Gold Coast (99) def West Coast Eagles (26)

It was a decimation by Gold Coast who responded after their close loss last week to win by a massive 73 points. It was several minutes before West Coast were able to score their first point, and they could do little to stop Gold Coast piling on the goals with every quarter. Gold Coast completely dominated the clearances, winning them 43-16, and forward Jamie Stanton celebrated her 50th game with a bag of six goals. It was Gold Coast's biggest score in its history and the third biggest in the AFLW.

To add further pain to the loss, midfielder Gabby O'Sullivan left the field with a dislocated shoulder after an injury interrupted season seven.
