Two of Collingwood's forwards stood up and put their potential on full display, as Bobby Hill kicked three goals and Dan McStay kicked two. Tom Mitchell also put his best foot forward despite talk of him potentially getting dropped in the preliminary Final to make way for young gun Nick Daicos.

Unfortunately, it was revealed during the week that veteran Taylor Adams will miss the game due to a minor hamstring strain suffered at training, however he is still a slim chance to play the Grand Final given they make it.

GWS have been one of the most inspiring stories this final series, along with Carlton. At the end of round 15, GWS sat 14th on the AFL ladder and were on the verge of missing finals completely. Just three months later they are featuring in the penultimate weekend of AFL footy this season, the most remarkable of stories. After downing the Saints to the tune of 24 points last week, the Giants moved over to Adelaide to take on Port Adelaide at Adelaide Oval.

The match began with a quick goal to Willie Rioli before captain Toby Greene replied with one of his own. The rest of the term followed suit with neither side recording consecutive goals, both finishing with 4 each for the term as the Giants took a 3-point lead into the first break. The second term began much the same way, with Willem Drew and Jesse Hogan exchanging goals, before a Josh Kelly goal gave the Giants the first consecutive goals of the match. The Double Blues got their revenge on the Crows and booked their ticket to the 2023 Hostplus SANFL Grand Final on Sunday against Glenelg, beating Adelaide by 17 points. After another fast start, Sturt were able to hold on this time, fending off any attempted runs by Adelaide to keep a consistent margin throughout the game.

After blowing a huge lead to the Crows a fortnight ago in the Qualifying Final, the Double Blues were determined to not let that happen again, and had Adelaide in a chokehold for much of the contest.

Connor McFayden (2.2) kicked two early goals to set the tone for Sturt, while Oliver Grivell added one to make it three goals to nil at quarter time. Lachie Gollant got things going for Adelaide in the second term, but still the term was split two goals apiece by half time, keeping the three-goal margin.

Matthew Wright, in his 300th game, kicked his second in the third quarter, but small forward Joshua Hone responded with his lone goal for the game to again even things up for the term.

The last quarter saw ruckman Daniel Fahey-Sparks and Jared Dakin kick early goals for the Double Blues to stretch the margin to 33 points and out of reach, before Patrick Arnell, Gollant (2.2) and Wright (3.0) kicked unanswered goals to reduce the final deficit.

Sturt were able to mop up any forward entries for the Crows, defending formidably all game and holding one of the league's most attacking teams to just thirteen scoring shots and six goals.

James Battersby was huge once again, tallying 27 disposals and 8 marks to go with 4 clearances and 3 inside 50's, and his running mate Tom Lewis was also integral, with a monster 24-disposal, 14-tackle and 9-clearance game.

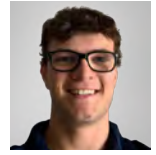

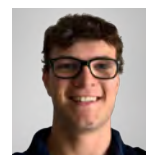

No Amos Doyle hurts the Double Blues, but Fahey-Sparks has stepped up brilliantly in his absence. At just 196cm he is undersized, but his athleticism and work rate are second to none.

Lastly, like always, the game will be won through the middle. Sturt's engine room is in scintillating form this finals series, with James Battersby and Tom Lewis leading the charge. Both boys were top five finishers in the Magarey Medal and have absolutely showcased why in September. They outworked and outmatched Adelaide's elite midfield core on Sunday a large reason why they won the game.

The Tigers' boast a league-best midfield of their own however, with Matthew Snook, Corey Lyons and Luke Martington among others inside a ball-winning coup. Tigers Roar as Glenelg Taste Premiership Success

Following eighteen regular season rounds, and three weeks of finals, it all comes down to this.

Glenelg and Sturt square off in the 2023 SANFL Grand Final at Adelaide Oval on Sunday, and despite the Bays' dominance this season, the Double Blues are a very real chance of taking home the premiership cup.

Sunday will mark the first time Glenelg and Sturt have clashed in a SANFL League Grand Final in almost 50 years – their last encounter on football's biggest day occurring in 1974. Since that day, the Bays have gone on to win three premierships, whilst the Double Blues have since won four, including going back-to-back in 2016-17.

The road to the Grand Final has been completely different for both sides, the Double Blues have been forced to play every week of the finals series as a result of their Qualifying Final loss to Adelaide, whilst the Bays arrive on Grand Final day fresh off a week's rest – and they've more than earned that right.

The Double Blues had the uncertainty of a preliminary final to endure against the Adelaide Crows but dealt with it impressively on their way to a tough 17-point win last Sunday. After kicking the opening three goals of the game, the Double Blues were in the driver's seat early and remained there for the entirety of the match, leading at every break on their way to a 8.12-60 to 6.7-43 win.

Sturt captain James Battersby led from the front for the Double Blues with a game-high 27 disposals (nine tackles), whilst Tom Lewis also produced a starring performance with 24 disposals, 14 tackles and a pivotal goal on the stroke of half time. Connor McFadyen continues to be a strong target up forward for the Double Blues, kicking two goals in the win against the Crows.

Glenelg hit Grand Final day off the back of its 32-point dismissal of Adelaide in the semi-final.

The Bays chased down a 19-point deficit to kick three consecutive goals nearing the end of the first quarter, before evening up the contest at half time. A second half blitz saw the Bays kick nine goals to Adelaide's four, on their way to securing their third Grand Final appearance in five years with a 16.8-104 to 11.6-72 win.

Hard-working midfielder Matthew Snook starred for the Bays with a game-high 25 disposals, 10 clearances and a goal. The dangerous two-pronged threat of Liam McBean and Lachlan Hosie were also crucial with three goals each up forward.

Sunday's Grand Final will be the first time the two sides have met since Glenelg's demolition of Sturt in round nine earlier this year. The Bays kicked seven goals to one in the first term to lead by 37-points at quarter time, and it only got uglier from there with Glenelg cruising to a monster 105-point win at Stratarama Stadium. Glenelg smashed Sturt in disposals (355-264) and dominated inside 50s (59-40) in the 23.12-150 to 6.9-45 shellacking.

It was an anomaly in an otherwise strong season for the Double Blues, who defeated the Bays in their first clash of the season 12.8-80 to 7.7-49 at Wigan Oval.

The Double Blues went on to record a 14-win season and finish second on the SANFL league ladder behind minor premiers Glenelg (15-wins). There is sure to be no 105-point drubbing on Sunday, but it certainly won't be far back in the memory for Sturt players, and can only help further ensure that they bring their absolute best on Sunday.

Glenelg will also need to be switched on from the first bounce, they were able to turn a slow start around against a tired Adelaide side two weeks ago, but will not be offered the same luxury against a relentless Double Blues.

Sturt have had a host of strong contributors this finals series including Battersby and Lewis, whilst Casey Voss and Jared Dakin have also been pivotal to Sturt's run to a Grand Final.

Glenelg's forward line of McBean, Hosie and Luke Reynolds have been strong all season with 140 goals between them, and again will be crucial to the Bays' hopes of premiership success on Sunday.

Expect Sturt to bring the fight to Glenelg, but if the Bays bring the brand of football they have showcased consistently throughout 2023, they should be too strong on Grand Final day.
