Draper a possibility of returning from a hip complaint. Draper is a very mobile ruck man who loves to push forward and kick a goal. It was pleasing to see O'Brien kick two goals of his own last weekend. His goal from outside fifty meters was magnificent and should give him some confidence when it comes to goal kicking. The Crows are an exciting team to watch. Given there will be no weather concerns at Marvel Stadium, expect the Crows to play on, once in possession of the ball. This promises to be a high scoring, hard running match.





Superior Sturt

Sturt will play West Adelaide this Saturday in a clash between the second (Sturt) and second to last (West Adelaide) ranked sides. Both teams have lost two of their last three games, including disappointing losses in last round. As such, a win for both these sides is crucial to both establish Sturt's position as a top two side and help West Adelaide potentially launch an unlikely finals birth.

West Adelaide have not played finals since 2015. This season seems it will not be an aberration as they sit on the same number of wins as the bottom side. In fact, the Bloods have not won more than three games in a season for five years. Their weakness lies in their defence. They are the worst defensive team in the competition. Disappointingly for Bloods fans, they were the worst defensive team in the competition last year and the year before that. Sowhen will the pain stop? Unfortunately, for West Adelaide fans it seems they will have to wait a bit longer until they have success. Despite having more marks than the opposition every game in the past three weeks and winning disposal efficiency twice in three games, the statistics are alarming. In this three-week time frame, they have lost disposals, tackles and clearances every week and inside 50's two out of the past three weeks. Further, the Bloods have not won clearances once this season, and have only had more inside 50's than their opposition twice, conceding on average the most a game. This means due to their midfield inferiority, teams have exposed West Adelaide, as the 6-6-6 rule allows forwards one-on-one opportunities. Subsequently, coach, Adam Hartlett, will have to amend this clearance battering if his side is to win this weekend.

The last time these sides met, Sturt were 4-point victors. The Double Blues will be hoping to recreate this, this weekend. However, while Sturt are second on the ladder, their last month of football has been unconvincing. They are ranked fourth in offence and third in defence. They have also lost two of their last three matches, including last week's loss to bottom of the ladder, Norwood. Interestingly, in their wins, since round six, their average win-margin is eight points. This is reflected by their statistical inferiority in the past six weeks as they have only won disposals once in the past six games and have won marks, tackles, and disposals twice in the same period. Sturt's shining light has been their midfield dominance as they rarely lose clearances with Battersby, Voss and Wilson all having commanding seasons. These key poor performance indicators, generally suggest that a side is doing poorly, therefore it is surprising the Double Blues have had the success they have had. This underlines that despite statistical inferiority, Sturt's innate ability to win key moments is allowing them to win games.

Although West Adelaide have been relatively uncompetitive this season, they pose a major threat to Sturt as they could potentially derail their season. Conversely, it is pivotal Sturt win to avoid losing to the two bottom sides in consecutive weeks and jeopardising their season. As a result, the outcome of this match is more impactful for the Double Blues, therefore I think they will overcome the Blood's in a close match. Sturt by 1-12.

ROUND 11 REVIEW



North Adelaide 10.6 (66) def Adelaide 7.15 (57)

The Crows shot themselves in the foot with their kicking at goals, as the Roosters caused an upset that could shake up the proceedings come finals' time. It was a must win game for North Adelaide, who had found themselves with just three victories from their first nine games prior to this contest, and their fourth and easily most impressive win keeps them within reach of a finals' appearance. While the Roosters tallied more disposals and had more marks, it was the Crows who won every impactful statistical category, having more hit outs, clearances and inside 50's, which led to six more scoring shots. However, Adelaide's woeful accuracy in front of goal, not too dissimilar from the senior side's biggest problem this year, cost them a much-needed win which would have kept them in contention with the top two.

The Roosters were bolstered by a huge opening term, with six different players snagging their first six goals to lead 39-9 at the first change. TariekNewchurch (3.0) led the fightback in the second quarter with two majors himself, as the Crows closed the gap to 15 at half time. Both teams scored 2.3 in the third to keep the margin the same at the final break, and the last quarter was a matter of the home side holding on while the Crows had repeat entries inside 50 and repeat scoring shots, but a 1.6 last quarter cost Adelaide the comeback win.

It was a game littered with AFL talent and experience across both sides, and the senior players stepped up when required.

Former Crow Harrison Wigg was instrumental for the home side, recording 33 disposals to go with 8 marks and 5 rebound 50's, while his running mate off half back Alex Spina was equally as integral with 29 touches, 9 marks and a game high 9 rebound 50's. Ex-Swan and Magpie Jesse White was also dominant around the ground as a ruckman and as a key ball winner, amassing 22 touches of his own to go with 12 hit outs and 7 clearances, doing it all to get his side over the line.

Senior player Matt Crouch was among the Crows' best once again, tallying 36 disposals, 6 clearances and 5 inside 50's, pushing Adelaide forward from every stoppage. Experienced trio Sam Berry (24d, 7m, 5t), Jackson Hately (1g, 24d, 8i50's) and Patrick Parnell (23d, 8m, 3r50's) assisted Crouch, but the experience mattered little to the final result as the Crows registered their third loss of the season to sit at 7-3 after ten games, two games behind second placed Sturt but two games clear of fourth placed Central District. They must get more out of out-of-form Lachlan Gollant, who could only manage the 7 disposals, and Shane McAdam, who had just the 9 touches. Both forwards have been in and out of the senior side in the last couple years but are struggling to get games of late, and their SANFL form can be a factor for that.

Roosters roll Panthers to continue finals push

South Adelaide hosts North Adelaide this Saturday at Flinders University Stadium, with both sides determined to make it back-to-back wins.

The Panthers remain just one win outside of the top five on the ladder, whilst the Roosters can claim a top five spot of their own with a victory against the Panthers. South Adelaide returns home this weekend following a successful trip to Woodville where it defeated Woodville-West Torrens by 18-points at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval on Saturday. It saw the Panthers snap an unpleasant run of form that had seen them win only one of their past eight matches. After trailing the Eagles by two-points in the nineteenth minute mark of the first quarter, a flurry of five goals saw the contest break open, with the Panthers taking a four-point lead into quarter time courtesy of a goal to small-forward Liam Fitt.

The Eagles fought back in the second quarter through goals to former Adelaide Crows forward James Rowe and Max Beattie before the Panthers piled on five unanswered goals either side of half time, stretching out the margin to a game-high 33-points late in the third quarter. A goal to forward Will Pearce gave the Eagles hope heading into three quarter time as they trimmed the margin back to 27-points, but the Panthers withstood everything the Eagles threw at them in the fourth quarter, holding the Eagles to one goal and claiminga 8.10-58 to 11.10-76 victory.

The Panthers owned the football, with a 285-339 advantage in disposals and also held a slight advantage in the clearances 33-38. The Eagles finished the game with more forward entries 40-36, but weren't able to convert them into scoring opportunities, with the Panthers finishing the game with 21 scoring shots, three more than the Eagles 18. It was impressive performance from North Adelaide last Sunday, defeating a wasteful third-placed Adelaide Crows by nine-points at Prospect Oval. The Roosters kicked away to a fast start in the opening term, with former Brisbane and Port Adelaide player Sam Mayes converting the first of four consecutive goals for the Roosters.

Crows forward Tariek Newchurch goaled to bring the margin back to 16-points in the 21st minute mark however majors to Jack McCann and Jesse White saw the Roosters take a 30-point lead into quarter time. North Adelaide was never headed from there, despite the Crows having ascendency for significant portions of the game. Midfielder Charlie Dinning kicked the only goal for the Roosters in the second quarter, whilst Newchurch continued to be a threat for the Crows up forward, kicking his second and third goals for the game as the Roosters took a 15-point lead into half time. Roosters enigma Frank Szekely goaled to push the margin out to 21-points at the beginning of the fourth quarter but it was from then on that the Crows owned the game. The Crows had the next seven scoring shots, but failed to capitalise, with Gollant's second major of the afternoon their only goal in the final quarter as the Roosters recorded a 10.6-66 to 7.15-57 win.

North Adelaide edged Adelaide in the possession battle 396-374 but lost both the clearances 28-30 and inside 50s 45-52. The Roosters had less scoring shots 16-22 but were more accurate inside forward 50, which ultimately proved to be the difference in the end.

Ex-Adelaide Crow Harrison Wigg starred for the Roosters, collecting 33 disposals alongside a strong performance from captain Alex Spina (29 disposals). Sam Mayes (27 disposals) and Harrison Magor (26 disposals) were also among the major ball-winners.

The Roosters had eight individual goalkickers from their ten goals scored, including multiple goalkickers Nigel Lockyer and Frank Szekely. The last time these two met was round eight earlier this season, where South Adelaide won by 27-points at Prospect Oval.

If the Roosters want to reach another Grand Final this season, the time to launch their season is now, and following a strong performance against the Adelaide Crows last weekend, the Roosters will be too strong for the Panthers on Saturday.
