





DIVISION 1 DEWEWS AND PREWEWS

ROUND 7

Rostrevor 13.16 (94) def Payneham 8.8 (56)

Rostrevor took care of the lowly Payneham on the weekend, putting together a full four-quarter performance to win by 38 points and edge closer to the top four. Aided by a seven goal second half, the home side was able to claim their fourth win of the season and move into fifth spot, while the Magpies remain on just the one win. Paul Fantasia and Nicholas Murphy both snagged four goals, while Will Mead was named best afield for the winning side.

St Peters 18.11 (119) def Old Ignatians 7.9 (51)

It was an old fashioned bludgeoning at St Peters on Saturday, with the home side dominating Old Ignatians by 68 points. The visitors were leading at half time, and only trailed by 20 points at the main break, but a six goal to zero third term blew the game wide open, and from there the home team never looked back. Jock McLeay led the charge in front of goal with four majors, and James Hargreaves put on a best-on-ground performance. The win sees St Peters sit equal first with a 5-2 record, while Old Ignatians continue to fall down the ladder with a 3-4 record.

Brighton 6.8 (44) def by Port District 10.7 (67)

The Bombers struggled yet again at home on the weekend at the hands of a well-oiled Port District side that continue to sit pretty atop the ladder. It took Brighton a quarter to register a goal and by then it was too late as the visitors ran away with it after half time. Sitting second on percentage, Port District have looked clinical in their 5-2 start, and should be poised for a finals berth at this rate. Jason Nyskohus (3 goals, 5 votes) was pivotal for the winning side.

Glenunga 10.8 (68) def by Goodwood 11.13 (79)

The Rams were shocked on their home deck on Saturday, as the Saints continued their excellent form of late to claim a massive road win that could go a long way to settling a finals berth. The game was knotted for much of the contest, before a late burst saw Goodwood pull away just enough to hold on by eleven points. Tom Anderson (4 goals, 5 votes) was the difference maker for Goodwood, as they moved to a commanding 5-2 record through seven rounds. The Rams, after their good start, have dropped a couple recently to fall to 3-4, and will need to lift soon to get their season back on track.

Tea Tree Gully 14.10 (94) def Prince Alfred 12.12 (84)

The Gullies left it late to pull away from a valiant visiting Prince Alfred outfit, holding off the latter by ten points on Saturday. The home win saw the Gullies move to 5-2, a record that equals them with three other clubs in first place. It was close the whole way through, with three points the biggest margin at any quarter break until the final siren, and with both sides having the same coring shots, the result could have gone either way had Prince Alfred been a bit more accurate. Ryan Splittle booted five goals and was named best on ground in the vital win for Tea Tree Gully, while Prince Alfred will be ruing what could have been an important upset win that would have helped turned their year around.

Goodwood v Tea Tree Gully

This could be the game of the round, with a chance to cement a top spot up for grabs. With both sides knotted at 5-2, this game will be telling to see where both teams sit, with this top of the table clash taking place at Goodwood on Saturday. Home ground advantage is always massive, but can the Saints capitalise on this, or will the Gullies claim a huge scalp on the road.

Prince Alfred v Brighton

As opposed to the prior match, this one will be competitive for a different reason. Eighth plays ninth, with both sides sitting on a 2-5 record, and a win here could be crucial for turning a season around. At home, Prince Alfred would be favourites, especially after their near upset win against Tea Tree Gully last week, but Brighton at their best can compete with any team, so don't write them off just yet.

Payneham v Glenunga

The bottom-placed Payneham struggled yet again on the weekend and are on the brink of writing off their season entirely at 1-6, so they need to find something soon. Glenunga have hit a dry spell, losing two straight to fall to 3-4, and if there was ever a time for Payneham to pounce on an out-of-form opponent, it would be now. The Magpies will enjoy home ground advantage this week, but the Rams should prove to be too strong, even in poor form, for this lowly Payneham outfit.

Old Ignatians v Rostrevor

These two teams share completely opposite stories of form heading into this week's clash; Old Ignatians started the season on fire but have tailed off of late and have completely fallen out of finals contention, while the visiting Rostrevor have sparked a winning streak and sit just one game out of top position after seven rounds. Back at home, Old Ignatians are every chance of ending their cold spell and getting their season back on track, but with the form Rostrevor are in, it will take a mighty effort from Old Ignatians to action that.

Port District v St Peters

Like the Goodwood-Tea Tree Gully clash, this matchup should also be a classic. Two top four teams in Port District and St Peters will battle it out on Saturday, with Port District the hosts. The two 5-2 teams sit first and second on percentage, and both enjoyed comfortable round seven wins. Port District have been formidable at home, but St Peters are the real deal, and it is almost impossible to pick a winner. Could this be a way-too-early finals preview?

DIVISION 2 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

Salisbury North v Henley

Salisbury North have slumped to their most embarrassing loss of the season, kicking just one goal en route to a 86-point drubbing at then hand of Henley at Salisbury North Oval. After a sloppy first quarter saw just one Henley goal between the two sides the Sharks moved clear in the second term, kicking four goals to one and taking a 32-point lead into quarter time. Flinders Park v Modbury






