

Despite spending the last eight minutes of the game on the bench, De Goey was a real game changer for the Magpies, especially when the Giants had real momentum from halfway through the first quarter, up until the main break.

Good players become great players, if they can perform in finals. De Goey stood up in what was his best game for the season. He managed 34 disposals, but more importantly, a game high 13 clearances. These numbers show why De Goey is a critical cog, in the Collingwood machine. I suspect he will play a massive role again this weekend.

After a week off, the Magpies were able to take momentum early, and apply great pressure around the ball, as the Giants struggled to gain momentum. Despite the strong Collingwood start, the Giants were able to get back into the game and started dominating play. Yet poor goalkicking hurt them early, and allowed Collingwood to control the scoreboard.

Collingwood were tough, had plenty of run and their repeated intercept marks in the last quarter, allowed them to progress through to the big dance.

2023 GRAND FINAL Collingwood v Brisbane



The 2023 AFL Grand Final is a battle between the teams that finished 1 and 2 on the premiership table after the minor round. This does not always occur, but what is generally true is that in finals 'you are what you are.' In other words, it is very difficult to become something new in a four-week period at the end of the season. Habits that have been formed in a preseason creating a game style and that have evolved in the 23 minor rounds are what come to the fore under the extreme pressure of September.

Both teams have impressive forward lines. Indeed, after the minor round the Brisbane offense was ranked 1 and Collingwood were ranked 3. This is unsurprising when you analyse the personnel that Chris Fagan and Craig McRae have at their disposal as well as (for Brisbane) the "fast" conditions of the Gabba.

Joe Daniher and Eric Hipwood are a formidable tall forward combination. Even though they are both over 200 centimetres they are excellent athletes who hit up to the logos but are also quick to work back to forward 50. Joe Daniher has also contributed well as the second ruck man when required. This additional string to his bow enables Oscar McInerney to either rest or move forward as he did to great effect in the Preliminary Final on Saturday night. The tall forwards willingness to work up the ground at times gives Charlie Cameron the entire inside 50 to work in.

This is a nightmare for any one-on-one defender. Cameron is ever present and needs only minimal opportunities to have an impact on any game. Lincoln McCarthy and Cam Rayner are also important in the Brisbane forward half. They are both excellent overheads, can stand in a tackle and create considerable forward half tackling pressure. Zac Bailey also provides pace and class in the forward half as well as when he occasionally goes into the midfield.

In some ways the Collingwood forward half is a contrast to that of Brisbane. While there is some undoubted class in there it has a more 'workman like' feel to it. They have many avenues to goal, and all play their role to great effect.

Brody Mihocek is a tireless worker, offering an excellent target and is rarely out marked. Jamie Elliott is a class act who is a difficult matchup. His ability to mark the ball is exceptional and his clutch goal kicking has been on show over the last two seasons. Bobby Hill and Beau McCreery provide explosive up and back pace and spark as well as defensive pressure.

The other point of difference is that the Collingwood midfielders tend to hit the scoreboard more consistently than their Brisbane counterparts and goal kicking contributions from the Daicos brothers and Jordan De Goey may prove important on Saturday.

The Collingwood back 7 work very hard to be structurally sound behind the ball. This is important for them to prevent oppositions scoring from turnover, particularly with their aggressive desire to play fast, higher risk corridor football with ball in hand. It is an impressive unit led of course by captain and All-Australian Darcy Moore. Nathan Murphy and Billy Frampton have also proved to be important with their ability to compete against the opposition key forwards at different times this year.

This allows Jeremy Howe to play the key role of intercept defender, a role he plays so spectacularly. He has also been released to go forward at times this season. Isaac Quaynor's development this year has been impressive. He is rarely beaten in a one-on-one contest but also uses the ball very well on the rebound. This can also be said of Brayden Maynard who provides physicality and leadership. I expect Quaynor to play the anchor role and therefore expect him to do the job one-on-one on Charlie Cameron.

A key area of improvement this year for Brisbane was on full show in their Preliminary Final win last Saturday. Their defence held up very well in the first quarter considering the pressure they were put under. Carlton did kick 5 goals, but they had over 20 forward 50 entries. Co-captain Harris Andrews led from the front brilliantly in repelling the Carlton onslaught and not only broke even but won some critical one-on-one contests.

This allowed Keidean Coleman and Connor McKenna to gradually work into the game and become influential in generating drive from half back. Coleman's ball use is elite, and he has licence to bite off plenty with his offensive inside 45° kicking and McKenna can manufacture kicks that hit targets few others can find.

As cliché as it sounds it is highly likely this grand final will be decided in the midfield. Both teams have an excellent mix of inside grunt and outside class. Josh Dunkley's addition to the Brisbane midfield has introduced a critical defensive component, particularly at stoppage. His defensive mindset has allowed Hugh McCluggage and Lachie Neale to provide even more offensive drive. Neale winning the Brownlow for a second time highlights two things. One, the exceptional footballer he is. He just never fumbles! And two, the fact that the greater footballing public probably still underrates him due to him being a little 'off Broadway' in Brisbane. I suspect Dunkley will have a huge role to play blunting the influence of De Goey. Look for him to physically engage De Goey at every opportunity at stoppage.

It starts for the Lions with Oscar McInerney. He is often underestimated but his Preliminary Final performance was evidence of what he can do. He is especially dangerous when he is taking the ball out of the ruck or hitting it long to just get it forward and out of congestion. Darcy Cameron and Mason Cox will need to be at their best to guell McInerney's influence.

Collingwood have many midfield options and although they will no doubt miss the hardness and leadership of Taylor Adams, they are well served by Brownlow Medallist Tom Mitchell and Scott Pendlebury in that regard. It may only be once he retires (which still appears some time off) that the influence and high quality that Pendlebury has been able to maintain over a long period of time will be truly appreciated. Add to this the class of Nick Daicos, the explosiveness of De Goey and the relentless work rate and football IQ of Steele Sidebottom on the wing and it is obvious why the Magpies ability to move the ball quickly has been a feature all year.

The winner of this game cannot be confidently predicted. It is a genuine 50-50 contest. If this game was played 6 weeks ago, I would have tipped Collingwood, but their form in the last 6 weeks has dropped off just a touch. It also appears that Brisbane have genuine belief that this is their time. If pressed for a tip I am saying Brisbane, but not by a lot. Either way I am expecting this to be a high-quality game and a great grand final that will be in the balance for much of the day.

However, Toby Greene kicked a goal in the opening minutes to stretch the lead to 16 points, making it slightly harder for Collingwood. After the ball being stuck in the Giants forward half for 10 minutes, Collingwood found the ball down their end and resulted in a Bobby Hill goal to spark some fire and momentum into the Magpies out-fit. Dan McStay kicked his second just minutes later, before the momentum took over and Collingwood kicked 3 of the last 4 goals of the term to snatch the lead, taking a 4-point lead into the final term, making for the most exciting of last terms.

The Lions are the only team to make finals in all of the last five seasons, however have only made it as far as the Prelim finals. The match began and Carlton come storming out of the gates, with Matt Cottrell kicking a goal in the opening minute to set the Blues on track early. Harry McKay then kicked truly to give the blues a 13-point margin 10 minutes into the match, before goals to Jack Martin and Sam Docherty lifted the Carlton crowd from their seats as they jumped to a 24-point lead very early in the contest. A goal to Coleman Medallist Charlie Curnow set the crowd alight, as Carlton entered the first term with all the momentum and a 23-point lead, much to the shock of not only the Lions fans, but the majority of AFL fans around the country.

A captain's goal to Patrick Cripps gave the Blues some breathing space again, before the floodgates opened at the other end. The Lions kicked three more goals in the term to snatch the lead back right before half time, heading into the main break with a 3-point lead, against all odds after the onslaught that was Carlton in the first term.

The third term started similar to the second, with Brisbane kicking two goals in the opening four minutes to extend their lead to 15 points early in the term. Carlton (40) def by Richmond (47)



Gold Coast (48) def Western Bulldogs (44)







The Tigers stamped their names into the history books on Sunday, winning their sixth SANFL premiership by 24 points over Sturt in an enthralling contest. Glenelg started strongly, kicking the first four goals of the game, and never looked back, keeping their distance despite some Sturt runs in the second half to cap off a remarkable year for the club.

Ken Farmer Medallist Lachie Hosie added to his resume in 2023, booting six goals to win the Jack Oatey Medal for best afield in the emphatic win. Hosie got the Tigers started with a tough snap from the boundary, and could not be stopped all game long, adding 12 disposals and winning 4 free kicks to aid his team.

Corey Lyons was also excellent in the win, amassing 28 touches and adding a goal to go with his monster 8 clearance, 7 inside 50 midfield performance, while Matthew Snook laid a whopping 15 tackles to pair with his 26 disposals and 6 clearances.

The game looked all but over early when Glenelg kicked the only four goals of the first quarter, but around the ground Sturt hadn't been outplayed – they missed three very gettable goals with two hitting the post in the first term which could have made the contest a lot more intriguing. In fact, it took them six behinds and eight minutes into the second term to register a major, through Oliver Grivell, before Glenelg again answered to go into half time up 29 points.

Sturt's glaring issue was their exit out of their defensive 50. Their rebounds were off target and ended up gifting Glenelg second and third chances to get the ball back inside; this was a product of the Tigers high-end forward pressure, forcing turnovers. It often wasn't the first inside 50 that Glenelg capitalised on, more so the repeat entries they would consistently get all contest long

Though, Will Coomblas was epic for Sturt in the back half, and although his disposal efficiency wasn't up to standard, he stopped multiple Glenelg surges by himself, and even snuck forward for a huge goal in the third quarter.

The Double Blues were right in the contest in the middle of the ground, with their engine room matching it with Glenelg's clearance for clearance.
