



FINALS WEEK 1

Goodwood 14.10 (94) def Glenunga 6.12 (48)

The Saints booked a date with Port District in next week's semi final after a commanding 46-point win over Glenunga in Saturday's qualifying final. The Rams led at quarter time in a low-scoring start to the game, but Goodwood came alive after quarter time to dominate third placed Glenunga, booting ten goals to three after half time. The big win sees Goodwood earn a much-deserved second consecutive double chance in week two of finals footy, one that will either see them guarantee a grand final spot or host a preliminary final. Medal favourite Nick Favretto was at his outstanding best for Goodwood, kicking a season-best four goals to add to his best-on-ground performance, while Nicholas Burgess (3 goals), Angus Rana (2 goals) and Tom Carter were equally as integral. The Rams were led by Michael McMahon, while Beau Schwarze was their only multi-goalkicker. Home ground advantage seemed to do Goodwood wonders in this one, and Glenunga will now enjoy that same advantage in next week's cutthroat semi final against reigning premiers Prince Alfred. These two sides could very well meet again in a fortnight's time in a preliminary final, if Glenunga beat P.A.C and Goodwood lose to first placed Port District in the semi finals this week.

St Peters 8.8 (56) def by Prince Alfred 13.14 (92)

The premiership pedigree was in full effect on Saturday afternoon, as the champs Prince Alfred defeated St Peters on their own turf in the elimination final by six goals to advance to a cutthroat semi final versus Glenunga this week. The home side led by three points at quarter time, before a fourgoal-to-one second term by the visitors saw P.A.C take a 20-point half time lead. St Peters closed the gap to fifteen by three quarter time, giving themselves a big chance to steal a famous comeback win, but they capitulated in the last term as the reigning premiers stormed home for the 36-point victory. It was business as usual for AFL veteran Jack Trengove, as he willed his side to the big win on the road to keep their back-to-back chances well and truly alive, while Sam Buckham and Mackenzie Slee added their prowess to help P.A.C eliminate St Peters. Finn Heard led all goalkickers with three, while Craig Pitt and Mitch Larsson added two goals apiece for the winners. Impressive seasons from James Duncan and Sam Dukalskis came to an end on Saturday, but they were once again among their side's best for the final time in the losing effort, while the league's leading goalkicker Jock McLeay kicked three to end his tally at 48 majors. St Peters will look back on this season as a 'what could have been' scenario, as their start to the season suggested they should be playing in the grand final, but their finish to the year was more than disappointing, as they probably deserved to go further than a first round exit.

Glenunga V Prince Alfred

The first semi final should be a tight one, with the Rams hosting Prince Alfred in a do or die clash. The Rams were taught a lesson by Goodwood last week, as they were pumped by 46 points, but luckily with their second chance, they have the opportunity to make amends for their poor loss and meet the Saints again in next week's preliminary final, should Goodwood lose to Port District. It is imperative they get a better showing from their gun players, as a straight sets elimination is on the cards against a strong, confident Prince Alfred outfit looking to win their second consecutive premiership. D'Arcy Mitchell and Alex Haren, both of whom have found themselves listed among their best players on a regular basis in 2022, were well below par on the weekend, while Michael McMahon, who had kicked 29 goals prior to the qualifying final, could only manage one goal. These players must lift if Glenunga are any chance of winning a final this year. After a strong road win against St Peters, P.A.C will enter this week's clash full of momentum, and although they will have to play the entirety of the finals series away from home, their finals experience and premiership pedigree will for sure come into play to negate some of that disadvantage. Jack Trengove, who has previously played for AFL clubs Melbourne and Port Adelaide, will be a tough player to stop for the Rams, while Chris Curran and Hayden Jolly are also important for the visiting side. Spearhead Finn Heard has played just the five games, but his eighteen goal output has helped P.A.C tremendously in the games he has played, and they will need another healthy performance in front of goal to upset the Rams on the road. This game should go down to the wire, with both sides' best footy up there with the best in the competition, but with P.A.C's recent form and experience, it will be tough for Glenunga to make the preliminary final, even if they are at home. Port District V Goodwood

The league's best team throughout the home and away season enjoyed a well-deserved week off last week as the other four finalists battled it out, but will the week off be to their detriment? After all, they haven't played since their upset loss to eighth placed Old Ignatians in the final round, so surely that will be in the back of their minds heading into this week's double chance semi final against Goodwood. The Saints are coming off a strong win and will carry all the momentum into the match, so it will be interesting to see how Port District manage this coming off a loss and a week off. Still, we know what Port District are capable of, as they were first place for a reason, and boast ample talent on their list, including former Power and Swans AFL player Sam Gray, who enjoyed a very solid year. The club's two leading goalkickers, James Batty (31 goals) and Dale Pearce (28), must fire in front of goals to give the club the best chance of producing a winning total, while Cooper Gaffney and Gray, who were undeniably the club's best performing players all year, must step up also. As for Goodwood, their current form is scintillating and will be seriously tough to topple. Nick Favretto, arguably the best player in the competition this year, will be pivotal for the Saints, who are pushing for a grand final appearance, while Nicholas Burgess, who has tallied 35 goals in 2022, will be a tough matchup for Port District. Both enjoyed impressive games on the weekend, as per usual, while Tom Carter has been a great sidekick to Favretto this year and was also damaging on Saturday. Going on recent history, it is tough to split the sides. Facing twice this year, both sides have shared a win, with Port District winners of the most recent matchup. At home, Port District have been almost perfect this year, so something tells me they will book their ticket in the 2022 Division 1 grand final with an impressive win against the Saints this week. Preliminary Finals are arguably the most important game for "football clubs" each season. Grand Finals are the most important game for players and coaches, but preliminary finals are the game which decides whether a club is promoted to the next division. That in itself is the main aim at the start of each season. For the players and coaches however, only a premiership will do. Sacred Heart have been the hot favourites all season along with Broadview. Little separated the two at the start of the season, in terms of favouritism. During the year, it was the old scholars however who looked the best side in the competition. North Haven by contrast were new to division 2 this season, after defeating Gaza in last year's division 3 decider. North Haven have been building for years. Their club has been well managed and they've had steady improvement along with a few disappointments along the way. The disappointments, have only made them stronger. Whilst statistics at times aren't a true and accurate reflection on two sides performances, this is a statistic that can't be ignored. That's a 785 point differential between the two sides, which is massive. Sacred Heart have a stream of multi goal scorers in their line-up. Tristan Carcuro leads the division 2 goal kicking with 52 goals and is a constant threat up forward. Harrison Morgan with 32 goals, Henry McAuliffe with 23 goals, Darcy Le Cornu with 21 goals along with Cameron Rankin, Clayton Symonds and Josh Koster gives the old scholars the most potent firepower for any side in the competition. North Haven by contrast also have a host of players who can kick multiple goals. Teams need that in finals. It's far too easy shutting down 1 or 2 players and teams with the most flexibility and more avenues to goals are the ones who cause the most damage in September. Tom Sandercock, Jamie Solly, Kyran Dixon. Matthew Sharpe, Jack Foster, Ryan McInerney and Brett Pederson offer many avenues to goal. Plus they have the option of swinging Chris Lipson forward, who's been in tremendous form of late. Alex Cailotto has been in brilliant form all season after returning from South Adelaide and he will give the Sacred Heart on-ballers first use of the ball. Jack Koster, Oscar Lovelock, Clayton Symonds, Tom McDermott, Seb Kerrish, Nick Forster and Doug Proud will get enough of the ball all day to be a threat. The North Haven side is full of talent. Mark Rowe is a champion, Brett Pederson whilst being the biggest pest in football is also a big game player and has won two medals as the best on ground in a grand final. Ryan McInerney the coach is a ball magnet. Matthew Searcy, Chris Lipson and Kyran Dixon are all super talented. North Haven are also chock full of confidence after defeating Henley at home and then in an amazing win last week against Athelstone they came from 26-points down at three quarter time, to stage a remarkable win by 7-points. It was one of the great wins of all time to see a team come from nowhere, away from home, and to run over the top of the more experienced side. Last week Sacred Heart were missing Tristan Carcuro and he will be a big loss if missing again this week. Patrick McCarthy with 5 goals and Harrison Morgan with 4 goals stepped up to the plate and provided focal points in Carucuro's absence. This only reinforces our thoughts of the enormous goal kicking firepower that Sacred Heart OC have. The biggest difference in our opinion however, will be Alex Cailotto. He's given the Sacred Heart on-ballers first use of the ball all season. His ruck work in the forward half is also extremely dangerous for opposition defenders, as his tap work to his forwards is brilliant. North Haven don't have a match up for Cailotto. That's the one area where they fall down. The lack of a big ruckman who gives their on-ballers first use.
