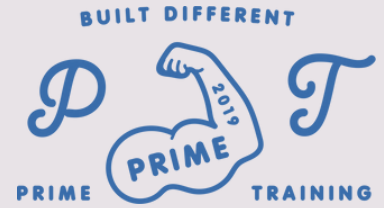

DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 13

Old Ignatians 7.5 (47) def by Payneham 7.19 (61)

Bottom placed Payneham have pulled off a massive upset, and one that could end Old Ignatians' season, as the Falcons won on the road by 19 points. The home side got out to a lightning quick start, kicking five goals straight to three points to lead at quarter time, but a second quarter fightback by the Falcons brought the deficit back to just seven at half time. From there, the visitors remained on top and even though their goalkicking was atrocious, they were able to hold on for the win. Liam Potts and Ethan Haylock were Payneham's best, and this win will surely give the Falcons a promising outlook for next season.

Rostrevor 13.14 (92) def by Tea Tree Gully 19.9 (123)

At last, the Gullies put together a full four-quarter performance, booting nineteen goals en route to a crucial 31-point road win against fellow finals aspirant Rostrevor. The first quarter set the tone, with Tea Tree Gully kicking five goals to Rostrevor's one, and from there, the Gullies didn't look back, sustaining that four-to-five goal gap for the entirety of the game. Five players from the winning side shared three goals each, while Isaac Hewson and Tyler West were the Gullies' best. As for Rostrevor, they moved to ninth with the loss, and with it probably their finals chances as we hit the pointy end of the season.

St Peters 9.11 (65) def by Prince Alfred 12.5 (77)

It was the week for road wins as Prince Alfred pulled off another big upset for the round, knocking off contenders St Peters on their home turf by two goals. The visitors moved to fifth and within a real shot of finals footy with the win, while St Peters fell two games behind ladder leaders Port District and sit in third. Apart from trailing by one at quarter time, Prince Alfred led at every other change and were very impressive, led by Adam Perryman and Hayden Jolly who were pivotal to Prince Alfred's round 13 success.

Port District 13.7 (85) def Goodwood 7.7 (49)

In the battle of the premierships, it was the host Port District who flexed their muscles and took outright top spot on the ladder with just a few rounds to go. Leading at every change, Port District were surprisingly barely challenged by a contending Goodwood side that were in scintillating form prior to this contest. The Saints still sit second, a game clear of St Peters in third, but if this result is anything to go by, they may struggle to win it all. James Batty booted five for the winners while the usual culprits Sam Gray and Cooper Gaffney were fantastic.

Brighton 6.17 (53) def by Glenunga 10.17 (77)

Bad kicking was the theme of this contest on Saturday, as both sides kicked seventeen behinds each, but it was Glenunga who ultimately got the better off Brighton to win by four goals. Brighton had been gaining some serious traction on the finals race prior to this match, and even sat as high as fourth after last week, but moved to sixth with the home loss as the Rams took outright fourth position with seven wins. Jack Scott snagged four goals for Glenunga, while Tully Kennett and James Wundke were among the best players for the Rams as well.

ROUND 14

Tea Tree Gully v Glenunga

In a matchup that could have massive implications on the final standings, there is everything to play for this week. The Gullies, who finally recaptured some of that early-season form in their emphatic five-goal win last week, host the fourth-placed Rams, who crucially won on the road last round against the Bombers. Confusion as AFL tribunal seemingly contradicts itself in Brisbane Lions' Eric Hipwood suspension decision for umpire push

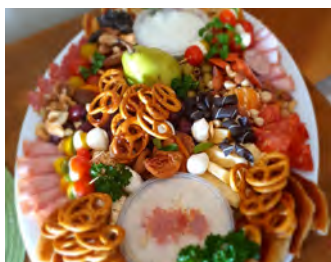

Athelstone by 23 points.

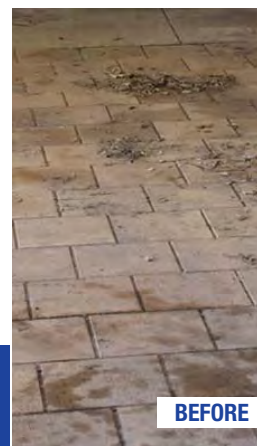

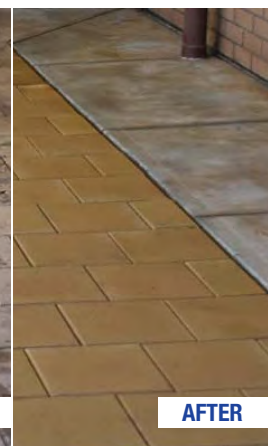

REVIEWS

Seaton Ramblers vs Modbury

Modbury has closed the gap between itself in fourth place and Edwardstown in third place, following a 45-point victory on the road. The match started in relatively close fashion, with Modbury opening up a seven-point lead at quarter time, and further extending this to 22 points by half-time. 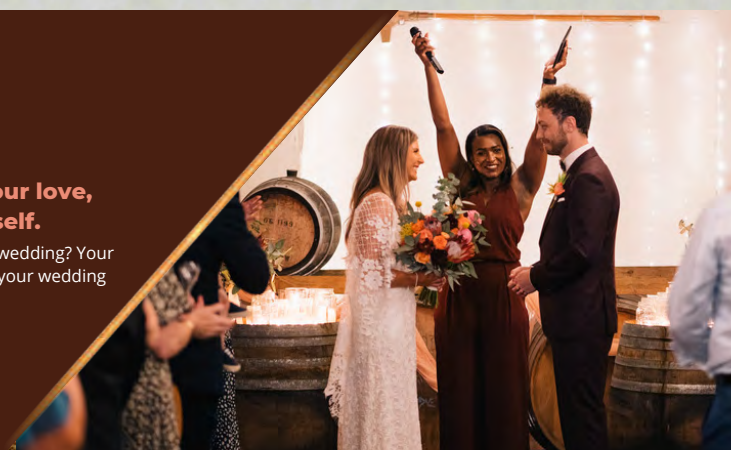

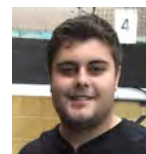
MATCH OF THE ROUND: Portland v Hope Valley

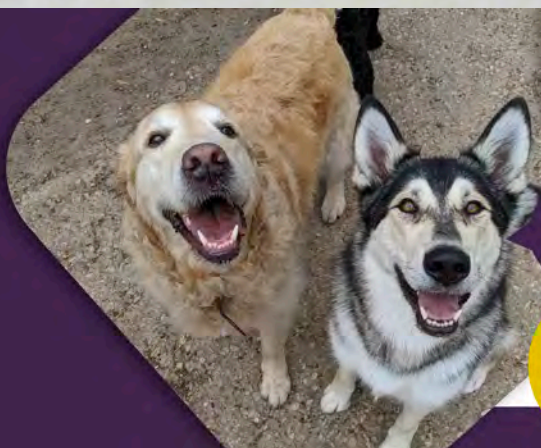

Last week
