ROUND 6

Payneham 4.11 (35) def by St Peters 6.15 (51)

St Peters continued their successful start to the season, taking care of Payneham in an abysmal goalkicking display for both sides. The visitors hold equal top spot with a 4-2 record through six games, while the home side slumped to 1-5, the only side with less than two wins. The tone was set at quarter time when there were a combined eleven scoring shots, with just one goal kicked between the two sides (1.4 to 0.6). But it was the second quarter where St Peters were able to pull away, kicking four goals in the period to sustain a 22-point half time lead, one that was never really challenged from there on out. Spearhead Jock McLeay once again led all goal scorers with three majors, while Toby Schulz picked up best on ground honours.

Prince Alfred 10.13 (73) def Glenunga 3.13 (31)

The home side pulled off a big upset on the weekend, picking up their second win of the season and subsequently halting Glenunga's scintillating run of form dead in its tracks. Albeit the Rams were appalling in front of goal with thirteen behinds and just the three goals, but the fact that it took them a half to kick their first goal did not do them any favours either. The game was over by half time, with Prince Alfred's 43-point lead at the main break proving too much for the in-form Rams. The winning side shared their goalkickers, while Chris Curran and Hayden Jolly were their best.

Goodwood 11.18 (84) def Rostrevor 11.8 (74)

The Saints added another scalp to their winning streak on Saturday, coming from behind to fend off a valiant Rostrevor outfit by ten points. Goodwood had ten more scoring shots than their opponent, so the winning margin perhaps should have been larger, yet it still took the home side three quarters to take the lead. Nicholas Burgess (4 goals) and Nick Favretto (5 votes) willed their side to victory, the Saints' fourth of the season, while Nick Murphy (4 goals) and James Buttersworth did all they could for Rostrevor, with the loss moving them to 3-3 and in seventh spot.

Tea Tree Gully 15.11 (101) def Brighton Bombers 13.14 (92)

After two consecutive losses, the Gullies got back on track on Saturday, holding off the Bombers by just nine points at home. Another upset was looming at half time when Brighton led by a point, but the home side gained control in the premiership quarter and never looked back, sustaining their narrow lead throughout the second half to seal their fourth win. Brodie Latham booted three goals for the Gullies, while Dylan Schoenmakers was best on ground. As for Brighton, this was their big chance to get back in touch with the rest of the competitive sides, with the loss leaving them two wins from the top four. Harrison Boyle kicked three for the Bombers and was ultimately their best performing player in the loss.

Old Ignatians 8.6 (54) def by Port District 9.14 (68)

Port District got a vital win on the road to bolster their finals chances against a strong Old Ignatians side, with the fourteen-point win leaving the winners equal top through six rounds. It was a hard-fought game, with the lower scoring affair a testament to how competitive both sides are, and it wasn't until a mini-surge in the second half by Port District that the game opened up after the scores were level at half time. It was familiar faces on the best players list for both sides, with Jason Nyskohus the best for Port District, and Will Abbott Old Ignatians' best.

REVIEWS:
