
Brighton Bombers vs Old Ignatians:







As the minor round comes to an end 5 of the Division 4 teams will be shutting up shop for the summer. Two of them, Mitcham and Portland will be preparing for life in Division 5. The other three non-finalists Morphettville Park, Kenilworth and Walkerville will be reviewing what worked and what didn't in their football programs with the aim of moving up the ladder in 2024. Relegation is a difficult time for any club. For Portland it is their second drop in three years. Mitcham, however, will be buoyed (and maybe a little confused) by winning games in round 17 and 18.

For the top 5 Pooraka, CBCOC, Lockleys, Plympton and Hectorville they will be hoping that all their planning and hard work comes to fruition in a September that will lead firstly to promotion to Division 3 and secondly to premiership glory. ou need a bit of luck in September to be successful and the top 5 teams will be crossing their fingers for a good run with injuries, particularly for key personnel. They will also be looking to show their best form when it really matters.

Pooraka completed the minor round on top of the ladder and therefore get a week off. In fact, they ended up 3 games clear on top of the ladder which is an excellent effort. They will be acutely aware that unfortunately that now counts for nothing. They finished in the minor premiers' position partly off the back of being the highest scoring team in the competition. They have averaged over 110 points per game and in fact have kicked 241 points more than the next best attack.

Third place CBCOC have a forward line that functions well also. Led by Brett Simpson, they have averaged around 88 points per game. They would like to concede goals a little less easily. They have the 5th best defensive record conceding nearly 70 points per game. The rely heavily on Jonty Rutai and Jack Strange to repel and rebound from their back half. They more than the other top 5 contenders will be hoping for a good run with injuries in the finals. Their B grade only won 3 games for the year so will not be involved in finals action. They will hope this lack of depth does not get exposed in the next month.

Hectorville provide an interesting numerical study. They are 9th for points scored in 2023. This is almost statistically unheard of for a team in the top 5. They have only averaged 61 points per game. Any finals success they have will be off the back of an outstanding defensive effort. Midfield drive from Daniel Fairbrother and the marking ability of tall forward Luke Broadbent will be key to their ability to kick a winning score. They are, however, number 1 for points against having only conceded 63 points per game. Joe Mensforth and Liam Ryan are very good at holding up opposition forward movements and providing rebound the other way. They will be hoping they can restrict oppositions in the coming weeks. The question they will need to answer in the affirmative is can you win finals when you only kick 10 goals per game

Plympton have had a good back half of the season winning some crucial games. None more so than their gritty round 17 victory over Hectorville at Daly Reserve. The are fifth for points for averaging 82 points per game. They rely on the strong marking Lachie Stoddard to provide a target inside 50 and get good drive from strong midfielder Jamie West and outside runner Lonnie Hampton. Their defence is fourth for points against. Their B grade have only lost one minor round game. They are a strong club with good depth. They will be hopeful of both teams making a late season charge toward a grand final birth, leading to a move to Division 3 for 2024.

Woodville South v Eastern Park
