





#### **SAWFL DIVISION 1 - ROUND 9**

## Henley v Morphettville Park 7.14.56 v 1.5.11

In a big upset Henley have put the competition on notice after a huge 45 point win over Morphettville Park. Only a week after their biggest victory yet this season they have been defeated for the second time in a month while Henley are now on a four game winning streak.

Right from the start Henley put their stamp on this game with a two goal and two point opening quarter. They also kept the usually fast starting Morphettville to only two points and held a 12 point lead at the first break. It was more Henley dominance in the second as they added on another two goals and three more points, while holding Morphettville to one lone point. At half time the lead was already over four goals at 26 points.

For Morphettville it was Nicolette Dunn, Ella Longbottom, Natasha Christophers, Grace Smallacombe, and Tess Maple who all tried hard. Stephanie Simmonds kicked the lone goal.

## Broadview v Old Ignatians 9.10.64 v 1.0.6

Broadview are building nicely towards finals with a big win over Old Ignatians by 58 points. Broadview had an opportunity to get a break from Payneham while on the bye and they seized it with both hands.

Broadview kept the Ignatians scoreless until the final term while continuing to pile on the scores throughout the game themselves. They kicked an incredible four goals in the first quarter with only one miss to get the lead out to 25 points quickly. #### WOMEN'S DIVISION 1 - ROUND 10 PREVIEW

Round 10 for Division 1 will be split across two weekends, with four teams having a bye on the second weekend. On July 8th all eight teams will play, starting with Morphettville Park playing Old Ignatians in what should unfortunately be another big loss for the Ignatians. The Roos will be wanting to bounce back quickly after their loss to Henley, and should repeat their round two performance with another 20-40 point win. Adelaide University will play Payneham who are coming off the bye and will have been stewing for two weeks after their loss to Broadview. Adelaide Uni have had glimpses of great performances, but this should be a big win to Payneham by 30-50 points. SMOSH West Lakes will also be back off the bye and will come up against this week's big winners, Henley. The last time the two sides met it was a solid win for SMOSH, but Henley have come a long way since then and will be favourites this time although the margin is likely to be low at 10-25 points. #### WOMEN'S D1 RESERVES - ROUND 10 PREVIEW

In the reserves Broadview had a massive win over the Old Ignatians. They kept the Ignatians completely scoreless while taking the victory just shy of triple digits at 98 points. Morphettville Park was also convincing over Henley, taking advantage of Payneham's bye to draw level with them on points. The Vikings beat Adelaide University by 33 points and now sit a game clear in fourth.

Happy Valley and Broadview will be an interesting game, but Broadview should get the win convincingly. Adelaide University will play Payneham NU coming back off the bye, and the Falcons are expected to pick up right where they left off and get a big win. SMOSH will also be back off the bye to play Henley in a crucial match, and will be slight favourites. Then in the second weekend Payneham will play Morphettville while Happy Valley will play SMOSH, giving Henley, Adelaide Uni, Broadview, and Old Ignatians a week off.


# Tea Tree Gully (5.10.40) defeated Ingle Farm (0.0.0)
