

### FIRST QUALIFYING FINAL

### Magpies Swoop and Earn Preliminary Final Berth

Finals football has arrived, and the Magpies will open the 2023 final series in a Qualifying Final against Melbourne on Thursday night. Both teams come into the first week of finals after impressive wins a fortnight ago in Round 24. Collingwood destroyed Essendon and are likely to have a number of key players return for Thursday's game. Skipper Darcy Moore, defender Nathan Murphy are Likely to play with star midfielder Nick Daicos, an outside chance to return.

If Moore and Murphy return, it will be two very big inclusions to bolster Collingwood's back line. The Magpies won 18 of their 23 home and away matches. They were one of only a couple of teams to stay inside the eight, for the entire home and away season. The Magpies were able to withstand different amounts of pressure across many games this season. This often saw them behind on the scoreboard going into the last quarter. Often, the Magpies were able to control the final quarter and ground out a victory, to the amazement of their fans and commentators.

Collingwood are a naturally talented side with a mindset that allows them to believe they can win from any situation. This mindset comes from experience and a belief in their game style and continually executing their plans, despite what the scoreboard says. This is what makes a good ream, a great finals team.

Melbourne finished fourth at the completion of round 24 and defeated Collingwood back on the Kings Birthday match in June. The scoreboard records that Melbourne only won by four points, however they did manage 26 scoring shots to Collingwood's 17. Melbourne kicked 8 goals 18 behinds to keep Collingwood in the match. The Demons couldn't finish in any other position as they faced Sydney a fortnight ago. The Demons welcomed back Bayley Fritsch that afternoon and he kicked a bag of 5 goals to put a smile on the faces of Demons fans.

Petracca is magnificent at exiting a stoppage from the front of the pack, which opens space in front of him, to then find a target.

Collingwood will start favourite as they have been the best and most consistent side all season. Melbourne will challenge them, but I suspect Collingwood's running power, particularly Bobby Hill, Jordan De Goey and Jack Ginnivan, will be too strong for the Demons.

It is a worthy opening final, for the winner, a week off and a home Preliminary Final. The loser gets a second chance, and possibly a date with Carlton in a knockout Semi Final. If this is the entre, next week could be the main course.



### **Blues to End Their Finals Blues**

After a much-deserved week off, the Swans will fly to Melbourne to play Carlton. The latter finished fifth one game clear of Sydney, while the former placed eighth. Despite the Blues ladder ascendency, this match can undoubtedly be won by either side. The much-overused football clich that there is no tomorrow, does not ring truer to these sides.

Although Carlton finished higher on the ladder, there was irrefutably a cloud cast over the club. A mirage of uncertainty. Is the coach competent? Will their list fail again? Why is Cripps in bad form?

Now as a football supporter, you can sit back and tell yourself you knew all along they would come good. But the reality is, there was very little confidence in this football club when things looked bleak—and arguably rightfully so. However, this doubt has been silenced as the Blues won nine of their last ten matches. Prior to this Carlton had lost eight from nine games. This demonstrates Carlton has had an incredibly contrasting season.

Interestingly, their resurgence has come through their defence. In the past 10-weeks Carlton's average score against is 64.5. This is below the average score for. This was reiterated by former St Kilda legend, Leigh Montanna, who told Fox Footy he thinks the Blues are built for finals.

Similarly, their current form is consistent with that of the last 10 premiership sides as every premiership team in this period, has not lost more than one match in their last five leading into finals.

The Blues are also in a unique position in that their players have developed in maturity. In fact, Carlton's average age is 24.5. This is arguably the prime age for elite footballers. In combination, with the Blues star power through Curnow (Coleman medallist), Cripps (captain) and Weitering, Carlton can arguably win the premiership.

However, their first and biggest challenge will be defeating Sydney this weekend. Unlike Carlton, Sydney was never able to generate the same momentum as last season. In fact, the Swans never won more than six consecutive games.

Conversely, injuries heavily inhibited Sydney's ability to climb higher on the ladder. Despite this, the Swans still claimed their rightful spot in the top eight.

Unfortunately for Carlton fans, this could prove to be a concern as Sydney have 29 players with finals experience (the most out of any club playing finals). Further, coach, John Longmire's, constant ability to inspire his playing group and outcoach opposition teams is one of the fundamental reasons as to why Sydney has missed only five finals series since 1996.

Through their quick ball movement, due to Blakey, Rampe, Gulden and Papley, the Swans are often able to counterattack opposition entries forward. This will be crucial to winning on Friday, as Carlton has set up effectively behind the ball during the past month. Concerningly for Longmire, the loss of Paddy McCartin has meant the Swans defensive 50 is relatively fragile. As such, they are ranked eighth in defence.

The Swans are also ranked 17th at stoppages and therefore will be looking to generate quick ball movement. Subsequently, if Sydney are to win this match and upset the Blues recent form resurgence, they will have to improve defensively.

Nonetheless, because Carlton have not played finals since 2013, they will no doubt be hungry to improve on their recent record. As such, I think hunger will outweigh finals experience in a match which can be won by either side. Carlton by 1-12.

It has finally arrived. The AFL finals.

The Saints turned the tables early in the third, kicking the opening goal through Brad Crouch before adding two more to take the lead for the first time since the first term, before a short Brisbane run kept the lead around that three-goal margin. A late goal on return to Jack Hayes saw the margin sit at 12 points heading into the final term, with St Kilda possessing the momentum. With a potential home final on the line for both sides, there was certainly a bit of feeling in the air that it could still go either way. The third term began in a tight contest, before the first goal was kicked by Carlton at the 8-minute mark to make the scores 53-53. Goals to Coniglio and Curnow saw them both extend their totals for the day to 2 and 3 respectively, before the avalanche was released. The Giants kicked 4 goals to 0 in the back half of the third quarter to extend the margin and essentially put the game out of reach for Carlton, but more importantly cement a finals berth for themselves.

A 26-point three-quarter time lead became 33 points in a matter of minutes, as GWS eyed off a win of 42+ to take 6th place off St Kilda and get a home final. GWS made it 45 points by the halfway mark of the final term and it left fans asking the question of how much can they win by. St Kilda fans were watching on in horror as they were watching their home final slip out of their hands in the most agonizing of ways. Luckily for Saints fans, Carlton kicked two late goals to make the margin under the required 42 points, giving them a home final by 0.7%. St Kilda have been the best defensive side all season, limiting teams to low scores and shutting down their run and carry all across the ground. This is classic Ross Lyon football; the defensive game is what took Ross to four grand finals in three years in his previous coaching stints and it is proving to be a handful for teams once again. GWS on the other hand have used their speed and carry across the ground to break open teams and find holes in their defence in the back half of the season. Their half backs have overlapped and created great scoring opportunities in the last two months of the season and it has ultimately propelled them into finals.





### Melbourne (73) def Collingwood (31)

The season opener saw the defending champs start with a bang as a ferocious second half saw them shake off opponents Collingwood to win by 42 points. Thanks to a five goal third term the Dees overran their opponent to celebrate the unfurling of their premiership flag in style. The Pies had the better of the Dees in the first half but struggled to make any impact on the game after half time, kicking only three points. Melbourne have proven that they are still a side to be feared even after the retirement of Daisy Pearce last season.

### Carlton v Gold Coast (34) def Gold Coast (32)

### North Melbourne (56) def St Kilda (16)



The Crows booked their ticket to a double chance matchup against Glenelg this week, with the chance of a Grand Final berth, after rallying late to defeat the Double Blues by seven points on Sunday.

Sturt led by as much as 35 points in the first half before trailing by as much as 15 points in the term, eventually falling short after a couple crucial misses in the last couple minutes. The turning point was Sturt's Amos Doyle suffering a suspected knee injury in the third term, as he was out-rucking the part-timer James Borlase, leading to a more even matchup in that department for the remainder of the game. Adelaide were able to capitalise on this and win more of the ball out the middle, creating space to run into.

The Double Blues' fast start, helped by two Connor McFayden goals in the first quarter, got them out to a convincing, and seemingly unassailable lead, when they led by six goals midway through the second term, but a couple late Crow goals, by Jay Boyle and captain Matty Wright, ended the half with a glimmer of hope.

The switch flipped at half time, as the Crows came out firing in the third, snagging the first three through Boyle, Sam Berry and Brayden Cook to cut the lead to 3 points, before consecutive Sturt goals withstood the onslaught, and the Double Blues went into the last quarter still with a 16-point lead.

The last quarter heroics of Riley Clamp (2.1) and Tariek Newchurch (2.1) helped the Crows gain the lead for the first time in the game, as they kicked five straight to turn a 16-point deficit into a 15-point lead. Jared Dakin (27 disposals, 7 clearances, 7 inside 50's) was huge for Sturt, and gave them some hope with a late goal to reduce the lead to nine, but two crucial misses, from very gettable spots, by Lachie Burrows and Casey Voss, would be the final shots of the match as the siren sounded shortly thereafter, signalling a comeback Crows win for the ages.

With no Harry Schoenberg or Matt Crouch, Tyler Brown made the most of his opportunities to lead the disposal tally for Adelaide, racking up 24 with 7 clearances, while Luke Nankervis (22 disposals, 4 rebound 50's) mopped up across half back and Patrick Parnell (21 disposals, 4 marks, 5 rebound 50's) was arguably Adelaide's best in the second half, taking various intercept marks and controlling play back there.

Casey Voss (26 disposals, 10 marks, 10 rebound 50's) was at his Team Of The Year best across half back, even sneaking forward late to no avail, while James Battersby led everyone in disposals (32) and clearances (10), taking on the Crows' midfield powerhouse by his lonesome.

Lachie Burrows (2.1) was the target up forward, taking several contested marks, but couldn't convert late when his side needed it, while Joshua Hone was uncharacteristically quiet to his normal standards, with just the one goal from his eight touches.

The result leaves Sturt having to beat Centrals this week to continue their finals charge, while the Crows maintained their double chance and will face Glenelg this week, with the winner going straight to the Grand Final.

This should be a classic. Glenelg host Adelaide in a double chance semi-final. The winner goes straight to the Grand Final, and the loser will have to face the winner of Sturt and Centrals for a chance at redemption. The Tigers will be well rested and can earn themselves an extra week off with a win here, but Adelaide will be fresh off a famous comeback win, with all the momentum in the world, and will look to upset Glenelg and play off in the 2023 Hostplus SANFL Grand Final. At full strength, these two have been the two best sides all year, and this may well be the Grand Final preview in a fortnight's time.

Glenelg, with just the three losses to their name, have been consistently dominant across the 18 rounds, but the Crows have made do with their ever-changing lineup. With players going in and out of the senior side all year, it's meant Adelaide has often been undermanned, but have held up well, and with the senior side missing finals they get their bodies back for the finals' series. Players like Borlase and Keane, who became mainstays in the AFL side in the back end of the year, now have a chance to win the SANFL side a premiership. Another name who has missed time recently, Kieran Strachan, is a chance to return this week to give their ruck stocks a massive boost and allow Borlase to play defence where he is best suited. The Crows will almost be full strength, so it will be a test for Glenelg to see where they're at after a week off.

The two sides met twice this year for mixed results. In round 8 Glenelg won narrowly 82-80, but in round 13 Adelaide returned the favour, winning 101-81, so the sides seem very well matched. Liam McBean kicked 5 and 4 goals respectively in the two games the sides played, proving to be a handful up forward, so Adelaide will need to contain him, while Lachlan Hosie had nine scoring shots in their most recent matchup. The tandem has been elite all year but will face a full-strength Crows defensive lineup in good form. Adelaide's two highest disposal getters in the two matchups, Matt Crouch and Harry Schoenberg, won't play, meaning Brown, Hately, and Dowling must step up in the engine room against an experienced Glenelg midfield. The Crows will need big games from their midfield crop and hope no Himmelberg up forward won't prove too much inconvenience against this well-oiled Tigers side.

The two heavyweights should provide an instant classic on Sunday afternoon at the home of South Australian footy. Who will punch their ticket to a Grand Final berth in 2023?

#### **Double Blues hold off Bulldogs to reach Preliminary Final**

Week two of SANFL finals action sees Sturt and Central District lock horns in Sunday's First Semi-Final at Adelaide Oval. The Double Blues will be looking to bounce back after surrendering a near six goal lead in its seven-point loss against Adelaide in the Qualifying Final, whilst the Bulldogs are intent on continuing a three-match winning streak that saw them edge the Magpies by seven-points in the Elimination Final.

Sturt led from the outset in its clash with the Crows, at one stage leading by a game-high margin of 35-points in the second quarter, before a five-goal last term saw the Crows charge home to snatch a 10.8-68 to 11.9-75 win. Sturt Captain James Battersby led the way for the Double Blues with 32 disposals and 10 clearances, whilst Jared Dakin (27 disposals, one goal), Casey Voss (26 disposals) and Tom Lewis (24 disposals) were also influential. Versatile tall Connor McFadyen kicked three goals in a strong showing up forward.

It was an even battle for possession, with Adelaide edging Sturt 312-309 for disposals, the Double Blues won clearances 41-29 and inside 50s 49-43. Daniel Fahey-Sparks kicked the opening goal of the game for Sturt, in what would go on to be a strong guarter for the Double Blues, leading by 23points at the first break courtesy of a late Josh Hone goal. The opening two goals of the second term saw the Double Blues stretch their lead to 35-points as they threatened to run away with the game.

A goal to Crows' Jay Boyle and a late major to Captain Matthew Wright saw Adelaide reduce the deficit to 21-points at half time. Three goals to begin the second had Adelaide breathing down the neck of Sturt, with Brayden Cook's second major of the day cutting the margin to just three-points.

The Double Blues steadied before three quarter time with goals to McFadyen and Lachlan Burrows, ending the third term with a 16-point lead. A dominant fourth quarter saw the Double Blues rendered helpless as the Crows piled on five unanswered goals, stretching out to a 15-point lead before Dakin kept the Double Blues alive with a late major. Late behinds to Burrows and Voss saw the margin trimmed to seven-points. An injury to first-choice ruckman Amos Doyle ensured the Double Blues were a rotation short in the second half, with his availability for this week's Semi-Final undetermined.

#### **Double Blues hold off Bulldogs to reach Preliminary Final (cont'd)**

A gutsy performance saw the Bulldogs outlast the Magpies in an arm wrestle, with a late goal to Nick Lange helping the Bulldogs to a 12.10-82 to 11.9-75 win. Aiden Grace starred for the Bulldogs with five goals, whilst Harry Grant led all ball winners on the ground with 22 disposals and 10 tackles. Leyton Chisholm and Cooper Dahms had 20 disposals each in a strong showing.

Central won the possession battle 283-261, but lost clearances 33-42 and inside 50s 43-48 in the seven-point win. Despite having twice the amount of scoring opportunities, the Bulldogs took a slender four-point lead into quarter time, with Hugo Munn and Grace kicking majors alongside a quick snap near the goal line from Isaiah Dudley for his first goal of the day.

Both sides exchanged goals for the majority of the second quarter before Orazio Fantasia turned the game on its head during an inspired six-minute patch that saw him convert three goals before half time, handing the Magpies an 11-point lead at the main break. A goal to small-forward Jed Hagan granted the Magpies a 17-point lead under a minute into the third term, before Szust missed consecutive opportunities to extend Port Adelaide's margin to a match-winning one. Grace asserted himself on the contest with three of the next four goals, including two brilliant finishes from the forward pocket with a set shot then check side on the run, cutting the Magpies margin to just six-points. Bulldogs' Kyle Presbury drew the game level with his goal in the 21st minute of the thirt term, before Magpies ruckman Scott Lycett extended Port Adelaide's margin back to a goal heading into three quarter time. Grace kicked his fifth goal to tie scores up once again early in the fourth term before Szust nailed his second goal to hand the Magpies back the lead. The first of two final quarter goals saw Lange tie the scores for the fourth time of the afternoon, before a steaming run inside 50 saw him kick a brilliant goal that would prove to be the matchwinner moments later.

The winner of Sunday's First Semi-Final will move on to a Preliminary Final where it will tackle the loser of the Second Semi-Final between Glenelg and Adelaide.

Sturt looked the winner for almost three quarters of its clash against Adelaide last weekend, with the injury to Doyle no doubt having a huge impact on surrendering such a significant lead. Sturt supporters will be eagerly awaiting the fitness of Doyle and experienced defender Guy Page, who has a hamstring concern, heading into Sunday's Final. Expect the Double Blues to keep their season alive this weekend against the Bulldogs, who can't be discounted due to their current winning form.
