

Crows bounce back to slay the Giants

I feel like we have seen this movie before when the Crows took on Essendon last Sunday. It was a tough watch. The Crows were behind on the scoreboard from the opening 15 seconds after a Rory Laird throw, saw a free kick given to Zach Merrett, who handballed of to Mason Redman.

Redman lined up goal from outside the arc of 50. It was the first of seven first quarter goals for Essendon. The Bombers had three majors on the board before Ben Keys registered the first major for Adelaide. The Crows struggled to stop Essendon's run and carry through the midfield. It was a pleasure to watch the midfield transitioned the ball from the back half, to their forward fifty. It was high quality transition football, and the Bombers were able to execute it perfectly under the roof at Marvel Stadium.

The Crows were never really in the game and despite the final clearance numbers, they struggled in the first quarter to win the ball from the midfield. The Crows were again outclassed away from Adelaide Oval, an area that Matthew Nicks need to address with important away games coming up over the next seven weeks that will dictate how the Crows finish the season. Centre Clearance work in the first half was a major concern. Even though Scott Draper didn't suit up for the Bombers, Phillips, Parish and Merrett were simply outstanding. The Crows will need to move on quickly as the Giants come to town on Saturday and they to have an excellent midfield and are coming of consecutive wins.

In recent times, the Crows have struggled against the Giants and certainly owe them one, particularly after round one this season. It was a game the Crows were dominating and poor kicking in warm conditions, allowed the Giants to bank the four points. All games at the back end of the season are important, however with the inconsistent form of the Crows, they do need to win, otherwise, making finals becomes even harder. With the Crows also relying on other match results to go their way, a win could see them return to the top eight by the end of the round. The season is at a point where you want to be in control of your season, the only way to do that is to keep winning.

This week's fixture is also a celebratory one. Former Crows captain Rory Sloan will suit up for game 250. This is a wonderful achievement for Sloane. He was pick 44 back in 2008. The 18-point loss sees the Crows fall outside the top 8 and have a real battle to win enough games to qualify for September action.

Taylor Walker kicked two goals in the loss to the Bombers, and he is now joined in the lead for the Coleman Medal with Charlie Curnow. Both players have 48 goals so far this season. The Crows loss was disappointing; however, I am on Walker watch. Every shot for goal that Walker has, will be cheered loudly as it would be a great achievement if Walker can win the Coleman Medal at age 33.

Just a thought, is he the best forward currently in the game? Statistics suggest he is. Can he win his first All Australian jumper? Time will tell, let's all embrace Walker watch. He is turning back time.

The Eagles will play Norwood in arguably their worst form of the season. In the past month, Woodville has lost three of their last four matches. As such, they have slipped to the sixth best offensive team in the competition and fourth best defensive team. Their sub-par scoring demonstrates this, as they have not kicked more than eight goalsin the past three weeks. This is largely because the Eagles have not been able to generate enough inside 50's, due to their midfield inferiority. In the past month, the Eagles have not won clearances and have won inside 50's only once. In fact, in the last month, the Eagles have produced numbers ABC reporter Alan Kohler would screw his nose up at. Woodvillehave won disposals, efficiency and marks only once in this period. This has limited their effectiveness in front of goal as their lack of possession coupled with their inefficiency has made scoring challenging. This is concerning for coach, Jade Sheedy, as their efficiency and scoring were key staples of their success in 2021.

The last time these sides met was in round one, where Norwood were comfortably defeated by 46-points on home soil. Interestingly, the Eagles have beaten Norwood in six of their last eight clashes. The Redlegs will look to rectify these matches, and specifically their last outing, where they were beaten in all key areas (clearances, inside 50s, disposals, tackles and marks). Fortunately for the Norwood faithful, they will come into this match quietly confident. Despite a horror start to the season, riddled with injury, poor match-play and disappointment, the Redlegs are back! They have won three of their last four matches. This revival has been sparked by their ability to effectively transition the ball from rebound 50's, as well as their cleanliness in congestion as they have been more efficient than their opposition every week for the past five weeks. Likewise, they have been more competitive in disposals, marks, tackles and clearances than what they were at the start of the season. The main contributors to this being Boyd, Nunn and Rokahr who are all finding season best form.

While both sides have been satisfactory this season, only oneclub (Woodville West-Torrens), stands a chance to make finals. Ironically, however; it is Norwood, who have very little to gain this season, who are in the best form. As such, I think the Redlegs will produce an upset. Norwood by 24-36.

A five-goal to two final term was enough for ladder-leaders, Glenelg to improve their streak to 11, as they ran away 30-point winners against Norwood at The Parade at the weekend, triumphing

13.9 87 to 7.15 57 in wet and windy conditions. Norwood, who prior to this game, had been riding a three-match win streak, were able to stick with the Bays' for 85% of the contest, getting within a goal, early into the final quarter, thanks to Declan Hamilton, who kicked his 2nd in the opening minute of the fourth, from there, a few costly turnovers from the hosts gave the visitors an opportunity to run away with the game, as they would end up kicking 5 of the last 7 goals to remain 1 game clear on top of the ladder.

Three-time Ken Farmer Medallist, Liam McBean booted 6 goals, with three of them coming in the last guarter, to go with 21 disposals and six marks in what was just a fantastic all-round performance. Matthew Allen (28 disposals, 11 marks, and 1 goal), and Corey Lyons (28 disposals, 12 tackles and a goal) were influential throughout the duration of the contest for the visitors, as was Brett Turner, who kicked 2.1 and collected 25 possessions. Norwood's usual suspects of Nik Rokahr (27 disposals, six tackles and six clearances), Declan Hamilton (24 disposals and 2 goals) and intercept defender Pierce Seymour (20 disposals, and five marks) fought hard all day. With the loss, the Redlegs fall to 3 and 9, as they look ahead to a tough test against a struggling Woodville West-Torrens outfit next weekend at Maughan Thiem Kia Oval.

Adelaide responded to its surprisingly lack-lustre performance versus North Adelaide in Round 11, in a big way, thumping Central Districts, 15.14 104 to 5.6 36, by 68-points at Nuriootpa Oval in the Barossa at the weekend. Sam Berry (31 and a goal) and Matt Crouch (31 and 8 tackles), combined for 62 possessions as the Crows recorded their 8th victory of the season. Three goals from Shane McAdam and two each from Lachlan Gollant and TariekNewchurch were no match for the sixth-placed Bulldogs as Adelaide proved way too strong up in the Valley. Current AFL-listed player, Jackson Hately was enormous, racking up 23 possessions including a gamehigh 13 tackles and a game-high 10 clearances. Chris Olsson was the only multiple goal-kicker for Central with 2.0 from his 7 disposals. Jez McLennan (22 disposals and five marks) and Harry Grant (18 and 9 tackles) were the two highest possession-getters for the visitors, who now fall out of the top five with a 5 and 7 win loss record.

The Crows will now look to end Glenelg's 11-game win streak when the two clubs go head-to-head, in Round 13 at Glenelg Oval. Last time these two sides, about 5 weeks ago in Round 8, the Bay's came-from-behind to win by 2 points, in a game where Liam McBean and Luke Reynolds combined for 7 goals and Lachlan Gollant booted four majors.

This game could be anyone's to win. The Bays' are the most inform team of the competition, and rightfully so, but the Crows are just as dangerous when firing on all cylinders. This is set to be an exciting mouth-watering, highscoring contest.

Central District 5.6 (36) def by Adelaide 15.14 (104)



It was a bloodbath on Saturday in the country, as Adelaide controlled the game from start to finish en route to a thumping 68-point win over finals aspirants Centrals. While the margin was still gettable at quarter time (11 points), the Bulldogs didn't capitalize on the slim opportunity and were rolled over after the first change, giving up 12 goals over the next three quarters while registering just the 4 themselves. The Crows went on several unanswered runs, including a seven-goal streak across the third and fourth quarters, only ending when Centrals kicked the final two goals of the game, avoiding a sub-30 scoreline.

The game was won in many facets for Adelaide, but it started at the contest, with Kieran Strachan (40 hitouts) and Elliott Himmelberg (18 hitouts) dominating the Bulldogs's tall order, giving the league-best midfield crop even without in-form Harry Schoenberg who was in Melbourne as the substitute for the senior side – first access to the footy, something you cannot allow. Matt Crouch (31 disposals, 8 tackles, 5 clearances) was at his ballwinning best, Sam Berry (31 disposals, 1 goal, 7 inside 50's) continued his strong form, and ex-Collingwood player Tyler Brown (29 disposals, 1 goal, 5 clearances) added his presence to the Crows midfield. But perhaps the most damaging coming out of the stoppage was Jackson Hately, who recorded 10 clearances (game-high) and 6 clearances, willing Adelaide forward on all fronts. Between Strachan and Himmelberg, and the midfield quartet, the Bulldogs were no match for Adelaide's engine room at Nuriootpa. Once forward, the goals were shared amongst the group, but Shane McAdam (3.1) was the pick of the bunch.

For Centrals, there wasn't much positives to take out of this game, as they were comprehensively beaten. Chris Olsson was their only dual goal-kicker with 2, while ex-Sun Jez McLennan (22 disposals) tallied the most disposals for the losing side. They mustered just 34 inside 50's to Adelaide's 50, and just 31 clearances as they could not get their hands on the footy. Harry Grant (18 disposals, 9 tackles, 5 clearances) tried his best, while Billy lles (7 rebound 50's) and Isaiah Dudley (6 rebound 50's) continuously sent the ball back out of Centrals' defensive 50, but with the firepower within the Crows' crop, the ball would just find its way back in, with repeat entries a growing issue throughout the game for the Bulldogs.

The win was needed for the Crows to stay in touch with the top two, Glenelg and Sturt, and the margin worked wonders for their percentage. Contrastingly, the Bulldogs are narrowly holding onto the final spot in the top five, but with North Adelaide finding form and tying their win-loss record (5-6), Centrals cannot afford any more big losses, as they only sit 0.29% ahead of the Roosters for that fifth spot. Games this week could be pivotal for shaping the finals' teams.

Port Adelaide V North Adelaide



The occasion does not get any bigger than what lies ahead of the two sides competing at the prestigious Alberton Oval this Saturday. The Magpies, sitting fourth, host the Roosters, sitting sixth, with just percentage separating the two side at 5-6 records respectively. The form lines for both sides look identical as well, with Port registering back-to-back wins in the last fortnight against the Eagles and the Bloods, while North have also enjoyed consecutive victories in the same period, upsetting Adelaide and downing South in a low-scoring affair last week.

The Magpies' side has been inconsistent in its line-ups for most of the year, with call-ups from the reserves to the senior side almost every week tearing apart any continuity the group may have started to build. Still, the talent in their side alone has carried them to fourth position, and a chance to break away from the Roosters and potentially the Bulldogs – with a big win at home this week.

With Trent McKenzie going down for the Power on the weekend, a vacancy in defence has opened up, so there will be several players putting their hand up to replace 'Cannon' in the senior side this week. Forgotten former Power mainstay Xavier Duursma would not be too far off a recall, but to match position needs, it appears likely they will regain their skipper Tom Jonas as a like-for-like replacement ahead of their match with Carlton. This means the Magpies will be without serious experience down back against a building Roosters' side littered with talent. They will need key performances from their best players - Trent Dumont, Jase Burgoyne, Duursma and Josh Sinn – as they will have their work cut out for them with North Adelaide's squad.

Dante Visentini should have a field day in the ruck department, as the Roosters' ruck tandem of Jesse White and Mitchell Harvey were destroyed by South's Keegan Brooksby last week, and although it didn't impact the result, against a better side like Port Adelaide with better ball users at Visentini's disposal it might cost North Adelaide a key victory.

For the Roosters, their clearance game has been a weapon of theirs for a couple years now, with Campbell Coombe, Sam Mayes and Aaron Young usually among the top of the list for that stat, with the latter two up against their former side. While they won last week, a scoreline of 6.9 isn't overly appetising, albeit the poor weather, so their attack must create multiple scoring opportunities to overwhelm the potentially undermanned Port Adelaide defence this weekend.

It should be a cracking contest, one that could decide proceedings for September action in 2023. After poor starts to the year for both clubs, recent success has them watering at the mouth at the potential of finals' footy, and a win this week would be integral to not only their own chances but knocking back the chances of their opponent. Lots to play for at South Australia's home of footy this Saturday - you do not want to miss it!

The game was one that was expected to be close and hard fought all day, with the chance for either side to really cement themselves in the finals race one that wasn't an opportunity to be missed. However, a 68-point defeat to Adelaide put the Bulldogs outside the top five and at risk of missing the finals all together, making this weekend one that can have major repercussions on the finals race. The game began strongly for Adelaide, kicking three of the four goals in the opening quarter. Centrals player Aiden Grace was left ruing his missed opportunities after missing two shots in as many minutes, leaving Adelaide to take a handy 11-point lead into the first break. Adelaide continued to control the game and carried the momentum from the first quarter into the second, kicking the opening three goals of the term to jump out to a 32-point lead before the halfway mark of the second term. A goal from Kyle Presbury gave Centrals a slimmer of hope, however Adelaide kicked the final two goals of the quarter to skip out to a 39-point lead at the half. The third term saw Central District come out with a heightened intensity and aggression, vying to fight their way back into the contest. They kicked the first goal through Marcus Barreau, giving the Bulldogs players and fans hope that they could salvage something from this game. Unfortunately, their run soon came to a holt with Adelaide scoring three quick goals in the quarter to again blow the lead beyond reachable for Centrals, giving them a comfortable lead of 52 points at the final change of ends. The last quarter followed the same script in which we had seen all day, with Adelaide winning the fourth quarter, taking a clean sweep for the day. It was beginning to look like it could turn even uglier early, with Shane McAdam kicking his third goal in the opening minute, before the Crows added three more goals to extend the lead to 78 points halfway through the term. Centrals wrestled back momentum and added two quick goals, marking their only multiple goal quarter for the day, leaving the final margin at 68 points. Chris Olsson was the only multiple goal scorer for Central Districts, finishing with 2 goals from his 7 disposals. Jez McLennan was a shining light in the midfield on what was a rather dark day for the Bulldogs, amassing a team-high 22 disposals, along with 5 marks and 4 tackles. Billy McCormack tried his best in the ruck all day, finishing with 12 disposals and 25 hit outs for his side. Harry Grant had 5 clearances from his 18 disposals, as well as laying a team-high 9 tackles. Aiden Grace had 6 disposals, as well as taking 5 marks and laying 5 tackles.

West Adelaide had a much closer match last weekend. They hosted an in-form Sturt outfit, who are currently second on the ladder, and only went down by a straight kick. West Adelaide began the game as best they could, kicking the opening goal from the first scoring opportunity for the game. Sturt ended the quarter with a much-neededgoal to steady their ship, however for most of the quarter the game was rather close and both sides worked extra hard on the defensive end. After a tough opening term, West Adelaide took a marginal 2-point lead into the first break. The second quarter saw a response from Sturt, who controlled the ball for the opening 10 minutes however couldn't capitalise on the scoreboard, only managing two behinds to leave scores tied early in the term.

Unfortunately, two consecutive goals against the flow of play to West Adelaide saw them extend their quarter time lead to 12 points, before another red time goal to Sturt saw them cut the deficit to 8 points at the half. Sturt supporters were pleased with their sides effort in the second term and

felt that they had the momentum heading into the break, they were expecting somewhat of a similar response come the third quarter. It began to look like West Adelaide would potentially wrestle momentum and turn the game on its head scoring the first two behinds in the opening minute. Sturt then went down the other end and scored the most crucial of goals, cutting the margin to 4 points early in the third term. The ball stayed mainly between the two arches for the better part of 15 minutes, before third gamer Sam Breuer kickstarted back-toback Sturt goals to give life to the double blues to end the term, capping off a 3 goal to 0 term, turning an 8-point deficit into a 9-point lead at the final break. The final term was poised to be a nailbiter, in which it didn't fall short by any means. Sturt looked to extend their lead early in the term however only managed a solitary point early before an energy lifting goal saw West Adelaide cut the margin to 4 points at the 9-minute mark of the final term. The rest of the game was as tense as you will ever see, however Sturt would do just enough to hold off West Adelaide in a game that had the potential to derail both teams' seasons, escaping as 6-point winners. Kobe Ryan continued his strong run of form in recent matches, collecting a team-high 26 disposals, 4 marks and laying a game-high 11 tackles on route to his best afield performance. Mitchell Maguire had a strong performance in defence, finishing with 23 disposals, 6 marks, 8 tackles and 6 inside 50s off half-back. Tom Morrish also continued his strong season, having 21 disposals, 6 marks and 7 rebound 50s. Jye Sinderberry had the best outing of his young career, having 17 disposals, 6 marks and kicking his first league goal. Josh Ryan finished with 18 disposals and a game-high 13 marks.

Both sides have the potential to take this game by the scruff of the neck and gain some much-needed percentage in the leadup into finals. Kobe Ryan has been in scintillating form as of recent, averaging 25 disposals and 10 tackles in his last 4 games, up from his season averages of 22 and 6 respectively. West Adelaide have made some adjustments recently and while they haven't recorded wins, it is evident that they have been more competitive in their matches against quality opposition. Centrals themselves are on a two-game losing streak, however, weren't competitive in either game against quality opposition, losing by 63 and 68 respectively, letting off warning signs for their team as a whole. It seems as if they have hit a rough patch late in the season and need to readjust quickly if they want to have any hope of featuring in the finals. West look like the more in-form side and can use this game to steady their ship for the run home, while capitalising on a struggling Bulldogs outift.

Sturt sends Panthers finals hopes South

Sturt takes on South Adelaide at Wigan Oval on Sunday as it looks to remain within touching distance of top of the table Glenelg. The Double Blues enter Round 13 following a scrappy sixpoint victory over West Adelaide in trying conditions last Saturday, whilst the Panthers will be out



to rectify a loss that saw them waste opportunities against North Adelaide last weekend. It wasn't convincing the Double Blues got the job done against the Bloods at Hisense Stadium to run out 4.8-32 to 5.8-38 winners.

After the Bloods kicked the opening goal of the game through Jye Sinderberry, the Double Blues didn't hit the scoreboard until the 21st minute of the first term, when Oliver Grivell converted in the shadows of quarter time. Trailing by two-points at quarter time, the game was tied up midway through the second quarter before the Bloods kicked back-to-back goals courtesy of Joel Stevens and Isaac Johnson, handing them a 13-point lead.

Sturt's Lachlan Burrows would kick the first of his two majors as the game approached half time, with West Adelaide leading by 8-points at the main break. The third quarter would then see Sturt take the ascendency, kicking three unanswered goals to hold a nine-point buffer at three guarter time. West Adelaide's Liam Delahunty kicked the only goal of the last term as the game went down to the wire but it was Sturt who held on for its 10th victory of the season. Sturt won the disposal count 309-327 and its ability to dominate the clearances 24-44 was key in generating more inside 50s than West Adelaide, winning that category 33-43. Sturt midfield star James Battersby was crucial in the win, collecting 33 disposals and nine tackles.

Former Port Adelaide player Manguru Frederick had 24 disposals along with Tom Lewis who amassed 23 disposals and 10 tackles. Amos Doyle (36 hit outs and eight clearances) and Josh Rentsch (29 hit outs) dominated for the Double Blues in the ruck, and were key to their advantage around the stoppages. South Adelaide's loss against North Adelaide ensured that every game becomes crucial from here if the Panthers want to feature in finals. It was a frustrating day for the Panthers, kicking 3.12 from their scoring opportunities in the 3.12-30 to 6.9-45 loss. Both sides had their opportunities in the first guarter but it was the Roosters that took a five-point lead into quarter time thanks to a goal from Jake Patmore.

A goalless second quarter saw both teams exchange missed chances, only managing three behinds each as North Adelaide maintained its five-point lead into the main break.

Goals to Jack McCann, Sam Mayes and Aaron Young in quick succession gave the Roosters an almost match-winning lead of 16-points in the conditions, and two more missed chances by the Panthers ensured they trailed by 15-points at three quarter time. Ben Shillabeer kicked his second goal of the afternoon to provide the Panthers with the required spark early in the penultimate quarter, but Dyson Hilder hit back minutes later to quash any hopes of a South Adelaide revival.

The Roosters maintained possession (311-343) and brought their pressure game, winning the tackle count 71-100. Incredibly the Panthers finished the game with eight more inside 50s (43-35) than the Roosters, but couldn't convert on the scoreboard.

Keegan Brooksby (47 hit outs) and Ben Shillabeer (two goals) were also among South's better players.

These two sides last met in Round 7 at Flinders University Stadium and it was a nail-biter, with Sturt holding on to win by two-points. South Adelaide needs to start winning consistently if it wants to remain in the finals hunt, whilst Sturt will be looking to get back to earlier season form that saw them win eight games in-a-row. The Double Blues will be too strong for the Panthers at home on Sunday.
