The third quarter saw a fierce battle between the two teams, with Sacred Heart OC holding onto a slim 5-point lead as Payneham NU put up a strong fight.



At the start of the season, all the hype was about Eastern Park and rightly so. They had recruited some big names and had a lot of players returning. Salisbury, we didn't hear much about, but we all knew they had recruited well. We probably knew as far back as March that Salisbury and Eastern Park would be around when the whips were cracking in September.

Salisbury has been the silent assassins. They went through the minor round with a faultless record of 18-0. Eastern Park by contrast only lost the two games.

During the season the two combatants first met at Salisbury Oval in Round 8. It was a much anticipated clash to see who might take favouritism for the flag. Only 14 points separated the two northern suburbs clubs, and we learned not much. Eastern Park had the extra scoring shot than the Magpies. But other than that, the premiership race was still wide open.

But again it was Salisbury who held sway by 26 points. Unlike the first clash, it was Salisbury who were clearly the better side. They looked better with their system up forward and through the midfield. The two guns on the Eastern Park side didn't get off the leash and kick a "bag". Mansell kicked 4 and Knapp kicked 3.

This was always going to be the big question? How do the Magpies stop these two stars from kicking a swag of goals? This season it's been Shawn Mansell with 127 goals and the superstar Chris Knapp with 107 goals.

One thing is for sure, and that Eastern Park will need to find more avenues to goal than just Mansell, Knapp and McCormick-Smith to win.

This game is nearly impossible to pick a winner. But in the end, we chose Salisbury, based on their speed on a big ground and their ability to kick goals from a variety of players. This game should be an absolute cracker.






Both sides come into this clash with strong form lines. Salisbury's only loss for the season was in Round 17 against Eastern Park at Dwight Reserve by 35 points.




