

ROUND 16

Tea Tree Gully 8.6 (54) def by Goodwood 17.10 (112)

In a do-or-die clash for the Gullies, they were ran off their feet in the last quarter as the Saints kept their top two spot on the ladder with a 58-point win. The game was still in the balance at three quarter time, with the Saints' 21-point lead not set in stone, but an eight-goal last term completely wiped any chances Tea Tree Gully had of winning, and now their finals chances hang by a thread with just two rounds remaining. Jakob Heitmann was best afield for the Saints, while Jack Astbury was the Gullies' best who now sit a game behind fifth spot.

Brighton 4.6 (30) def by Prince Alfred 12.13 (85)

In a pivotal game for both clubs, it was Prince Alfred who came out on top and all but secured a finals spot in emphatic fashion, dominating from start to finish to defeat the Bombers by 55 points. Brighton, who needed to win to be in the top five, were disappointing and will have to rely on other results to go their way in the final fortnight to ensure a finals spot. Chris Curran and Jordan Neal were instrumental, while Oscar Clark led all scorers with three goals. After a below average start to the year, Prince Alfred finds themselves third with a nice percentage as we hit the pointy end of the regular season.

Glenunga 11.14 (80) def Payneham 4.9 (33)

The Rams imposed their will on bottom-placed Payneham to guarantee they will be playing finals footy this year. Two games clear of sixth place, with a significantly better percentage, it is near impossible for Glenunga to miss September footy from here, and this easy win will help with momentum going into the end of the season. Although, the game was close at half time, with just a five-point lead separating the two teams, before Glenunga kicked away in the second half to register their ninth win. Will Staples and Harry Prosser led the way for the Rams.

Rostrevor 16.9 (105) def Old Ignatians 11.4 (70)

With finals out of the question for both sides entering this clash, the result was nothing but consolation, but Rostrevor will still look to this victory as some much-needed momentum as they look to end their season on a high. A nine goal second half broke the shackles for the home side, who claimed their seventh win of the year to overtake Old Ignatians in eighth spot. The 35-point win was highlighted by a five-goal haul by Nicholas Murphy, who took his season tally to 40. Daniel McCallum and James Warton were best on in the win.

St Peters 13.6 (84) def by Port District 13.9 (87)

In a nail-biting finish, ladder leading Port District narrowly escaped St Peters with a three-point win to impact the placing on the ladder after sixteen rounds. It was a dogfight for the entirety of the contest, and Port District even found themselves down at half time, as the home side looked to make a statement heading into finals. But a big second half, aided by Dale Pearce (5 goals) and captain Sean Davidson (5 votes), carried the visitors to an ever-important win to keep the one-game lead they have on second placed Goodwood. St Peters sit just one win ahead of sixth now with the loss, and are in danger of missing the finals if they keep losing.

St Peters v Brighton

It doesn't get bigger than this. Fifth versus sixth. After last week's narrow loss, St Peters fumbled the chance to get an extra game clear of its peers, and with just two games remaining, it is vital they win at least one to hold on to a finals spot. 

Last week

Unley Mercedes Jets v Adelaide University

REVIEWS

Edwardstown v Scotch OC

Edwardstown has kept its top two hopes alive on the back of a relatively easy victory over Scotch, despite disappointing kicking in-front of goal. Although the home side had ten scoring shots in the opening term, they registered nine behinds in blustery conditions. However, they were very strong in defence, holding Scotch scoreless. The inaccuracy continued through the second term, with a further six behinds for the Towns, although they did boot three goals, equivalent to Scotch to keep the game close at the main break. Seaton Ramblers vs SMOSH West Lakes





Reviews:


