ROUND 2 REVIEW

Tea Tree Gully 14.18 (102) def Port District 14.13 (97) Pertaringa Oval

It was a shaky finish for the Gullies, but a win nonetheless as Tea Tree Gully move to 2-0 on the season, narrowly edging out Port District by five points. Trailing by ten at three quarter time, it looked like a stunning road victory for Port District, before a five goal avalanche in the last term saw the home side snatch the victory late. Brodie Latham, Tyler West and Peter Persinos all kicked three goals for the victors, while Jordan Persinos and Blake Penney were the Gullies' best. Dale Pearce led his side with three goals while also producing a best afield performance for the visitors, as Port District move to 1-1 on the year.

Glenunga 11.7 (73) def by St Peters 11.12 (78) Webb Oval

A last quarter failure has seen Glenunga fall to 0-2 in 2022, with St Peters staying unbeaten with an epic comeback late on Saturday. After leading for pretty much the whole game, the home side could not close it out, with a goalless last term opening the door for the visiting St Peters to steal the game. A fast start saw Glenunga take an early lead, one which they held steadily for three quarters, before the last quarter stage fright cost them a vital home win. For St Peters, Edward Allan and Bradley Coulson were instrumental in their second win on the trot, while Jake Sutcliffe paced their scoring with three goals. The home team's best were D'Arcy Mitchell and Zac Smith, with Nick Wundke (4 goals) also a standout.

Rostrevor 12.9 (81) def Brighton 8.13 (61) Campbelltown Memorial Oval

Rostrevor recorded their first win of the season on Saturday, taking care of the Bombers by 20 points. The margin was made respectable in the last quarter, as Brighton outscored Rostrevor by 17 points in the period to close the 37-point three quarter time deficit. The home side jumped out to a 35-9 lead at quarter time, and although Brighton hit back in the second term, Rostrevor were able to steer away in the third to put this one to rest. Patrick Dawson led all scorers on the ground with four goals for the winners, while Tullio De Matteis and Hayden Swanbury were among Rostrevor's best. Tim Dickson and Harrison Boyle were the Bombers' best, who fell to 1-1 with the loss.

Prince Alfred 9.13 (67) def Old Ignatians 8.8 (56) Park 9

Old Ignatians couldn't quite finish the job on the road on Saturday, losing their second straight game as the home side Prince Alfred won their first game of the year by eleven points. It was close for the entirety of the match, with the largest lead at any break the final margin of eleven. Will Dalwood and Chris Curran led the home side to victory, who needed this win desperately to kickstart their year. Unfortunately for Old Ignatians, it was their second narrow loss in a row, and if they had finished strongly both games they could have easily been 2-0. Kristian Roocke and William Abbott tried their best to get the visitors over the line but were ultimately denied.

Goodwood 14.17 (101) def Payneham 10.9 (69) Goodwood Oval

Goodwood recorded their first win of the season in emphatic fashion, running over the fast-starting Payneham by 32 points on Saturday. The visitors jumped out to a three-goal lead at the first change, and still led at the main break by four points, but a second half onslaught of goals by the home side

ROUND 3 PREVIEW

St Peters v Tea Tree Gully St Peters College

In what looms as the game of the round, the only two unbeaten sides left face off for the chance to claim a chokehold on the top spot. Tea Tree Gully have relied on big second halves to get them over the line in both games this season, but will need a full four-quarter performance if they are any chance of knocking off St Peters on the road this week. After a dominant round one win, St Peters had to do it the hard way on the road last week, rallying late to steal the win at Glenunga. Both sides were well off their best footy last week, and will both be looking to stay unbeaten with full performances this week. Should be a cracker.

Old Ignatians v Goodwood Karen Rolton Oval

Old Ignatians have been very unlucky thus far, playing good footy early and then fading late, losing both games off the back of poor fourth quarters. At home for the first time this year, they will be looking to register their first W, but it won't be easy against a Goodwood side that dominated in the second half last week to storm home to victory. Goodwood must start kicking accurately soon if they are to be winning consistently, and for their sake hopefully that starts this week.

Port District v Prince Alfred Largs Reserve

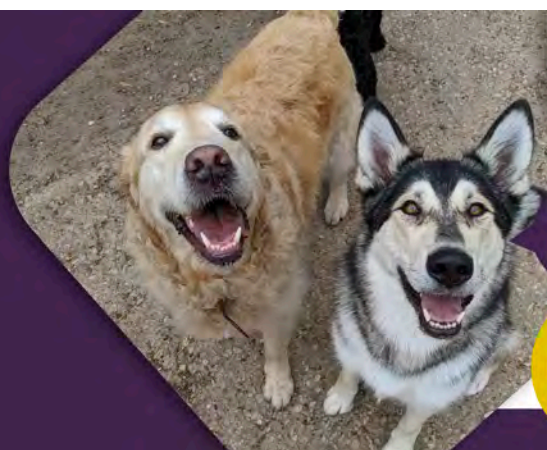

Based on form, Port District look like the better side coming into this clash, and the home ground advantage will play a huge part, even though Prince Alfred have shown glimpses of being a formidable opponent.

Brighton v Payneham Brighton Oval

Both teams are in a very similar spot. Having both won in round one, and then simultaneously both losing last week, their respective 1-1 records mean there's a lot to play for this week. To get back to a winning record is vital early on in the season, as it can set you apart from other sides. At home, Brighton are yet to lose, and will be looking to use that to their advantage, but Payneham, although they were smashed in the last quarter on Saturday, were very competitive on the road and won't go out easy.

Rostrevor v Glenunga Campbelltown Memorial Oval

Glenunga showed serious improvement from round one to last week, almost beating ladder leaders St Peters at home, but their inability to finish the game hurt them badly, and another late game failure this week will be costly. Rostrevor got up on the weekend for their first in the win column, beating Brighton in a game where they were barely challenged. At home again this week, they have a chance to build a winning streak and distance themselves from a couple clubs early, and if last week is anything to go by, they should.

Unley Mercedes Jets v Sacred Heart OC



Walkerville 28.12-180 def Mitcham 13.10-88

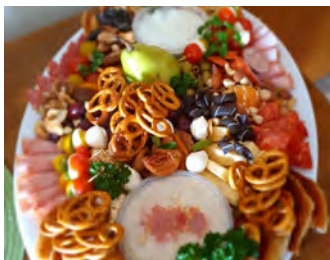
