





Crows to finish the season with a win over big birds



Sometimes in life you get what you deserve. Many a football and sporting coach will use this saying to highlight that over the course of a game or a season, there are many opportunities that haven't been taken, and the final wash up sees that generally, everything evens out at the end.

Whilst I broadly agree with this sentiment, you can't help but think that our officials that make important decisions during every match should be able to make the relatively easy call of weather the ball was a goal, or simply it wasn't. I have umpired different sports at different levels and appreciate how difficult at times officiating can be. What I don't accept is that professional umpired who have access to technology, don't use it, to ensure the right decision is made.

I don't completely blame the goal umpire for the Ben Keys behind decision last Saturday night. Whilst the ARC wasn't used to review the decision, surely if they can see that the on-field decision was wrong, they can communicate with the field umpires, and advise them of the error, and the appropriate fix. Whilst I know that all goals are reviewed, clearly the behind was a goal, and the impact this has had not just on the result of the match, but the outcome of the Crows season, and that of other club's challenge for a finals berth, is significant.

The Crows should have kicked more accurately in that last quarter to put the result beyond doubt, I suggest the moment Luke Pedlar was substituted into the game, the Crows started winning contested ball particularly for the center square. The Crows themselves can reflect on where they can improve, but the officials need to ensure this never happens again. The ramifications are otherwise massive.

The Crows will complete their season with a trip to Perth to face the Eagles. The Eagles lifted themselves of the bottom of the ladder with a wonderful win over the Bulldogs at Marvel Stadium. 



Despite the controversy surrounding the senior side on Saturday night, the Crows' SANFL side had a great win against fellow premiership hopefuls Sturt to overtake the Double Blues into second position with just one round to play. Sturt have not been lower than second all year until now, dropping a crucial top-of-the-table clash albeit leading at three quarter time at home, before a last quarter flurry of goals by the visitors sent Sturt packing by 16 points. With Adelaide playing Norwood in the final round next week, which looms as a win, the Crows will finish second with an impressive percentage, and Sturt will have to settle for third.

The Crows were much cleaner and effective around the ground, and it made Sturt's high intensity tackling game a non-factor—the Double Blues were well below their average tackle count. Jackson Hately continued his strong 2023 campaign with 28 touches, 5 clearances and 8 inside 50's, while exiled senior player Lachlan Sholl had a team-high 29 disposals with—inside 50's and 11 marks in a complete performance, including an important last quarter goal to kickstart their run. Lachlan Gollant, Ned McHenry and Josh Smithson each booted three goals to pace the attack, while Jarman Sigal and Tyler Brown had to anchor a severely undermanned ruck department with no Kieran Strachan or Elliott Himmelberg. The brave win without multiple key pieces earns the Crows a well-deserved top two finish, with a premiership firmly in their sights in 2023.

For Sturt, Joshua Hone was pivotal in the first three quarters, kicking five straight to propel the Double Blues into a handy lead, one they completely let slip in a disappointing last term. In terms of implications on the ladder, games do not get bigger than this. The Roosters can control their own destiny this weekend at home and play finals in 2023 with a win. Central District and Port Adelaide play each other in Round 18, meaning a Roosters win will see them overtake the loser of that clash, with all three sides sitting on 8 wins. Their midfield core can match it with any midfield in the league, and their forward line has been firing of late through Josh Hone and Lachlan Burrows. The ruck battle will be telling with Amos Doyle going up against Mitchell Harvey giving first access to their midfielders could be vital for the clearance war.

All in all, the climax of the regular season has come down to Saturday's proceedings of footy. A North Adelaide win will see them play finals footy in 2023, and a loss will keep last years runners up out of finals footy, in what would be a severely disappointing result for the club. Contrastingly, a Sturt win gives them a chance of a top two finish still, and a loss (or Adelaide win) cements them in third heading into September.

Glenelg to bounce back and claim minor premiership

As we enter the final round of SANFL home and away football this week, the results of last weekend have made for the most exciting of finishes. The final round of footy sees top of the table Glenelg Tigers play host to South Adelaide Panthers, who sit three games outside the top five.

Coming off a shock loss away to Woodville-West Torrens last week, Glenelg will be all the more eager to record a victory, one that will claim top spot for the Tigers.

South Adelaide are coming off an absolute nail-biter against Port Adelaide last week, which ended in a draw, ultimately leaving the race for the final 2 spots in the finals wide open.

Glenelg went into the game on the weekend against Woodville-West Torrens needing a win or a draw to claim the minor premiership and would have felt rather confident in walking away with points given their recent form. A goal 46 seconds into the game set the tone for the Tigers, striking panic into the Eagles players and supporters. The second half of the term was controlled by Glenelg, kicking 3 more goals to 1, including 3 in the quarter from league leading goalkicker Lachie Hosie. A late goal to Woodville left the margin at 6 points after an eventful first term. The second term began in scintillating fashion for the home side, with two quick goals from Max Beattie stretching the lead to 18 points before two minutes had been played. With panic well and truly setting in for the premiership favourites, they soon turned the tables, going on a remarkable 5-goal run to wrestle themselves back into the contest. Two more goals from Lachie Hosie saw his total sit at 5 goals before halftime, before another red time goal to Woodville saw Will Pearce kick his fourth goal for the half, cutting the margin to 13 points at the main break.

Halftime came at a bad time for Glenelg, who had all the momentum going in their favour. This was evident after the third term began, with Woodville-West Torrens kicking the first 3 goals of the quarter to force another lead change, before Luke Reynolds kicked the lone goal for Glenelg in the quarter. The final quarter began much the same way as the first, with goals to Jimmy Rowe and Troy Men el, extending the lead to 14 points for the Eagles. This ultimately put the game at bed for Glenelg, who needed somewhat of a miracle to come back back from this taking into consideration the amount of momentum that Woodville-West Torrens had in their favour. Without a goal to their name for the first half of the quarter, a coast-to-coast goal to Woodville courtesy of Kade Herbert his first in league footy - seemingly put the game to bed for the Eagles, with the lead now at 21 points.

Eventually, a constellation goal to Glenelg got them on the board, before a second league goal to Kade Herbert left the final margin at 22 points and an emphatic victory for Woodville-West Torrens. Corey Lyons lead the way for the Tigers, finishing with 31 disposals, 6 marks, 6 tackles, inside 50s and 10 clearances in a dominant midfield display. The second quarter was gold for the home side, with a -goal to 1 quarter setting up what was set to be an almighty upset. Two goals from Jonti Schuback set up the quarter for the Panthers, before singles from Fitt, Sproule, Freitag, Wilkinson and Gibbs left South Adelaide with a comfortable 35-point lead heading into the main break. The third term was a goal-fest, with 9 more goals piled on in the quarter.

Looking ahead to the weekend, Glenelg look to be the clear favourites in the end-of-season clash, however there are areas where South Adelaide can limit the impact that Glenelg have on the game. Their defence has been reasonably consistent all season and the matchup of Haines and Hosie promises to be nothing short of mouth-watering. The midfield power of the Tigers seems to be too strong on paper, while their small forwards have proven they can turn a game on its head within a matter of minutes this year. With a minor premiership on the line, its awfully difficult seeing Glenelg let another slip through their grasp, especially on their home deck.



Magpies cling on under finals-like pressure

A finals spot is on the line for Central District and Port Adelaide on Saturday when they clash in the final round of the regular season at Convenience Oval.

The Magpies sit fourth on the SANFL ladder, one premiership point clear of the Bulldogs in fifth, but the loser of Saturday's clash could be pushed out of finals contention if a desperate North Adelaide defeats Sturt at Prospect Oval.

The Bulldogs scraped home against the Roosters last Saturday to win by two-points in a game that carried major implications for finals. Bulldogs ace Harry Grant had a monstrous game featuring 34 disposals and a goal, whilst Justin Hoskin (22 disposals, 20 kicks), Hugo Munn and Aiden Grace (two goals each) were also influential. The Bulldogs were headed in the possession battle and the clearances, but won the inside 50 count comprehensively 46-32. Three consecutive goals got the Bulldogs off to an electric start at Prospect Oval in the first quarter, with Munn kicking his two majors within the opening 11 minutes of the match.

A late first term goal to North Adelaide's Noah Casalini would see Central's margin cut to five-points at quarter time. Harrison Elbrow and Karl Finlay had a large hand in giving the Roosters a two-point lead at half time, with both kicking a goal each but missing multiple opportunities throughout the quarter.

The third quarter saw the Bulldogs score 3.6 from their opportunities inside forward whilst the Roosters were able to kick three goals from only four scoring opportunities, holding a three-point margin at the last change. Goals became scarce in the last term, as Harrison Wigg and Casalini missed opportunities to extend the Roosters' margin, before a goal to Central's Kyle Presbury later on in the term proved to be a match-winner, as the Bulldogs held on for a 8.12-60 to 8.10-58 win.

The Magpies clash with South Adelaide last Saturday ended in a draw, with South Adelaide almost stealing the game in the dying embers. The Magpies dominated the inside 50 count 49-38 but were beaten in all other key areas. It was even performance from many Port players with Trent Dumont (25 disposals), Riley Bonner and dynamo Quinton Narkle (23 disposals, one goal) all strong performers.

South Adelaide got off to a fast start in the second term, kicking three goals in-a-row before Jed Hagan kicked his second major of the day, to reduce the margin to 11-points. The Panthers continued to kick away however, dominating the quarter to kick four consecutive goals, with the Magpies trailling by 35-points at half time. The Panthers lead got to a game-high margin of 41-points in the 11th minute of the third term, before an inspired comeback from Port Adelaide saw them kick five of the next six goals before three quarter time, reducing the margin to 12-points at the final break.

Grant was the standout for the Bulldogs that day with 36 disposals.

Both sides are determined to feature in September, and both very well might, but there may only be room for one if North Adelaide triumph over Sturt on Saturday.

Port Adelaide will bounce back following the disappointment of last week's draw for a crucial win against Central District.
