Hawthorn (11) def by Melbourne (70)

Melbourne have made it an astounding 13 wins in a row in emphatic fashion with a 59-point thrashing over Hawthorn. The work rate of the Hawks was not fairly reflected on the scoreboard, but the skill of Melbourne was a few classes above the new expansion side. It took until the 6-minute mark of the third quarter for the Hawks to get their first and only goal of the game despite winning the inside 50s by one, with the Dees demonstrating they are just as powerful in defence as they are attack. Now sitting on the top of the ladder the chances of going back to back for Melbourne are looking more likely with each passing week.

Carlton (40) def by Richmond (47)


Richmond are beginning to get a reputation as the comeback queens after another come from behind victory, this week against Carlton by 7 points. The Tigers had a better start and held a 11-point lead at quarter time but were then held goalless by the Blues until the final quarter after they dragged the Tigers back into a highly contested game. But the final quarter well and truly belonged to the yellow and black, kicking three goals to one. It was a great joy to fans when the two skippers, Peterson and Brennan were matched up on each other after Brennan kicked two early goals, with Blue's skipper winning battle and curving Brennan's influence after the move.

Sydney (34) def West Coast (21)

Sydney notched up their second AFLW win this weekend against the struggling Eagles by 13 points. West Coast fought back midway through game kicking a goal on either side of half time, but the Swans were able to steady and secured the win in the last quarter. The Eagles showed some improvement, but kicked 9 behinds which prevented them putting any scoreboard pressure on the Swans. Chloe Molloy kicked a crucial goal for the Swans with a great snap from the boundary after a smoother, while ruckman Ally Morphett had a huge 34 hitouts and 10 clearances.

North Melbourne (33) def by Brisbane (35)

Brisbane put an end to North's winning streak with a heartbreaking 2-point victory. Brisbane had only kicked one point up until the 15-minute mark of the second quarter, but then stormed home to keep their undefeated streak against the Roos alive. A goal with only 5 minutes left to play put Brisbane in front for the first time, and tough defence in the final minute ensured that North did not have a clear

St Kilda (47) def Collingwood (35)

In the best comeback win of the season so far, the Saints kicked five fourth quarter goals to defeat Collingwood by 12 points. The Saints were scoreless in the first quarter, and it appeared was going to be a win to the Pies but the Saints clawed their way back into the game thanks to astounding tackling pressure to keep the Pies goalless in the second and fourth terms. The Pies held the lead by 25 points early in the third but then a string of six goals saw the Saints steal away the win. It was the traded players who were the ones to watch with Jaimee Lambert, now at the Saints, and Tarni White, now at Collingwood, kicking goals at crucial moments.

Essendon (50) def Fremantle (30)

Essendon are starting to present themselves as a contender in only their second season in the AFLW after a solid 20-point victory over Fremantle. The Bombers were able to stamp their dominance over the game in the second half, kicking five of the last seven goals. Gold Coast (48) def Western Bulldogs (44)





Match Summary

Round 4: Port Adelaide (42) def by Geelong (70)

A slow start proved very costly for Port Adelaide as they went down to Geelong at home by 28 points. It was a game of two halves, with the Power having opportunities for a comeback but inaccurate kicking preventing any chance of a win.

The first half was all about Geelong with their rebound from defence setting up all the play and poking holes in Port's team defence. But after half time Port got their surge footy game going in an impressive response to a disappointing first half.

Port started the game on the front foot, getting the first clearance and forward 50 entries, but Geelong were able to make more of their opportunities, dominating the uncontested ball and kicking all four goals of the opening term. Port struggled to get the contest first, and were outmuscled at centre clearance.

The second quarter was much like the first, with the Geelong forwards strong in the air and on the ground to kick the first three goals. But when Port did get it forward, they looked dangerous and finally got reward from effort with the side's first goal just before half time to Gemma Houghton. Port came out firing in the third, with a goal to Ash Saint within 30 seconds, but the Cats defence forced them to make mistakes inside 50 and they only kicked one more goal for the guarter despite their dominance.
