

SMOSH West Lakes v Adelaide University 4.11.35 v 2.6.18

SMOSH were able to find some of their old fire power this week as they were able to take down Adelaide University by 17 points. They were inaccurate in front of goal but the onslaught was more than enough to break their 5 game losing streak. The first quarter started as a modest affair with both sides kicking a goal to open their accounts. With SMOSH kicking one behind and Adelaide Uni kicking two the margin was only one point in favour of Uni when the first break came. But in the second something finally clicked for SMOSH and they took hold of the game. They had an amazing 9 scoring shots for the quarter, but unfortunately only two went through for goals. But the offensive pressure meant that Uni were unable to score at all and the margin leapt out to 18 points at half time.







For the entire season, if you're an Athelstone midfielder breaking through the lines and looking for an option in the forward half, Lomman is undoubtedly the preferred target. Her dominance and feared presence in the offensive 50 have been enough for her teammate Kayla Lambert to fly under the radar as one of the competition's best quiet achievers. In a renewed attacking role, Lambert has scored eight majors thus far this season and her current goal-a-game ratio is her best return since she played for Salisbury in 2015. Samantha Newman was also on-song this weekend, with her goal the cherry-on-top of a fantastic individual display. Newman has played every game since joining Athelstone in round 8, featuring among the best players in four out of five games. Having spent the previous few years plying her trade for competition rivals Tea Tree Gully, this refreshing restart and change of scenary has welcomed a timely patch of careerbest form, cementing her position in their best squad before finals.

For Marion, there were almost no positives to take away from the contest and with nothing to hang their hat on, I'm sure they have already turned their attention to round 13. Jasmin Fettke may consider herself an 'Athelstone specialist,' picking up her second best on ground recognition for the season and her first since the two team's last met in round 6. 
