DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 12

Tea Tree Gully 8.12 (60) def by St Peters 13.13 (91)

The downward spiral of Tea Tree Gully's season continued on Saturday as they were handled at home by contenders St Peters by 31 points. Trailing by just eleven heading into the final quarter, the Gullies conceded four final quarter goals while kicking just one themselves as the game got out of reach, and due to other results Tea Tree Gully now sit eighth after being first after three rounds, with finals a distant thought currently. As for St Peters, the road win was crucial for the shaping of their season, as they sit third with an 8-4 record, just one game from top spot. Spearhead Jock McLeay continued his fine form in front of goals, adding another five goals to his tally, while Sam Dukalskis was best afield for the winning team.

Goodwood 10.14 (74) def Old Ignatians 7.8 (50)

The Saints kept their spectacular season going at home on Saturday, beating Old Ignatians by four goals to equal Port District once again on top of the ladder. The home side kept a nice buffer heading into each break, with the smallest lead being thirteen at quarter time, and that breathing room was too much for the visitors to overcome in the 24-point loss. With the loss, Old Ignatians have fallen right out of finals contention, sitting at 5-7 after twelve rounds and in need of a turn around soon, while Goodwood are firmly perched atop the ladder at 9-3, building some momentum for a finals tilt later in the year. Nick Favretto has become a household name this season, being amongst the best players afield in eleven of Goodwood's twelve games, and was once again prominent on the weekend, while Brayden de Prinse gave it his all in a losing effort.

Prince Alfred 7.11 (53) def by Port District 8.8 (56)

It was an uphill battle, but the visiting Port District survived and kept their place on top of the ladder after twelve rounds, holding off a valiant Prince Alfred outfit by just three points. The biggest lead at any change was a mere six points, with the tightly contested clash easily staking its claim for game of the round. The home side, who desperately needed to win to draw level with its fellow finals' aspirants Glenunga and Brighton, could not convert in front of goal early, and a 4.11 score through three quarters ultimately cost them this game. Thomas Carter had himself a game for the winning side, booting three goals and amongst the team's best, while ex-AFL player Sam Gray was just as pivotal.

Payneham 5.7 (37) def by Brighton 12.10 (82)

It was a bloodbath at Payneham on Saturday as the Falcons took three quarters to get going, ultimately falling to a surging Bombers squad by 45 points. At three quarter time the Falcons had registered just 1.4, as opposed to Brighton's 11.9, before a four-goal final quarter lessened the damage slightly. Suddenly, the Bombers are sitting pretty inside the top four after a month ago being a long way out of finals contention, and off the back of Harrison Boyle (3 goals) and Blake Higgins (5 votes), this week was no different. The lowly Falcons are the only team with less than five wins after twelve rounds, sitting on a 2-10 record, and are well and truly out of finals contention.

Glenunga 9.16 (70) def by Rostrevor 13.6 (84)

Rostrevor completed one of the biggest comebacks of the season on the road, overcoming a seemingly unassailable 23-point three quarter time to run over the contending Glenunga by fourteen points. The game seemed over at the last change, with the Rams holding a comfortable four goal lead, but a goalless last quarter for the home side, as opposed to a seven-goal barrage by the visitors, meant the tables were completely turned. Rostrevor needed the win to just stay in the hunt for finals at 5-7, while Glenunga fell to fifth with the loss and are just one win ahead of the pack at 6-6. Nicholas Murphy was near perfect for Rostrevor, kicking an outrageous eight goals of his side's thirteen, while Daniel McCallum and Peter Vorrasi helped the fightback as well.

After a poor month of footy, Old Ignatians should enjoy a home game against the bottom-of-the-ladder Payneham to boost their spirits and get their season back on track. At their best they are a finals side, but have failed to show that of late, and will need some momentum for the run home, so for their sake, a big win this week could do wonders.

Rostrevor V Tea Tree Gully

Both sides enter this contest at 5-7, and a finals spot is not too farfetched for the winning side. The Gullies have lost all momentum and form as the season has progressed, while Rostrevor have found some form and are coming off the back of an epic road comeback win against a strong Glenunga side. At home, Rostrevor should hold strong and continue to rub salt in the wound for the Gullies.

St Peters V Prince Alfred

One game outside top spot at 8-4, St Peters are within sniffing distance of making a serious premiership push and will need to win strong this week at home against Prince Alfred. The visitors were one kick away from upsetting Port District last week, so they have shown they can match it with the best sides and are every chance of stealing a road win this week. St Peters should win at home, but don't count out Prince Alfred.

Port District V Goodwood

Equal-first Port District escaped with a narrow win last week against Prince Alfred to hold strong at the top, and are back at home this week in what should be the game of the round against their fellow 9-3 contender Goodwood, who won easily at home last week.





Broadview v Salisbury North

Broadview have recorded another impressive victory, defeating Salisbury North by 66 points at Broadview Oval. 




