

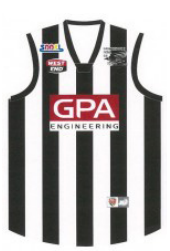

DIVISION 1 REVIEWS AND PREVIEWS

ROUND 17

St Peters 11.10 (76) def Brighton 6.4 (40)

St Peters took care of business at home on Saturday and with it booked their ticket to the finals, while simultaneously ending Brighton's chances, with a 36-point drubbing of the Bombers. The game was over by half time, when the visitors had failed to register a goal, and St Peters had piled on six, and while the Bombers kicked six second half goals, the damage was done. Had Brighton won, then they would have been right in with a chance at playing finals, but their squad could not get it done when it mattered most, as Dylan Lang, Tim Dickson (3 goals) and co fell short. James Duncan (5 votes, 1 goal) and Jesse O'Brien (3 goals) led the way for the home side, who will look to build some momentum next week before their finals campaign begins.

Port District 15.14 (104) def Rostrevor 5.3 (33)

Rostrevor's season came to a close on Saturday as they were pumped by Port District by 71 points, who locked up top spot and home ground advantage throughout the finals with the win. With the game still very much in the balance at half time – just sixteen points separated the two sides – Gavin Shephard (4 goals, 5 votes) helped the home side kick away as they booted ten second half goals to two to put the game to bed. Now two games clear of second place, it is impossible for Port District to lose top spot, a testament to their scintillating form all year. Conversely, Rostrevor sit two games behind fifth place and cannot make the finals in 2022.

Old Ignatians 7.5 (47) def by Glenunga 18.14 (122)

Tom Condon booted nine goals in just his second game for the season, as Glenunga dominated from start to finish to beat Old Ignatians by 75 points. The home side struggled to get anything to go their way en route to another disappointing loss for a side that was in finals contention earlier this year. Ninth place is likely where Old Ignatians will end up to finish 2022, a massive fall from grace. On the other end of the spectrum, Glenunga sit equal third on points with Prince Alfred and with results going their way next week, a top three spot could be imminent. D'Arcy Mitchell and Tom Butterworth were also integral for the Rams in the big win.

Payneham 4.9 (33) def by Tea Tree Gully 4.14 (38)

It was a scrappy, low-scoring affair at Payneham Oval on Saturday, but it was the Gullies who came out on top after having scored just one goal up until three quarter time. Down by fourteen at three quarter time, the Gullies kicked three of their four total goals in the last quarter to storm back and escape with a narrow four-point win over the Falcons. Captain Chad Schoenmakers led from the front with a critical goal, while Ryan Spittle and William Cansdell were also influential, and it was a feel good story for Tyler Bennett, who played and won his first division one game for the Gullies, four years after having a cardiac arrest on the field and almost losing his life. While finals are out of the equation for Tea Tree Gully due to percentage, a win next week will conclude a better back end to a rollercoaster season.

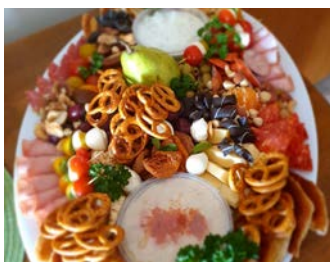
Goodwood 5.7 (37) def by Prince Alfred 8.6 (54)

In a potential finals preview, Prince Alfred pulled off a huge upset on the road against the Saints to rattle the standings ahead of the final game of the home and away season. Down at quarter time, the visitors rallied to gain a healthy half time lead, one they carried through to three quarter time, before burying the home side in the last quarter to make a statement just one week out from finals. The loss means Goodwood can no longer finish first, as they fell two games behind Port District, but a win

next week would lock up second spot. Lachlan McNamara (5 votes) and Tom Bartlett (3 goals) provided match-winning efforts for their club, while Tom Anderson booted a goal and was Goodwood's best in the losing effort. Prince Alfred currently obtains a higher percentage than Goodwood, so with a Prince Alfred win and Goodwood loss next week, the two sides could dramatically swap positions ahead of the first week of finals.

ROUND 18

St Peters v Payneham

As St Peters prepare for a finals tilt in 2022, the lowly Falcons stand in their way as an obstacle in the last round of the regular season. While St Peters cannot lose fifth place, a loss going into finals would be the worst-case scenario for a club that has the potential to go all the way. Payneham have had a luckless year but were very competitive against Tea Tree Gully last week, and will be looking to bow out in a positive way, with a potential upset over a contender a perfect way to end their dismal season, however that is a highly unlikely outcome. **St Peters by six goals.**

Glenunga v Prince Alfred

This game could have major implications on the final standings, with both sides locked on 20 points with a 10-7 record. While Prince Alfred boast the greater percentage, a win to either team means third place, and potentially second place depending on Goodwood's result, is theirs. The Rams are coming off a strong road showing against Old Ignatians, where they kicked eighteen goals to win by 75, while Prince Alfred pulled off a season-defining upset against fellow contender Goodwood to give them some serious momentum, so this should be a classic. **Rams, but only just.**

Rostrevor v Goodwood

The Saints enter the final week of the regular season coming off a disappointing home loss, and with finals around the corner, they cannot afford to be entering in bad form. Rostrevor were beaten badly by Port District, and kissed their finals chances goodbye, but could seriously tarnish Goodwood's chances of winning the premiership by knocking them off this week, as it would likely push them down to third. The Saints must hold strong if they are to win the flag this year. **Saints by four goals.**

Brighton v Tea Tree Gully

The Bombers host Tea Tree Gully this week, with both sides falling out of finals contention with last week's results. Brighton were beaten by six goals by St Peters, while Tea Tree Gully survived a challenge by the Falcons to win by four points, so both teams aren't entering this week in the greatest of form. Still, sixth spot on the ladder is up for grabs, and some much needed momentum heading into 2023 could do wonders for both these clubs. **Bombers by ten points.**

Port District v Old Ignatians

The league's best team in 2022 showcased their strengths again last week in a rout and claimed outright top spot on the ladder heading into finals next week. Luckily for them, they face an easier opponent this week in Old Ignatians, who have had a poor second half of the season and suffered a 75-point loss last week to highlight their struggles. With a seemingly easy Port District win on the cards, they will be primed to make a run at the flag, with nothing holding them back. **Port District by eight goals.**

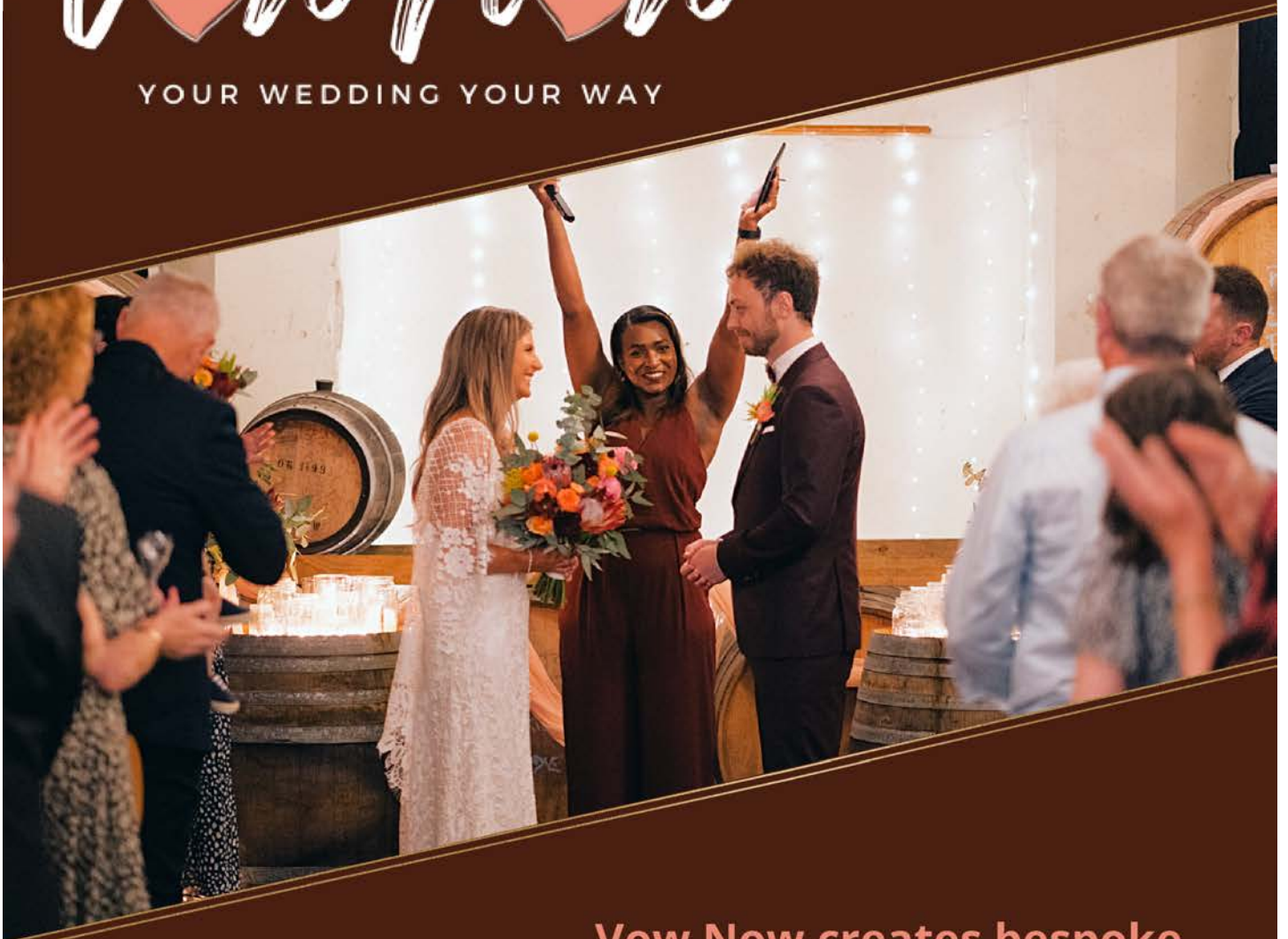

REVIEWS

Golden Grove v Westminster OS

Golden Grove have pulled off one of the greatest sporting achievements, officially finishing the home and away season undefeated, with Saturday's victory over Westminster at home confirming this. The match begun relatively even, with the Kookaburras taking a 3 goal to one lead into quarter time, leading by 13 points. While Golden Grove attempted to pull away throughout the second term, Westminster kept them honest with the margin at a gettable 35 points at the main break. 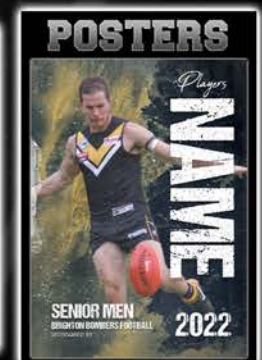

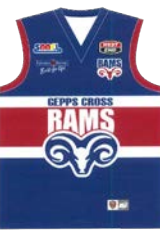

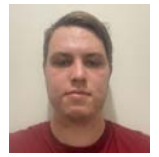
