

DIVISION 1 DEWEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 11

Port District 15.14 (104) def Tea Tree Gully 7.7 (49)

It was a statement game from Port District at home on Saturday, as they completely dominated a struggling Tea Tree Gully outfit by 55 points. The Gullies were competitive up until half time, trailing by just eight points, but a measly sixteen-point second half did not do them any favours as the home side piled on nine goals after the main break to win easily. Daniel Passaniti and Cooper Gaffney were the standouts for Port District, who now sit top on percentage through eleven rounds.

St Peters 10.7 (67) def by Glenunga 10.24 (84)

The Rams completed a massive upset on Saturday at St Peters, toppling the premiership contenders on their home turf by seventeen points. The margin should have been more if it weren't for Glenunga's awful kicking (10.24), but nonetheless the Rams still got the job done. The upset road win sees Glenunga move into the top four with a 6-5 record, while St Peters slipped to third with the loss. Tom Butterworth was Glenunga's best player, while Michael McMahon booted three majors for the Rams.

Brighton 15.11 (101) def Rostrevor 7.7 (49)

The Bombers have seemingly hit a purple patch of form at the right time, recording a commanding victory at home over a lowly Rostrevor squad on Saturday. The game seemed over at quarter time with Brighton jumping out an early four goal lead, but the visitors hit back to close the deficit to fifteen going into half time, making a contest of it. But a strong back half by the home side put the game to bed, with Shane Harvey (5 goals) and Nigel Osborn (2 goals) leading from the front for the Bombers. With a couple big wins in the last few weeks, Brighton moved to 5-6 and within reach of a potential finals berth.

Old Ignatians 11.11 (77) def by Prince Alfred 13.8 (86)

It was a danger game that they couldn't let slip, and yet Old Ignatians did just that, succumbing to the visiting Prince Alfred by nine points. Just three weeks ago, Old Ignatians were closing in on a finals berth, firmly sitting in a finals spot, but after eleven rounds they sit in seventh by percentage, with a 5-6 record setting them back from the contenders. Prince Alfred on the other hand have found some form, and join Old Ignatians at 5-6, but by percentage sit in fifth position. Finn Heard (6 goals) and Jack Trengove (5 votes) were integral for the visitors, who can now sniff finals.

Payneham 8.11 (59) def by Goodwood 12.12 (84)

It was first versus last, but the discrepancy between the two sides was not as big as one would have thought, as the equal-first Saints came out of Payneham with a 25-point victory. It was not all easy going for Goodwood, who were locked at 29 apiece with the struggling Falcons at half time, before a classy second half got the job done for the visitors. At just 2-9, Payneham's season is all but over, and they can look for some form and momentum to take into next season now, while Goodwood's premiership chances are as strong as ever through eleven rounds. Jakob Heitmann was voted best afield, while Will Clarke kicked four goals for the winners.

ROUND 12

Tea Tree Gully v St Peters

Both sides suffered bad losses last week, with the Gullies getting thumped by Port District and St Peters losing at home to Glenunga. This week will be a big chance for both sides to redeem themselves, with a finals spot on the line. St Peters cannot afford to drop another game as the pack is closing fast, while the Gullies must win if they are any chance of getting away from that pack.

Goodwood v Old Ignatians

The Saints come into this clash full of confidence after improving to an 8-3 record over the weekend, and they host a struggling Old Ignatians side who was once in contention for finals, before slipping to seventh with another loss in round eleven. Based on recent form, Goodwood would go in as the overwhelming favourites, but if there was ever a time for Old Ignatians to get back on track and push for finals, it would be now.

Prince Alfred v Port District

Prince Alfred just quietly have made a little run at finals, sitting fifth after eleven rounds with a 5-6 record. A chance to get back on a level record is up for grabs, and perhaps a chance to cement their spot in fifth, but it doesn't get any tougher than the equal-first Port District, who are in good form and looking to claim outright top position with a win and Goodwood loss. The visitors should take this one, but with the way Prince Alfred are playing, it wouldn't be a surprise for them to upset the ladder leaders.

Payneham v Brighton

Last placed Payneham are in a world of hurt at 2-9 and need to muster something soon to salvage a poor season. They are a big chance to do so at home but will need to overcome a surging Bombers outfit who are now within serious reach of finals footy and will need some percentage to make a realistic run at it. Brighton should win on the road, but the Falcons are no pushovers after staying competitive for a half against the top side last week.

Glenunga v Rostrevor

The Rams made a statement with a huge upset win over St Peters last round but were lucky to do so kicking 10.24. A more accurate outing this week should push them over the edge against Rostrevor who sit in ninth and are fast losing time to push for finals. The Rams, who sit fourth, could rise to level with St Peters in third if results go their way, so there is a lot to play for if you are a Rams fan.
