

DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 1 REVIEW

Payneham 9.7 (61) def Prince Alfred 8.7 (55)

Payneham began their 2022 campaign in the right column on Saturday, holding off a brave Prince Alfred outfit by six points after the visitors clawed their way back from four goals down to nearly snatch the road win. The home team started with a bang opening up a 21-point half time margin that looked secure, until a stunning third quarter turnaround levelled the scores with a term to play, before the eventual single digit victory gave Payneham the result they were after. Ben Sawford, Matt Nye and Jacob Campbell were among the winning side's best on the day, while Harrison Viney kicked four goals to steady the ship. For the visitors, Mitch Larsson, Sam Buckham and Jack Trengove were vital but couldn't quite get their side over the line.

Brighton 11.8 (74) def Goodwood 8.16 (64)

The Bombers opened up the season with the premiership points as they made the most of their chances in front of goal to win by ten points against an inaccurate Saints side. The home side can count their lucky stars as the visitors kicked sixteen behinds that proved pivotal in the closing result of this game. The tone of the game was set in the first half as Goodwood kicked 1.10 to Brighton's 4.4 at half time, and they never recovered from there. Thomas Welsby led all scorers with three goals for the home side, while Jordan Weetra and Justin Evans were also instrumental for the Bombers. Goodwood were led by Oliver Johnson and Nicholas Burgess, and will walk away from this contest thinking they should have won had they kicked straight.

Tea Tree Gully 15.8 (98) def Old Ignatians 12.8 (80)

A huge last quarter surge by the home side saw Tea Tree Gully overrun Old Ignatians on Saturday, after the Gullies trailed by fourteen points and staring down the barrel heading into the final quarter of play. Both teams started strongly with things locked away at quarter time, before the visitors opened a fifteen-point half time advantage and some breathing room before the home side flexed their muscles in a blistering final term display. Tyler West booted four goals while Alex McKay and Peter Persinos added three each for Tea Tree Gully, while Ryan Spittle and Jordan Persinos were also crucial for the 18-point victors. Bradley Jones and Domonic Grant both kicked three for Old Ignatians, while the visitors were aided by the performances of James Kennedy and Hugh Ferrari.

Port District 10.5 (65) def Glenunga 3.3 (21)

It was a dominant round 1 performance for Port District as they kept Glenunga goal-less in the second half to run away 44-point winners on Saturday. With just four points the difference at the main break, this contest loomed to be a close finish, before the home side piled on seven unanswered second half goals to put this one to bed. The big win sees Port District carry all the momentum into round 2, with their match going exactly how they would have wanted it to off the back of a long preseason. Benjamin Goold and Jason Nyskohus were the home side's best, while Dale Pearce slotted three goals in the win. For the visitors, there was not much to write home about, but the performances of Samuel Parsons and Thomas Bielby were among their teams' best in their dismal start to 2022.

St Peters 24.14 (158) def Rostrevor 11.7 (73)

In what started out as a good contest turned into a blowout as St Peters dismantled the visiting Rostrevor by 85 points on Saturday. The away team actually led this one at quarter time by four points but seemed to peak too early as from that point forward it was all the home side. Rostrevor booted

six of their eleven goals in that opening term to St Peters five, with just the five goals for the remainder of the game as opposed to St Peters nineteen the telling difference. Jake Sutcliffe netted his first bag of the season with five goals for the winning team, while Mason Neagle, Lachie De Cesare and Jordan Lockwood were all dominant. Will Mead and Mitchell Carroll helped carry the load for Rostrevor in what was otherwise a disappointing start to their campaign.

ROUND 2 PREVIEW

Tea Tree Gully v Port District

Round 2 opens up with a clash of two unbeaten teams, who both showed class in their respective season opening wins. Tea Tree Gully left it late to overpower their opponents, with a last quarter barrage giving them breathing room, while Port District held their opponents to a zero-goal second half, leaving them with a comprehensive victory at home. This should be a good contest, with both sides carrying momentum over, but the Gullies will be tough to stop at home as they look to gain an early advantage among this tough division 1 crop.

Glenunga v St Peters

Glenunga were beaten badly last week by a strong Port Districts side, but at home this week they have a chance to avenge their poor performance. Unfortunately, it will not come easily at the hands of the early leaders St Peters, who were a class above in their dominant round 1 victory. The home ground advantage gives Glenunga a slightly better chance, but the result could be eerily similar if St Peters continue their scintillating form.

Rostrevor v Brighton

It was a tale of two different Rostrevor sides in round 1 – the one that was leading at quarter time, and the one that was outscored by fourteen goals from that point forward. Home this week, Rostrevor will need to tap in to that side that was competitive last week if they are to escape the 0-2 start, and they will have their work cut out for them against a charging Brighton side that held strong at home last week. Although, the Bombers cannot continue to rely on their opponents' poor accuracy in front of goals.

Prince Alfred v Old Ignatians

Prince Alfred were narrowly beaten on the road last week, which leaves us with promising signs that they can get the job done at home this week. Their third quarter performance against Payneham last week almost changed the game for them, and four quarters like that one should see them record their first win of the year this week against an Old Ignatians in the same boat at 0-1. They were strong for three quarters of their performance against Tea Tree Gully but let it slip in the final term which ultimately led to the loss. The first win of the season is up for grabs for both teams this week, so there is a lot to play for.

Goodwood v Payneham

Lastly, Goodwood host Payneham in what should be another good game of footy. Payneham narrowly won at home and will be looking to build from that performance, while Goodwood should have won based on their number of shots on goal. Another 1.10 half will not cut it against a 1-0 Payneham, so the home side will need to perfect their goalkicking if they are to move to 1-1 this week.

Review:




