Henley v Payneham NU 0.9.9 v 7.5.47

With second spot on the line Payneham NU brought their A game this week to stitch up their place in the qualifying final after defeating Henley by 38 points. It was a fast start from the Falcons, with the girls kicking two goals and a point in the first term. They were also able to hold Henley completely scoreless and took an early 13 point lead at the first break. Then in the second they kept up their high defensive pressure and held Henley to only two points for the term. They kicked another goal along with three points to push the margin out to a comfortable 20 points by the main break.

In the third Henley still couldn't find a way to break through, and only added on three more behinds to the scoreboard. Payneham added on another goal and another point to stretch the lead out further to 24 points at three quarter time. In the last Henley's woes continued as they could only get in another four misses while Payneham finished off a strong display with another three goals for good measure. Payneham's recent form sees them with three wins and a draw in their final month of the regular season, giving them a great chance at the premiership title this season after being the early favourites. For Henley they know they are the outside chance but nothing is certain in football and they should have belief that they have every opportunity to win the title if they bring their best.

The eve of finals is not a good time to lose goal kicking accuracy, but that's exactly what happened to Broadview. They incredulously were unable to kick a single goal as they lost to Morphettville by 27 points. The Roos had the better of the Tigers in the first quarter, leaping out of the gates with two goals and three behinds in the first quarter. Broadview could only sneak through a single behind, and the margin was a comfortable 14 points at the first break. The second quarter was played completely on Broadview's terms, but for all their dominance they could not hurt Morphettville where it counts. For Broadview there were still positives with Emma Waters, Ashlea James, Chloe Short, Jessica Luciani, and Sarcha Taylor all putting in great games. Although she kicked no goals this week, Remy Grant still has taken out the award for the most goals this season in division 1 with a total of 25, and can also be proud of her three appearances on the best players list.

Adelaide University v Old Ignatians 4.7.31 v 2.3.15

It's been a disappointing year for Adelaide University, but they ended their season on a high after a 16 point win over Old Ignatians. It gives the girls their fourth win of the season to equal their tally from last season, though they will be finishing in a much more respectable sixth place on the ladder. This one started modestly, with both sides kicking one goal each in the opening term. Thanks to two extra points Adelaide Uni held the slim lead at the quarter time break. Then in the second Uni took control of the game but couldn't quite convert it into scoreboard pressure. They kicked only one more goal along with four behinds, but thanks to defensive pressure they also stopped Old Ignatians from adding any score for the term and at half time the lead was 12 points.

The third quarter was also played on Uni's terms, with Ignatians only able to get two behinds on the board. Uni meanwhile skipped further ahead thanks to two goals and another point, to get the margin out to 23 points by the final break. WOMEN'S D1 and D1R - ROUND 15 PREVIEWS

We now say goodbye to SMOSH, Adelaide University, Old Ignatians, and Happy Valley for season 2023 as the girls get a head start on the rest of the competition for next year. The first week of finals starts off with the qualifier between Broadview and Payneham NU which is sure to be a red hot contest. It was Broadview who handed Payneham their first loss this year, and with the ledger standing at one apiece there is plenty to fuel this fire. Broadview will be very narrow favourites and the margin will likely be a slim 1-20 points. Morphettville and Henley will face off in the elimination final, and neither will want all their hard work to go to waste. Morphettville have won both of the meetings this year and will be the favourites to win by 10-30 points but they can't underestimate Henley.




