Port District faced off against Payneham Norwood Union at Campbelltown Oval in what turned out to be a thrilling match until the final quarter. After which Port District took total control of the contest. We thought Port District would win and tipped them in our previews last weekend. But nothing prepared us for the onslaught that happened in the final 27 minutes of play.

The first quarter saw Payneham Norwood Union take an early lead, with a score of 3.4 (22) to Port District's 2.2 (14), giving them an 8-point advantage at quarter time.



However, Port District fought back in the second quarter, outscoring Payneham Norwood Union to take the lead with a scoreline of 5.6 (36) to 4.4 (28), maintaining their 8-point lead going into halftime. The match was evenly poised, with both teams vying for control.



In the third quarter, Port District managed to hold their slender lead at the last change. The Magpies led 8.7 (55) against Payneham Norwood Union's 7.6 (48) at lemon time, holding a 7-point advantage heading into the final quarter. The pressure was on for both teams to finish strong.

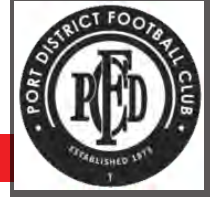

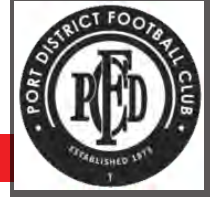

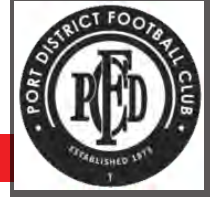

For Glenunga it was Charlie Pridham, Harry Prosser, Lincoln Bennett, Michael McMahon and Abe Davis amongst their better players. Again multiple goal kickers with Michael McMahon, Harry Prosser and Beau Schwarze all kicking 3 goals, and others with 2 goals each.

There was already a pattern starting to develop. Port District rely heavily on their top 8 players to get them over the line and Glenunga don't. The same as the goal kicking. Glenunga has a better spread across the board. It's much harder to shut down the Port District forward line than the Rams forwards. The Rams have more ways of hurting you on the scoreboard.

Then came to shambles of the Qualifying Final, when Port Districts embarrassed themselves at Webb Oval and were humbled by a whopping 74 points. This time it was Cooper Gaffney, Matthew Rose, Sam Gray, Jack Gaffney and Miller Carter amongst the best. 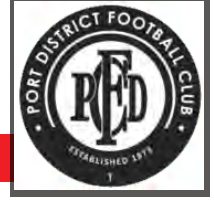

Sean Davidson as captain and Doug Greig as the vice-captain both need to step up. Far too many of their mid-range players are coasting and thinking their top players will do all of the hard lifting. Glenunga have a greater spread of good players and they aren't totally reliant on Davis and three or four others who are their genuine stars. They get good performances from their mid range players, where Port District don't.

Port District also needs to find more avenues to goal. The only way that Port District will beat Glenunga is to kick more than 100 points. That's 15 goals. If they can't kick that many goals, they've no hope as the Rams have too many options both up forward and their midfield and on ballers drifting forwards.

Whilst it might be easy to select Glenunga based on form during the season and their head-to-head battles with Port District. It's for the reasons we've highlighted. There is no magical reason for us to tip the Rams to win, other than they get better performances across the board from their players and a more even spread of goal-kickers.

For Port District to have any chance of reversing any of the results from 2024, they need their leaders and mid-range players to do what they haven't done often enough against tough opposition. And that's to dominate games and to spread the load so their superstars do feel like the weight of the Largs faithful falls on their shoulders.
