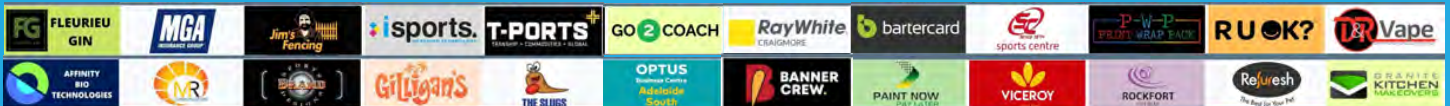

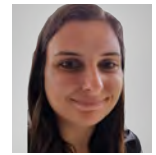

SMOSH will be left wondering after letting wayward kicking steal away a crucial win, with Broadview taking the victory by a slim 4 points. 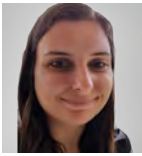

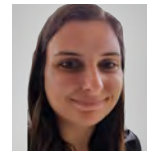

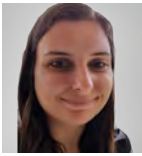

WOMEN'S D1 and D1R - ROUND 13 PREVIEW

We now have our finals teams confirmed for this season, but that doesn't mean there's not still plenty to play for over the next two weeks. Old Ignatians and SMOSH will face off again and both teams will still want to finish off the season well. Their last clash was a close one, and even though SMOSH are the clear favourites again, this could also be close with an expected margin of 10-30 points. Adelaide University will face the ladder leaders Broadview, with the Tigers surely eager to keep top spot to themselves. It could be another big defeat for Uni, with Broadview likely to get the win by 50+ points. Payneham and Morphettville will be the game of the round, with both sides hungry to grab a top 2 spot. Last time Morphettville stunned everyone by getting a big win, and they will be slight favourites though the margin is expected to be a more modest 1-20 points. Happy Valley and Henley wrap up the round. Henley will be wanting to keep sharp despite not being able to improve their ladder position and will be favourites to get the win by 20-40 points.

In the reserves all four home sides were victorious, just like their league sisters. Broadview and SMOSH were close again with Broadview winning by 9 points. Payneham have all but stitched up top spot with a big win over Happy Valley by 48 points. Morphettville also had a big win to close the gap on Broadview slightly after defeating Adelaide University by 62 points. With spots still up for grabs all top 6 teams will be wanting to bring their A games. Adelaide University will come up against Broadview who will still be hoping they could snatch top and the Tigers should win by a convincing 20-40 points. SMOSH can keep that crucial fourth spot when they face the winless Old Ignatians, and should get the job done by 20-40 points. Payneham and Morphettville should be a blockbuster clash, but Payneham are yet the faultier and should get the win by a small 1-20 points. Happy Valley and Henley is the crucial game this week, with Happy Valley having a chance to end Henley's season. Henley will surely put up a fight but Happy Valley should get the win by a narrow 1-20 points.
