ROUND 8

Goodwood 21.11 (137) def Tea Tree Gully 7.8 (50)

The Saints have made a statement to the rest of the league on Saturday, completing dominating fellow finals' fancies Tea Tree Gully by 87 points. The game was all but over by half time, as the home side piled on fourteen first half goals to lead by 61 at the main break. The Gullies somewhat stopped the bleeding in the second half but were ultimately outclassed from the first bounce. Nicholas Burgess and Will Clarke both snagged five goals for the winners, while Nick Favretto put together a pivotal performance to seal his team's place in the top two. With the loss, the Gullies still remain a game clear in fourth, but their form from early-season has seemingly vanished.

Prince Alfred 13.6 (84) def Brighton 6.5 (41)

Prince Alfred registered their third win of the season on Saturday, and it was a vital win that just keeps them within a sniff of finals. The home side were aided by big second and third quarters as they comfortably won by 43 points. The Bombers dwindle in ninth place with just the two wins, and their finals window has almost completely closed considering they are three games out of the top four already. Chris Curran and Adam Perryman were equally as influential for the winners, while Hugo Kelly led all goal scorers with three majors for Prince Alfred.

Payneham 12.6 (78) def by Glenunga 13.13 (91)

A last quarter fightback by the bottom-placed Magpies fell two goals short on the weekend, as Glenunga held on to win a crucial road game that keeps them within striking distance of a top four place. The game seemingly looked over by three quarter time, as the Rams had built a 34-point margin, but the home side came alive in the last to make the final deficit look better than it perhaps seemed for a majority of the contest. Luke Holian (5 votes) and D'Arcy Mitchell (5 goals) were Glenunga's best, as they moved to a 4-4 record after eight rounds. For Payneham, Brad McKenzie was their shining light, but there is very little to cheer about as the club sits at a 1-7 record and firmly in bottom place.

Old Ignatians 12.16 (88) def Rostrevor 10.13 (73)

It was a tale of two halves at Karen Rolton Oval on Saturday afternoon, as Old Ignatians came back from 20 points down at half time to steal the win at home. Rostrevor came out the blocks firing and seemed to have the contest in their control, but the home side roared to life in the second half, kicking eight goals to two in that timeframe to pick up a much needed win. The visitors will be ruing a zero-goal last quarter which ultimately cost them what would have been an impressive road upset, but instead of a 5-3 record they have to settle for a 4-4 record, one win out of the top four. After a disappointing couple of weeks for Old Ignatians, Domonic Grant (5 votes, 5 goals) put the team on his back to steer his club back on track, joining Rostrevor at 4-4.

Port District 8.13 (61) def by St Peters 15.7 (97)

In what loomed as the game of the round, it was St Peters who walked all over Port District on their own turf on Saturday. The visitors won in emphatic fashion, by 36 points, against a side that is normally formidable at home. After a slow start, the home side rallied to cut the deficit to fourteen at half time, before St Peters pulled away in the second half. Accuracy in front of goal also helped the visitors, as they converted 15 of their 22 scoring shots into goals, compared to Port District's 8 from 21. With the win, St Peters sit equal top with a 6-2 record. Jake Sutcliffe was near perfect for the winning side, kicking seven goals in a best-on-ground performance, while Jock McLeay added four goals himself.

ROUND 9

Brighton v St Peters

St Peters will be coming into this full of confidence, after defeating Port District on the road to claim a stronghold on top spot, and they should enjoy an easier matchup this week against a struggling Brighton outfit that have won just two games so far. The Bombers have shown patches of good footy, but for the most part, have been a fairly easy opponent, and against a side as good as St Peters, this week should be no different.

Rostrevor v Port District

If it wasn't for a complete collapse in the second half on Saturday, Rostrevor could be sitting in the top four right now. Instead, they sit at 4-4 and just out of the four, but at home this week they have a chance to redeem themselves. Their opponent, Port District, was beaten badly at home last week, and will be looking to avenge their poor showing, and if they are the real deal, they will bounce back in emphatic fashion this week. This should be a good contest, as both sides look primed to make a run at finals this year.

Glenunga v Old Ignatians

Both sides are in a very similar boat entering this week's clash. The Rams and Old Ignatians were both off to great starts in 2022, before both teams had a slide in form over the last few weeks, dropping games they shouldn't have dropped, before big wins last week saw both sides get back on track in the winners column. This match proves as a test for both clubs, to see where they're really at, and to stay in touch with the top four. Hard to bet against the Rams at home, but it should be close.

Tea Tree Gully v Payneham

The Gullies suffered a brutal reality check on Saturday, as they were thumped by a strong Goodwood outfit by 87 points. Fortunately for them, they have a chance to gain some confidence back this week against the bottom-placed Magpies, who have registered just the one win this season. The Gullies should win this easy, unless they play like they did last week.

Prince Alfred v Goodwood

Finally, Goodwood travel to Prince Alfred off the back of an impressive 87-point win against Tea Tree Gully last week, one that moved them to equal first place. This week is a serious chance for them to stamp themselves as one of the premier teams in the competition, as a road win against a rising Prince Alfred squad will do wonders for their momentum. Though, it won't be easy, as Prince Alfred have claimed some big scalps this year and have been really competitive for the most part. I'm backing the Saints, but don't be surprised if an upset is on the cards.



REVIEWS

Scotch OC v Edwardstown







This could get ugly again for Salisbury as they take on yet another top team of the competition in what could be not only another demoralising loss but their fans will start to wonder where does the improvement come from in what has been a super tough year for the struggling side. They come up against Lockleys who are on top of the ladder and are flying after last week's win against Blackfriars Os. Salisbury are coming off another disastrous loss and could be due for another but expect them to have at least some fight, they need to otherwise this year is going to get worse and worse. Review:

Review:


