Crows to make finals march



What a performance from the Crows last Saturday night. Showdown 54 was always going to have a say in how both Adelaide teams would launch into the final four rounds of the season.

For the Crows, it was four excellent quarters and confirmed despite key players missing form the match, the Crows have the talent and are good enough to mix it with the better sides. I can't ever remember a season where the Crows have beaten the second placed side twice, lost to the top side twice by a combined margin of 3 points, and lost to the fourth placed Demons by four points. Add those three losses to their current nine victories, the Crows are sitting pretty in fifth spot, and knocking on the door of a double chance.

You can't rewrite history, but what you can do is learn from it, and develop strategies to ensure winning close games becomes a habit. Taylor Walker was excellent and continues to push Charlie Curnow in the race for the Coleman medal. The skipper Jordan Dawson was magnificent, and Matt Crouch was very effective at stoppage. Wayne Milera from half back was impactful and his ability to hit that last target when the Crows were entering inside 50 was first class and a testament to his hard work, to get back to playing the footy, all Crows supporters know he can play.

Mark Keane debuted for the Crows in the Showdown. (Had played 5 games for Collingwood previously) He was an inclusion for Nick Murray. He did a superb defensive job on Charlie Dixon who had very little impact on the game. Keane is a very agile defender, who in time, will be a great addition to the Crows backline and provide ongoing run from the back line.







Tumultuous Tigers to finish on top

North Adelaide will play top of the ladder Glenelg this week, in a clash crucial in determining the top five. Both sides are in the top five and have been impressive this season. In fact, both sides have arguably been the most dominant teams in the



competition in the past 5 seasons. As such, this game will likely be no aberration as the Roosters are fighting to secure their finals position, while the Tigers will attempt to establish a home final and double chance.

Glenelg have been near perfect this season. They are ranked second in offence, and more importantly, first in defence. If all the other teams this season are like a 2001 ford laser, Glenelg have been like a Ferrari. Explosive. Structurally sound. And unbeatable; the Tigers have been unbelievable. So good, they have only lost two matches this season. Like a Ferrari they have been mechanical in the way they have overcome teams, through winning key areas. In the past six weeks, Glenelg has lost disposals, marks, contested marks, tackles, clearances and inside 50's only once.

Arguably, the number of tackles the Tigers have laid is the most impressive of these stats. Despite having more possession than the opposition most weeks, their pressure is relentless. In their victory against West Adelaide, over half the team laid six or more tackles. This is nearly double the AFL average (3.2 tackles per person).

Further, this pressure has made them a difficult side to score against, hence their defensive ranking. In combination with this, the Tiger's ability to control the play through their marking has made them a threatening side when transferring the ball forward. Through their tall targets of Reynolds, Hosie and McBean, Glenelg has scored fluently in the past month. Therefore, if the Rooster's are to upset Glenelg, they will not only have to match their elite pressure but also counter the Tiger's premier forward line.

Four on the trot for the Mighty Magpies



The Magpies are getting hot, winning their fourth match in succession and fifth from their last six outings, with an impressive 19-point victory over early pacesetter Sturt at Alberton Oval on Sunday afternoon, grinding out a 10.13 73 to 7.12 54 win.

After a very even opening term which saw both sides kick two goals each, Port Adelaide booted a further three goals in the second quarter to take a very slim 3-point advantage into the main break, that lead would then extend out to 14 points at the final change thanks to goals from Quinton Narkle and Tom Scully, with the formers coming at the 18-minute mark of that quarter, which was Port's first goal since the 25-minute mark of the second quarter. Riley Bonner was extremely important in the middle of the ground, as he racked up 22 disposals including a game-high 10 marks for the Magpies. Ollie Lord (2 goals from 7 disposals), Tom Scully (2 goals from 8 disposals), Cody Szust (2 goals from 7 disposals), and Nick Moore (2 goals from 11 disposals, and nine tackles) combined for eight of Port Adelaide's ten goals, as they now improve to 8 and 6 and sit in fourth place, two games outside of the top-three.

Sturt were well-led by the usual suspects of Tom Lewis (26 possessions, 13 tackles and six clearances) and Casey Voss (27 possessions, seven marks), as well as two goals each from Joshua Hone and Chad Reschke. After kicking 17 goals across three quarters in Round 13 versus South Adelaide, to only manage 7 throughout the entirety of this match, must be a little bit disappointing for coach Marty Mattner, who's team, despite the defeat, is still sitting in 2nd place with an 11 and 3 winloss record. With both Woodville and Sturt coming off of disappointing defeats last time out, they will be equally looking to prove a point as the Hostplus SANFL season reaches the pointy end, and with five games remaining, each one is just as important as the other. The Double Blues can all but certainly lock up the top-two with a victory over the Eagles when the two teams meet at Wigan Oval next weekend. This is a must-win for both sides and could go either way, but with Sturt returning home, they will prove too strong in this one.

The Eagles on the other hand, can improve to 6-9, keeping their slim finals hopes alive, and, assuming results go their way, could sneak into the top-five if they are to cause an upset on the road.



A fast start secured a much-needed win for the Bulldogs on Saturday, as the wet conditions played a massive part in the 25-point win. Due to other results, Centrals still

find themselves just percentage outside the five, but are in a good position heading into the final few weeks of the home-and-away season, while the Panthers probably ended their finals hopes with the loss on the weekend.

The Bulldogs shot out to a four-goal lead by quarter time, with goals by Lewis Cowham, Luca Whitelum and Beau Thomas within the first ten minutes setting the tone for the contest. Another goal to Whitelum at the 16-minute mark meant a 25-2 start, threatening to put South away early. A Keegan Brooksby goal stopped the rout, and three unanswered goals in the second term brought the margin back to seven points by half time. Unfortunately, Bryce Gibbs' goal to end the second quarter was the last goal the Panthers would kick for the game, as they managed just five behinds in the second half as the weather got worse. Whitelum's two first quarter goals meant he was the sole multi-goalkicker for the contest.

South Adelaide won most counting stats, from disposals (302-255) to marks (94-85), and even held their own at stoppages, doubling Centrals' hitout count and recording five more clearances. But the 47-35 inside 50 win for the Bulldogs was the telling stat, as the ball was just around Centrals' goal more than South Adelaide. For large portions of the contest, however, the game felt neutral, with the Panthers on top at several stages around the ground, but Centrals' opening term proved too much of a mountain for the Panthers to climb.

For the Bulldogs, Billy Iles led the disposals with 20, with all of them being kicks, to go with 8 marks, 3 inside 50's and 6 rebound 50's as he sent Centrals forward out of half back. Harry Grant was also influential, and although he didn't win loads of the footy (19 disposals), he pressured hard (11 tackles) and won the ball out of the stoppage (6 clearances) on several occasions. Jarrod Schiller also had one of his more impactful games for the club, adding 6 clearances and 6 inside 50's to give his forwards plenty of opportunity.

Veteran Gibbs was also among the best with 21 disposals and a goal but couldn't carry his side to a win. The Panthers host the Bloods in a match that will mean little for the upper echelon of the ladder, but lots for the participating clubs. A little bit of confidence and positivity is all both clubs desire after disappointing 2023 campaigns for the respective sides see them outside the top five, and with little hope of getting back in, with four games remaining.

South Adelaide battled hard for large portions of the contest against Central District last week, but were faulted by a poor start and a goalless second half, costing them a vital upset win. West Adelaide were surprisingly competitive against the ladder leading Tigers, leading for three quarters and holding Glenelg to just one major in the first half, before ultimately running out of gas as the premiership hopefuls showed why they should be where they are in the fourth. The game may come down to who wants it more, as cliché as it sounds, and while the skill level may not be at the level of the top clubs, the pressure will be high.

This game could go either way based on recent results, with just one win separating the two sides on the season. Looking ahead to 2024, some wins to end this season could do wonders to the morale of each side, and this matchup is a perfect way to start.

The rapid pace soon saw holes from in the defence of Norwood, who let one slip through and saw North Adelaide kick the opening goal of the game. North Adelaide then doubled their goal tally minutes before the quarter time siren, taking their lead to 11 points at the first change of ends.

The start of the second quarter was again a stalemate, with no side scoring for 8 minutes before two quickfire Norwood goals proved that there was a scoring end on the day. The second half of the term was opposite to the first with the game being controlled by North Adelaide, who also kicked two goals of their own in the quarter to maintain a 9-point lead at the main break. The third quarter was underway, and Norwood come out of the break firing, kicking the opening goal within two minutes to strike fear into their opponents. After plenty of back and forth kicking in the middle part of the quarter, North Adelaide once again broke through the Norwood defence and scored the most crucial of goals just minutes before three-quarter time to steady the ship, much like what occurred in the dying stages of the first, with the goal also extending the lead to 11 points heading into the last.

To begin the fourth quarter, North Adelaide controlled the game however couldn't pile on the scoreboard pressure, getting a return of three behinds from their constant repeat inside 50s, taking the margin to 14 points. The ball eventually made its way down the Norwood end of the ground where at the halfway stage of the quarter, they capitalised on the missed opportunities from the Roosters. Back-to-back goals from the Redlegs saw the lead cut to just two points, and with a world of momentum behind them, they looked destined for another upset win and their fourth of the season. Just minutes later, a clutch goal from Nigel Lockyer saw North Adelaide hit the front with less than five minutes to play, giving the Roosters an 8-point victory, breaking Norwood's hearts in the process.

Despite the loss, Norwood put up a fantastic fight and this was highlighted in some of their players. Nik Rokahr had a game-high 33 disposals, while Jacob Kennerley had 25 disposals, 6 marks and 7 tackles to put his hand up as the best player on field for Norwood. Matthew Nunn made his presence felt in the middle, having 29 disposals and 8 clearances.

Central Districts entered their game needing a win and provided just that, with a convincing 25-point win over South Adelaide all but keeping them in the fight for the final five, while making the equation all the more difficult for South Adelaide to make finals. The game couldn't have started on a better note for Centrals, kicking the first 3 goals of the game to rocket out to an 18-point lead in the first five minutes, including a first career goal to Beau Thomas in just his second game. Luca Whitelum kicked his second goal of the quarter at the 17-minute mark, before a quick reply saw the first South Adelaide goal of the game from Keegan Brooksby, leaving the quarter time margin at 25 points. He second guarter sparked a response from South Adelaide as they controlled the entire guarter, kicking 3 goals to 0 in the term to bring themselves right back into the game, only trailing by 7 points at the main break.

The second half saw minimal scoring take place; however Central District did kick two goals in the third term to really steady the ship heading into the last guarter, entering the final term with a handy 20-point lead. A lone goal in the fourth to Centrals player Mani Liddy saw South Adelaide have a goalless second half, as well as Centrals running away with a convincing 25-point victory. Harry Grant put together a complete performance, having 19 disposals and 11 tackles in the midfield. Luce Whitelum finished as the only multiple goal scorer for the game, finishing with 2 goals from his 13 disposals, as well as 6 marks. Billy lles was prolific down back, having 20 disposals, all kicks, as well as a team-high 8 marks.

Looking ahead to the weekend, Centrals look to be the favourites heading into the match after winning their last two games, while Norwood are currently on a 3-game losing streak after winning their only 3 games for the year all in a row. They have been highly competitive in recent weeks, and despite losing they have taken it up to some of the better teams in the competition. Centrals will have to dig deep and fight hard away from home to ensure they come away with the victory, however they do look to be the better side. This one promises to be one that shapes the finals race dramatically, making it one of the must watch games for the weekend.

Crows mitigate Magpies challenge in SANFL Showdown

A compelling SANFL showdown awaits, as the third-placed Crows host the fourth-placed Magpies at Adelaide Oval on Saturday.

The Crows have rediscovered their best form in recent weeks to win three in-a-row, including a statement win over league leaders Glenelg, whilst the Magpies have won four consecutive games, capped off by an impressive 19-point win over second-placed Sturt. It looms as a massive day at Adelaide Oval for both the Crows and Port, with the SANFL Showdown shortly followed by the AFL Showdown under lights at 7:10pm (ACST).

An onslaught of 12 unanswered goals saw Adelaide put Woodville-West Torrens to the sword in Sunday's Round 14 clash at Woodville. The Crows kicked the opening goal through Lachlan Gollant, before the Eagles responded with their first goal courtesy of Luke Beecken. Gollant kicked his second of three first quarter goals in the eighth minute of the first term, igniting a run of six consecutive goals that would hand the Crows a 38-point lead at quarter time. Adelaide's momentum continued into the second quarter, kicking another four unanswered goals as the Eagles failed to fire, registering four behinds and staring down the barrel of a 60-point deficit at the main break. Elliott Himmelberg and Tyler Brown added to the Eagles pain early in the third term kicking majors to extend the margin to a game-high 72-points. Two quarters of football had passed to the minute, when finally Daniel Sladojevic kicked the Eagles' elusive second goal, sparking a mini-revival of sorts for the Eagles as they kicked four goals in-a-row to close out the third quarter, reducing the margin to 49-points at three quarter time. Eagle Sam Nicholls kicked his second consecutive goal six minutes into the final term, however it would be the Eagles last score of the afternoon, with the Crows kicking the final four goals to close out a 69-point thumping, 17.9-111 to 6.6-42.

The Crows won the disposal count 360-320, clearances 40-23 and inside 50s 51-34. They also converted well inside 50, operating at 65% efficiency from their shots on goal. Former Collingwood player Tyler Brown starred for the Crows, amassing 35 disposals and kicking two goals, along with young gun Jake Soligo (27 disposals, one goal) and ruckman Kieran Strachan (25 disposals, 28 hit outs, one goal). Lachlan Gollant was outstanding in front of goal, kicking six goals, alongside Elliott Himmelberg (three).


Both sides exchanged goals in the opening term, with scores locked at 2.2-14 to 2.2-14 at quarter time. Sturt got off to the fast start in the second quarter, with Steven Slimming converting to push the Double Blues out to a six-point lead within the opening 30 seconds. Goals to Cody Szust and Ollie Lord saw the Magpies wrestle back momentum, before Chad Reschke slotted his second goal of the afternoon to hand the Double Blues back a three-point lead.

The swift response game from Port Adelaide's Nick Moore however, as he goaled to help lift the Magpies to a three-point lead of their own at half time, they would not be headed from there. Goals quickly became scarce as both sides struggled to hit the scoreboard with great impact in the third term. After Magpie Hugh Jackson missed an opportunity in the opening 30 seconds of the third quarter, four consecutive behinds to the Double Blues saw them only able to level the scores, before Magpie dynamo Quinton Narkle and forward Thomas Scully converted to give Port Adelaide a 14-point margin at three quarter time. A see-sawing fourth term saw Josh Hone spark the Double Blues back to life, the forward kicking two goals to bring the deficit back to eight-points. Port Adelaide responded to register the last six scoring shots of the match, including a match-sealing goal, on its way to a 19-point, 10.13-73 to 7.12-54 win.

Sturt owned more possession, winning the disposal count 268-296, however Port Adelaide levelled the clearance battle 31 apiece, and won the inside 50 count 44-37. Jase Burgoyne (24 disposals), Narkle (23 disposals, one goal) and Riley Bonner (22 disposals, 19 kicks) were the major ball winners for the Magpies, whilst Lord, Moore, Scully and Szust all kicked two goals each. Sam Hayes and Dante Visentini formed a valuable partnership in ruck, with 21 hitouts each.

Saturday's SANFL Showdown is an enticing one, with two of the form sides of the SANFL competition clashing on South Australia's biggest stage, Adelaide Oval. Port Adelaide's strong performance over Sturt last weekend is enough to suggest that they defeating them will be no easy feat for the Crows, however the depth and talent of Adelaide's SANFL line-up will be a handful for the Magpies to counter. The Crows produced a stirring 20-point win over competition pacesetters Glenelg two weeks ago away from home, and continued that form with their obliteration of Woodville-West Torrens last weekend. Back on their home deck this weekend, they will be too strong for the Magpies, but only just. **Crows by 11-points**
