



DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 14

Tea Tree Gully 15.9 (99) def Glenunga 13.9 (87)

The Gullies are alive and kicking in 2022, establishing a timely win streak to put them back in finals contention after their season looked done a few weeks ago. Their 12-point win over the Rams on Saturday didn't come without a last quarter fightback from Glenunga, who likewise are gunning for finals footy, as Tea Tree Gully led by as much as 25 at three quarter time and almost let it slip. Peter Persinos led all scorers with four majors for the Gullies, while Blake Penney was integral for their win. With this result, it means four teams, including Tea Tree Gully and Glenunga, are tied on seven wins with four rounds remaining.

Payneham 8.12 (60) def Port District 7.7 (49)

In one of the more unlikely wins of the season, bottom placed Payneham shakily held on to knock off first placed Port District by eleven points on Saturday. A fast start saw the Falcons register five goals to one in the opening term, before two goalless quarters in a row opened the gate for Port District to get back in the contest. At just four points the deficit at three quarter time, it seemed as though the ladder leader's class would see them overcome the early hump, but Payneham steadied to kick three goals in the last to outlast the premiership fancies. Ethan Haylock and Liam Potts, among others, helped steer the lowly Falcons to victory, and with two wins on the trot they now sit just one game behind Rostrevor and Old Ignatians.

Goodwood 11.13 (79) def St Peters 11.10 (76)

It was a heavyweight bout with two top three teams facing off, and it was the home side Goodwood that came away victorious in a tight finish, coming from behind to steal a three-point win. It was all St Peters early as the visitors jumped to a 22-point half time lead, but from there the Saints mounted the comeback, bringing the deficit to just two at three quarter time before outlasting them in the final term. The win – and Port District's surprise loss – sees the Saints tie the former for top spot with four rounds remaining, while St Peters stay in third, one win ahead of the pack and two wins behind the ladder leaders. Reece Slape and Tom Carter helped Goodwood pull off the comeback win, while Luke Mitchell kicked four for St Peters.

Prince Alfred 16.8 (104) def Rostrevor 4.4 (28)

A total second half domination from Prince Alfred saw them drop off Rostrevor by 76 points on Saturday. Down 20-6 at quarter time, the home side was in early trouble, but a good second quarter saw them level the scores by the main break. Still, the game looked like it could go either way, until Prince Alfred booted twelve unanswered goals as Rostrevor failed to register a goal for the entire second half, ultimately putting the game to bed. It was the usual suspects for Prince Alfred, with Jack Trengove among their best and Finn Heard snagging another five goals to take his tally to fifteen from just four games. The massive win was an important percentage boost for Prince Alfred, as they now sit fourth with a far better percentage then their competitors.

Old Ignatians 4.6 (30) def by Brighton 10.14 (74)

Dominant from start to finish, the Bombers ended Old Ignatians season and simultaneously boosted their own finals chances with a commanding 44-point drubbing. When you fail to score a goal for the entire first half, it is never a good recipe for success, and unfortunately for Old Ignatians, their season went from bad to worse with the home loss. Jarrod Miller (4 goals) and Tim Dickson (3 goals) split seven goals between them, while Nigel Osborn was best afield for Brighton in a pivotal game that could define their season. They sit equal fourth on seven wins, but fifth by percentage with a month of regular season footy left.

ROUND 15

Payneham v Rostrevor

The bottom two teams face off this week, but the Falcons have been playing better than a bottom team in the last two weeks and are every chance of stringing their third win in a row against the struggling Rostrevor, who were pitiful after half time last week, allowing twelve straight goals. The Falcons have built some momentum, and I expect that to continue this week.

Old Ignatians v St Peters

There may not be a team in worse form at the moment than Old Ignatians, which is disappointing because early on they looked like a sure bet for finals. This week, they host St Peters, and another big loss is pressing. St Peters need to keep winning to keep that one game buffer over the pack, so they can't afford to drop a cheap one here.

Port District v Brighton

A surprise loss to Payneham saw Port District slip up at the top and allow Goodwood back into the equation for first place. They cannot afford to slip up again or they risk losing top spot with just four rounds until finals, and this week they face a challenge with Brighton, who have picked up their game in the last month and skyrocketed back into finals contention. They took care of Old Ignatians last week and if they can knock off Port District, finals look very likely for the surging Bombers.

Goodwood v Glenunga

The Saints held on narrowly to beat St Peters last week but were not super convincing at home. This week, they host the Rams who lost by two goals to the Gullies on the weekend, with a chance to go outright top at stake (if results go their way). The Rams are tied with three other teams for fourth position, and a win here could be vital for their finals endeavours.

Prince Alfred v Tea Tree Gully

The final matchup of the round sees Prince Alfred and Tea Tree Gully collide, with both teams on equal points and a finals tilt up for grabs. With both sides coming off important wins last week, momentum won't split these two teams. It may come down to home ground advantage, where Prince Alfred was so dominant last week against Glenunga. Whatever the difference maker is, the result will go a long way to shaping the top five for finals footy in 2022.

Broadview v Unley Mercedes Jets

Broadview have returned to their winning ways, defeating an impressive Unley Mercedes Jets side by 17 points at Kingswood Oval. Coming off just their second loss of the season the Tigers came out of the blocks strong, kicking three goals to one in the first term to open up a 13-point quarter time lead. 



Edwardstown v SMOSH West Lakes

Edwardstown have held on for a thrilling two-point victory over a wasteful SMOSH outfit in wet conditions. SMOSH had six more shots at goal in the opening term, however, after registering just 1.8, they would lead by just one goal. Edwardstown got into their groove in a more free-flowing manner throughout much of the second term, taking an eight-point lead into the half, and it became more apparent the game would become a genuine slog. SMOSH gained back the momentum with the assistance of the breeze in the third term, somewhat making the most of opportunities and taking a 14-point lead into the final change. 





Last week

Lockleys v Gepps Cross

Lockleys hosted Gepps Cross last week, with Gepps going into the match in brilliant form. Perhaps I was hoodwinked into believing that Gepps could expose Lockleys somewhere around the ground. 




