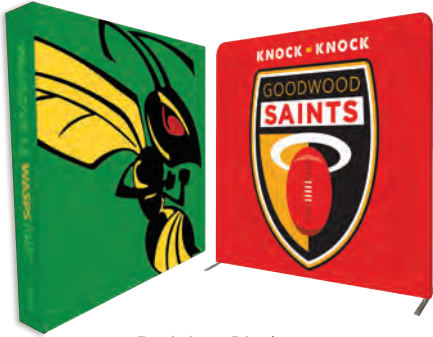

With every week that goes by, the illustrious grand final trophy and the respective prize money which comes along with it, edges closer. This week in a tussle to make the preliminary final, the Blues will play Melbourne.

In the qualifying final last week, Melbourne narrowly lost to Collingwood by 5-points, after inaccurate kicking (11 points), coupled with missed opportunities, squandered their hopes of a home preliminary final. While the Dees struggled, the Blues continued their streak of good form and overcame their 11-year drought of not winning a final as they beat Sydney in a close match. As such, both Victorian sides, who are evenly matched, will have fans salivating to the contest at steak, as it could potentially lead to a grand final. Melbourne finished fourth at the end of the home-and-away season, one game below third and two and a half games above fifth (ironically, Carlton).

However, last week, the Dees lost in unlikely circumstances. Despite registering 69 inside 50's, they kicked only seven goals for the match (almost one goal every ten inside 50's). Now this may seem typical, but it really is not. This season, teams averaged approximately 54 inside 50's. Melbourne averaged 58.6, yet they are ranked 15th for shots per inside 50. This was noticeable against Collingwood as they were unable to capitalise on their territorial domination in the match.

Despite valuable performances from their three highest possession getters and arguably best players in Gawn (27 disposals), Oliver (31 disposals) and Petracca (29 disposals), Melbourne's forward line looked undamaging. To further hurt the Demons chances, experienced forward, Melksham will still be unavailable for the match in addition to Brayshaw, who was concussed early in the Qualifying final.

As such, Melbourne will be reliant on their midfielders in Viney, Petracca, Oliver and Gawn to kick goals, particularly provided Carlton are ranked fourth in defence. Likewise, Melbourne will also look to score from defensive turnovers and capitalise on the 6-6-6 rule as they are ranked second in defence themselves.

Glenelg 16.8 (104) def Adelaide 11.6 (72)

After a blistering third quarter, the Tigers became the first team to book their ticket to the 2023 Hostplus Grand Final in a fortnight's team, fending off Adelaide by 32 points.

After a dead even first half, which was virtually goal for goal, Glenelg broke the shackles after the main break, kicking five goals to one behind in the third term, which ended up being the final margin.

Adelaide controlled stoppages in the first term, led by Sam Berry (8 clearances) and Jackson Hately (6 clearances), winning several clearances as they got out to a 31-12 lead early, before Glenelg adjusted and drew level at 46 apiece by half time. From there it was all Matthew Snook (25 disposals, 10 clearances) and Liam McBean (19 disposals, 3.3, 7 hitouts), and their Tigers counterparts jumped on board in a rampant 30 minutes of footy. Brett Turner, who was on the Crows' list last year before being delisted, was out for revenge on Sunday, recording 2 goals and 7 clearances from his 16 disposals, doing most of his damage in the second half as well.

It was the first game in several weeks where the Crows were beaten in disposals, a category that Adelaide have controlled for most of 2023. Glenelg also made the most of a Strachan and Himmelberg-less Crows side, as although James Borlase was serviceable in the ruck with 24 hitouts, he was inevitably outmatched by Cameron McGree and his 39 hitouts, provided silver service for his midfielders at every opportunity.

Brayden Cook continued his forward role, kicking 3.1 from his 10 disposals in a losing effort, while Lachlan Gollant added 3 for the Crows, including two superb first quarter goals. Adelaide will now face Sturt, who they beat just a week ago, in Sunday's Preliminary Final, with the winner to face off with Glenelg for the premiership.

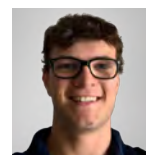

Déjà vu anyone? Just a week ago, the scene was set for a Qualifying Final between these two sides, with Adelaide coming from behind to steal a famous win for the club's brief history. Now, off the back of Adelaide's five-goal loss to Glenelg and Sturt's win over Centrals last week, the two sides meet again, with much more at stake this time around. The loser sees their season come to a disappointing end, while the winner goes through to the big dance, with a date with Glenelg for the flag.

Sturt's clearance work was what had them in front for majority of the contest in the Qualifying Final, but that area dried up when the Crows were able to get first hands on the footy in the second half of that game. Makeshift ruckman Borlase did a great job of assisting his midfielders, and Amos Doyle's untimely injury helped matters for Adelaide as well. Whether it is Borlase again or Kieran Strachan, the Crows will be hoping for a four-quarter performance from their big man to stem Sturt's gritty midfield again.

James Battersby, who finished third in Monday night's Magarey Medal, was electric two weeks ago for the Double Blues, and will need to be at his best again, while his midfield counterpart Tom Lewis, who finished fourth, will also need to be at his best. If the two-gun mids can stifle Adelaide's elite ball accumulation through the middle of the ground, Sturt are a chance of winning through to the Grand Final. Livewire forward Josh Hone must also be better than he was last time against the Crows; he must assist Lachie Burrows up forward with a few goals to put some pressure back on the Adelaide defence, which is littered with AFL experience.

It will be a matchup game more than anything on Sunday. If the Double Blues can win their key matchups, they might be able to build a lead that can't be chased down. Another fast start like last time would really test Adelaide's motor – could they deny Sturt twice in three weeks and book a rematch with the Tigers next week? This should go down to the wire again.

Sturt secure Grand Final berth over Adelaide

Sturt and Adelaide lock horns again in this week's Preliminary Final, with the winner set to take on Glenelg in next Sunday's SANFL Grand Final.

The Double Blues repelled a plucky Central District side in their Semi-Final win on Sunday to record a 32-point win, whilst the Crows were at the mercy of a strong second half performance from the Bays, going on to lose by 32-points in their Semi-Final.

The two sides clash only two weeks after their Qualifying Final encounter, which saw the Crows hunt down the Double Blues in an inspired last quarter to win by seven-points, despite Sturt leading by as much as 35-points early in the second term.

Double Blue Connor McFadyen was a standout for Sturt in its win over the Bulldogs, kicking four goals alongside other multiple goal scorers Josh Hone and James Matthews. Defender Casey Voss led all ball-winners on the ground with 25 disposals, whilst Jared Dakin (23 disposals), Tom Lewis (21 disposals, one goal and 15 tackles) and captain James Battersby (20 disposals) also had strong games.

Sturt won clearances 43-33 and inside 50s 40-38, they also recorded more tackles 77-74 despite owning possession against the Bulldogs 287-228. The Double Blues got off to a strong start kicking three of the first four goals of the game to take a seven-point lead into quarter time.

A goal to Hone to begin the second quarter extended Sturt's margin to 13-points, before back-to-back goals for the Bulldogs tied the game up midway through the term. The Bulldogs had a host of opportunities to extend their margin during a patch which saw them generate five scoring shots in-a-row, only one was a goal as they took a three-point lead into the main break.

Third quarter goals to McFadyen, Joel Thiele and James Richards saw the Double Blues steal back the momentum and hold a four-point lead at three quarter time. It didn't take long for the Double Blues to snuff out any chance the Bulldogs had of a fightback, kicking the opening goal of the final term inside a minute, the first of five unanswered goals as Sturt went on to record a 13.11-89 to 8.9-57 win.

Whilst the Double Blues powered home in their win over the Bulldogs, it was a different story for the Crows who were outscored nine goals to four in the second half against the Bays.

Crows' forwards Brayden Cook and Lachlan Gollant both kicked three goals each in the loss, alongside Isaya McKenzie (two goals). Midfielder Sam Berry (23 disposals and 12 tackles), Will Hamill (21 disposals) and Jackson Hateley (20 disposals and 13 tackles) also toiled hard for the Crows. It was match that saw the Crows smashed in key areas, losing clearances 32-44 and inside 50s 40-51. The Crows uncharacteristically struggled to get their hands on the football, losing the disposal count 264-326. It was a positive start from Adelaide who found themselves with a 19-point lead midway through the first quarter, with Gollant and Cook kicking two goals each.

Three unanswered Glenelg goals saw that margin quickly dwindle away, with the Crows holding a mere two-point advantage at the first change. Gollant and Cook once again registered a goal each early in the second term as Adelaide stretched back out to a 15-point lead, before goals to Matthew Snook and Lachlan Hosie helped Glenelg pull the Crows back, with scores tied at half time.

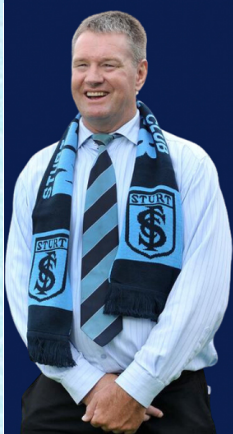
A third quarter onslaught saw the Bays turn the game on its head, kicking five unanswered goals on the way to a 32-point lead at three quarter time. Star key forward Liam McBean handed the Bays another major to begin the final term, as the margin leaked out to a game-high 38-points before back-to-back Adelaide goals kept the game alive. Late goals to Brett Turner and Matthew Allen denied Adelaide any hope of a remarkable comeback, sealing a strong win for the Bays 11.6-72 to 16.8-104.

The Crows matched it with Glenelg for a half of football, but were blown away in the third quarter which was ultimately where the game was lost. Despite losing the Qualifying Final against Adelaide, Sturt enter Sunday's Preliminary Final full of belief following the last quarter demolition job they did on Central District. It's a timely wake-up call for Adelaide, who were beaten in all key areas and must respond to keep its season alive.

Sturt will be relying on the good form of Connor McFadyen, who has kicked seven goals this finals series. Captain James Battersby, Casey Voss, Jared Dakin and Tom Lewis have all been critical to the Double Blues making a Preliminary Final, another strong showing from this quartet will be enough to secure a Grand Final berth for Sturt.

Sturt will continue its run in September, staving off a desperate Adelaide side to book a Grand Final appearance next weekend.
