





SAWFL DIVISION 6 - ROUND 14 REVIEWS




Ingle Farm (3.10.28) defeated Flinders Park (3.4.22)

The first weekend of August brought a close to the minor rounds, as we say goodbye to four teams who have provided us with a plethora of entertainment and contributed greatly to the 2023 season. Flinders Park and Ingle Farm are two of those sides and they battled out a tightly contested match up to see off their year in style. Dramatically, the Farm girls were victorious, coming from behind in the second half to secure the points by a goal.

Flinders Park appeared comfortable throughout the first quarter, and many would have expected them to build on their unanswered four scoring shots to put the game beyond the reach of their opponent. After having only two attempts at goal in the first half, there must have been a rocket of gigantic proportions ignited by the Ingle Farm coaching staff during the main break because what followed is simply unlike anything we've seen from them in over a year. The clash was decided in that third term. Ingle Farm came rearing out of the gates and dominated across all parts of the ground. Their delivery inside forward 50 supplied a platform for their attacking assets to thrive off, recording eight scoring opportunities in just one quarter of footy. However, inaccuracy halted the excitement amongst the Farm faithful with their seven behinds giving Flinders Park a lifeline as they converted their only chance heading into three-quarter-time. In a time of need Ingle Farm turned to their captain Lani Collins and she delivered compellingly. Her two goals were enough to earn her a much-deserved best on ground award, putting a postage stamp on an admirable season for the experienced forward crafter. Despite the threat, Collins poses for opposition defenders, her skills have been required elsewhere this season, spending more time in the guts and across the midfield due to her side's struggles.

It was a disappointing showing from Flinders Park in their final encounter of 2023. The side who I have previously referred to as being 'the best of the rest,' has had no trouble beating clubs ranked below them. Round 14 will certainly be one they'll be keen to forget as they were outworked throughout the contest's closing stages when it mattered most. Goals to Tess Baxter, Lucinda Hulm and Tahnee Wright placed Flinders Park in a probable position to win the game, however, a lack lustre second half display sees them finish with more losses than wins in a tough season.

Golden Grove (10.13.73) defeated Goodwood Saints (1.0.6)

In what was a performance we have become far more accustomed to seeing from Golden Grove, they returned to their best to defeat Goodwood Saints convincingly. Throughout the last couple of months, the third ranked side have struggled to put massive scores on the board like we witnessed in the early part of the season and their victory in round 14 is a timely reminder of what they are capable of. With their sights set on a top two finish and the security of the double-chance, Grove fell short by a mere 0.64%, meaning they will have to defeat Marion next week to keep their premiership hopes alive.

The game was effectively over at quarter-time, as they headed into the first break with a comfortable twenty-two-point buffer. You would have forgiven the Grove unit for taking the foot off the throttle and enjoying the rest of the afternoon by rotating or resting players, however, they wanted to make an example of the Saints. Kirra Lebessis took full advantage of her team's attacking presence, booting three majors on her way to featuring among the game's best players. Neither Ashleigh Calvo nor Kasia Culhane were going to watch Lebessis dominate alone; the pair recorded two goals apiece and formed a formidable partnership throughout the contest. However, it was Ella Ward who stole the show, putting in an excellent shift and was a worthy recipient of player-of-the-match honours. For Goodwood Saints, their round 14 loss spells a disappointing end to their 2023. It's been a challenging year for the sixth ranked side, however, the glimpses of promise they have shown in their three wins has been a valuable contribution to the competition. In an impressive individual display, Ellen Crisp put out the best performance of her career to-date and was recognised as the Saints' top player of the day.

Athelstone (6.13.49) defeated Tea Tree Gully (0.2.2)

In astonishing circumstances, Athelstone have completely dismantled Tea Tree Gully ahead of their finals campaign, recording an incredible forty-seven-point victory away from home. The travelling side were relentless with their forward pressure, not allowing Gully to play their naturally free-flowing style of footy. By half time the deficit was thirty-one-points, and you would have excused anyone for thinking these two sides were at opposite ends of the ladder. Athelstone restricted all movement out of their opponent's defensive 50, locking the ball inside of their forward half for extended periods of time. Repeated entries provided their key position players with an abundance of goal scoring opportunities and if they had converted more efficiently, the scoreline could have reached an ugly state for Gully. With another two goals this weekend, Natalie Lomman has taken her tally to twenty-three for the year and will come away with the golden boot award. Lomman has been a force to be reckoned with, just seeing her name on the team sheet must induce fear within opposing defensive units on match day.



The week ahead!




