

DIVISION 1 GRAND FINAL REVIEW

Payneham 6.11 (47) def by Old Ignatians 11.12 (78)

A massive road win from Old Ignatians sees them string together a couple impressive performances to keep them with the pack after four rounds. The 31-point win was a statement victory, one in which they led at all changes and were fairly accurate apart from a 1.5 last quarter. Will Abbott continued his excellent season with another best afield performance for the winning side, simultaneously leading all goal scorers with three, while Brad McKenzie (3 goals) and Max Wagner were Payneham's best, with the loss slumping them to bottom place on percentage.

Tea Tree Gully 9.10 (64) def by Rostrevor 12.13 (85)

The upset of the round occurred at Pertaringa Oval on Saturday as the struggling Rostrevor side pulled off an incredible second half performance to stun the previously unbeaten Tea Tree Gully outfit by 21 points on the road. It was seemingly smooth sailing for the Gullies at half time when they led by 20 points, with a fourth consecutive win looming, before a remarkable second half collapse saw the home side manage just two goals to Rostrevor's eight to completely shift the game. Nicholas Murphy booted five goals for the visitors, while Dylan Reinbrecht was stellar as Rostrevor gained some much-needed momentum to get their season rolling. The shellshocked Gullies remain equal first on points but will need to avenge this disappointing home loss next week.

Prince Alfred 8.5 (53) def by St Peters 12.15 (87)

The now equal ladder leaders flexed their muscles in a big way on Saturday, taking care of Prince Alfred on their own deck by 34 points in a dominant display. Apart from a five goal third quarter from the home side, St Peters were barely challenged, and had it not been for inaccuracy in front of goal this could have been a much larger deficit. Jock McLeay booted six goals to set the tone for the winning side, while Jesse O'Brien and Toby Schulz were also pivotal. With just the one win on the season, Prince Alfred sits equal bottom and will need to find something soon before their season slips away.

Goodwood 15.9 (99) def Port District 11.10 (76)

Goodwood stopped a rampant Port District squad dead in their tracks on Saturday, humbling the in-form visitors by 23 points. Port District jumped to an early lead at quarter time, holding the Saints goal-less while scoring three of their own, and still held an eleven-point half time lead, but were run over the top by the home side in the second half, conceding ten majors as Goodwood picked up their second win of the year. Nicholas Burges joined the goalkickers this week with five of his own, while Mason Ellis and Nick Favretto helped change the game for the Saints. Daniel Passaniti was Port District's best, who now sit fourth and with the pack on four points.

Glenunga 12.11 (83) def Brighton 7.7 (49)

The Rams have completely turned their season around in the last fortnight with two vital wins, including Saturday's 34-point win over the visiting Bombers. An inaccurate first quarter kept the away team in it early, but from that point forward Glenunga were just clinical, never really faulting en route to the classy home win, their second victory on the trot. A win would have seen Brighton join the ladder leaders Tea Tree Gully and St Peters, but alas their 2-2 record sees them sit amongst the pack after a month of footy. It was business as usual for Michael McMahon (4 goals) and Zac Smith (5 votes) who aided the big win for Glenunga.

Glenunga v Tea Tree Gully

The matchup between the Rams and Gullies this week looms as the game of the round and could easily go either way. Tea Tree Gully were shellshocked on their home turf last week and are proven beatable, but will be hungry to avenge that loss this week on the road against a surging Glenunga side that have won two in a row and are in scintillating form. At home, the Rams will go in with serious momentum, but the Gullies have been very good thus far in 2022 so it is very hard to pick a winner.

Port District v Payneham

Port District were trounced last week at the hands of the Saints, putting an end to their good run of form. Back at home this week, Port District should enjoy an easier opponent in Payneham, who have struggled to put together a full four-quarter performance as of yet. An upset is always on the cards, but I think Port District should get back to their winning ways at home this week.

St Peters v Goodwood

Both sides are coming off impressive wins last round, with St Peters dominating on the road and Goodwood coming from behind at home to gain some momentum. It will be very tough for the Saints walking onto St Peters home park, but their recent from suggests they are a chance. Still, I think the home advantage plays a big factor here, and St Peters should hold strong a claim top spot.

Rostrevor v Prince Alfred

Rostrevor are coming off the upset of the season so far after knocking off a strong Gullies side on the road last week, and will be filled with confidence coming into this week's clash with Prince Alfred. The visitors haven't had the best start to 2022, winning just one from their four games, and need a lift from somewhere to get their season rolling. A road win against a confident Rostrevor would do wonders for their year, but it will be a tough ask.

Brighton v Old Ignatians

The Bombers have been unpredictable this season, winning some big games and losing others. At home, they will have the advantage, but will need to find their good form that saw them win two games, rather than last week's form where they were beaten badly by the Rams. Old Ignatians have strung some good performances together and sit in fourth place and need to win this match to gain a stronghold on a finals spot early. This should be another good match, but I have Old Ignatians just edging the home side in this one.

DIVISION 2 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

Henley v North Haven

North Haven have continued their unbeaten start to the season, defeating Henley by 22 points at Henley Memorial Oval. North Haven got off to a strong start, taking a three-goal lead into the first change before the Sharks stood firm in the second term, cutting the margin back to 13 points but rueing inaccuracy in front of goal that could have trimmed the lead even further. Henley's woes in front of the big sticks continued in the third term, unable to kick a goal as the Magpies piled on four of their own to take an unassailable 40-point lead into the final change. Unley Mercedes Jets have recorded their first win of the season, defeating Salisbury North by 26 points in front of their home fans at Kingswood Oval. REVIEWS:
